PILGRIMAGES

Pilgrimage services occur at Egmanton Church several times a year, and pilgrims attend from far and wide. These pilgrims celebrate the claim by a local village woman, that she had a vision of 'Our Lady,' in medieval times, in nearby 'Ladywood'. Pilgrimages took place, until the Reformation, when the Shrine was destroyed in1547. Modern pilgrimages were re-established in 1929. A team from Kirton, cater for three of these pilgrimages a year, providing lunch and tea for the pilgrims, and the money raised goes into Kirton Church funds. The Bishop of St Albans officiated at the most recent of these pilgrimages on Saturday, September 15th, when £180 was raised.
