Parish Council Report

The COVID-19 crisis continues to dominate our attention although the gradual relaxation of the lockdown rules and the return of summer weather should allow some optimism. Clearly, we are still far from defeating this virus and many people are still shielding and taking extra care to avoid exposure to it. Our community support network will remain focussed on helping our fellow residents to avoid unnecessary risks and many thanks to all those who continue to help others. Mental health is also an increasing area of concern as there are an increasing number of reports of people who have not ventured out of their homes for several weeks experiencing high levels of anxiety and a lack of confidence when facing a return to normal activities. We should still keep a supportive eye on each other for a while yet.

Your Parish Council have been continuing to meet each month using the Zoom video conferencing application. These meetings are open to members of the public and the computer links for meetings can be requested from Geoff Twibell our Parish Clerk by emailing parishclerk@moulsford-pc.org.uk. The next meeting is at 7:30pm on Wednesday 8th July 2020.

The opposition to the Friends of the Elderly planning application was impressive and demonstrated the depth of concern in our community and a determination to maintain the character of the centre of our village. The efforts made by the Moulsford Residents group resulted in a very large number of well-informed responses to the planning application. SODC's target decision date is 15th July and we await the outcome with interest!

And finally, the combination of lockdown and the sunny weather has led to a greater appreciation and usage of the river. There are more canoes, kayaks, inflatables and motor cruisers than usual but the increase in the number of stand-up paddleboards is particularly noticeable. The smart new boat moorings at the north end of the village are in use and the Thames path continues to attract many walkers. Hopefully, like us they will be able to make use of the Beetle and Wedge Boathouse Inn when it re-opens, hopefully sometime in July.

From the Vicar Andrew Petit

My Dear Friends,

Since the beginning of lockdown there has been a huge surge in church attendance (online) and of interest in prayer and the Bible. A recent poll shows that one quarter of UK adults have watched or listened to a religious service during the corona virus pandemic and 44% of Brits are praying – including 5% saying that they've prayed for the first time. One online Christian bookstore saw the sale of Bibles rise by 55% during April compared with the average for that month in previous years. Millions have downloaded Bible reading apps and Google say that searches for "prayer" and "Christianity" have sky-rocketed.

The pandemic has triggered a "historic spiritual moment", says Dr Rowan Williams, the former archbishop of Canterbury, who is unsurprised by the growth in Bible-reading. He notes that engagement with online church services is also booming, and that it is a response to feelings of disorientation, fragility and fear caused by the crisis.

We should be unsurprised that so many should turn to God in a time of crisis or re-kindle a faith that had previously gone cold. It is said that there are no atheists in an aeroplane which is about to crash!

We could be very cynical and say that people are just keeping their options open and taking out a kind of spiritual insurance. However, I have no doubt that in a time when our whole way of life is radically changed, our future is uncertain and we are brought face to face with the reality of death, which after all is the certain destiny of every single person, many begin to ask deeper questions about life: What is the purpose of my life? Does God exist? What happens when I or a loved one dies? Is there any truth in the Christian faith?

These are all good questions that everyone should ask, whatever the circumstances, and if the present crisis prompts us to ask them then that can only be a good thing. The danger is that, as lockdown eases, as the immediate threat to life reduces, as opportunities for shopping and entertainment and just general busy-ness increase, we stop asking those important questions and maybe forget about them altogether. That would be tragic!

If you are someone who has started asking those deeper questions, please make sure you carry on pursuing them. One thing lockdown has done is make it so much easier for people dip their toe into attending church, whether it is our local *Zoom* services, or those more professionally produced by bigger churches of every style and flavour. There is also a wealth of online resources from the Bible apps to websites and YouTube channels dealing with questions of faith (I personally recommend the *Unbelievable?* videos on YouTube). You might even like to bend the ear of your local vicar! Please send me an email or pick up the phone.

And if you haven't started asking those big questions.... Maybe it's time you did!

Update from the Moulsford Support Network Bernadette Sachse

The Old Vicarage Planning Application - Moulsford responds

In May's Moulsford News we provided a short update on the response to the Friends of the Elderly Old Vicarage planning application. At the time of writing, 19th May, there were already 40 responses from Moulsford residents. For a small village, this was already an outstanding response. What developed over the remaining days of May was quite incredible. By the time the submission deadline arrived on 1st June Moulsford residents had submitted almost 100 individual responses to this application. What an amazing effort! The scale and the quality of this response will be an important consideration for SODC planning, this collective voice will be heard.

There have been other important developments in response to the application.

- Moulsford Parish Council objected.
- The drainage officer has objected.
- The tree office has objected.
- North Wessex Downs AONB has objected.

A landscape report commissioned by SODC gave a very balanced assessment of the impact of the development on our community.

It is now for the Planning Officers at SODC to go through due process and formally assess the application. In the meantime, Moulsford can be very proud. We might be a small village, but Moulsford has demonstrated, beyond doubt, that it is to be taken seriously.

Blocked pipes have again been reported in recent weeks so here is a reminder and plea to all residents who use the system NOT to discard any of the following items into the drains, bag them as appropriate for waste collection instead:



SODC reminds residents to recycle responsibly

Thousands of residents in southern Oxfordshire have found their recycling bins unemptied each week because they have put the wrong things in them.

Putting non-recyclable items in recycling can contaminate a whole truckload, which is then rejected at the recycling facility. This turns neighbours' recycling into rubbish and ultimately wastes energy and raw materials by removing these items from the recycling process.

Bin crews in South Oxfordshire and Vale of White Horse districts have stepped up monitoring of recycling bins in recent months as the lockdown has meant an increase in household waste, which has meant an increased risk of people putting the wrong items in recycling bins.

To remind residents about what can (and can't) be recycled, South Oxfordshire and Vale of White Horse district councils have devised a new recycling quiz available here

During **one week** of recycling collections in the past month there were **3,801** reports of wrong items found in recycling bins in South Oxfordshire

Bins found with incorrect items for recycling were left unemptied.

The vast majority were rejected because residents had put black or coloured bin bags into recycling bins. Crews

cannot see what is in them and so won't empty the bin. The next biggest category of rejections was because food was found in the green bin. Food contaminates recycling making it unrecyclable. Food can be collected in food bins and taken to a separate facility where it is transformed into electricity and fertiliser.

Textiles, like old T-shirts and odd socks are another reason for crews to leave recycling bins unemptied. Although both councils collect textiles for recycling at a different facility, they must be left in a tied carrier bag next to the green bin. Other non-recyclable items which are regularly found by bin crews in recycling bins are polystyrene, plastic toys, garden waste, electrical items, wood and nappies.

These items cannot be sorted at the recycling centres and shouldn't be put in the recycling as they can contaminate a whole truckload of recycling.

Councillor David Rouane, South Oxfordshire District Council cabinet member for housing and the environment, said: "The waste contractor needs to know that the recycling is of a standard that is accepted by the materials recovery facility. With reduced staffing levels at the site, to maintain social distancing, and the increase in quantity of material being sent there, it is important that it receives good quality recycling."

Recycling should be in the green bin loose or in clear bags so the crews can easily identify that the contents are recyclable.

If they see non-recyclables, crews will leave the bins unemptied, record the reasons and leave a tag on the bin explaining to residents.




