

Dear Friends,

I write this at the end of a packed Bank Holiday weekend of celebrations and thanks for our Queen's 70 years of faith and service. It's wonderful to think that up and down the country, homes and shopfronts have been decorated, and communities have been celebrating together on their streets, with many neighbours probably meeting each other for the first time. Tomorrow, I'll be attending a Jubilee Tea Party at one of the nursing homes where I work as Chaplain; which will also give a great opportunity for relationship building.

Whatever we might think of the institution of the monarchy, I hope we can agree that our Queen is a remarkable woman who has demonstrated great servant leadership throughout her extraordinary reign. It's been interesting reflecting upon a booklet I've come across by Catherine Butcher, entitled 'Our Faithful Queen', which focuses on the thread of faith which has run right through the Queen's whole life.

After her father died, at just 56 years of age, the young queen needed to prepare spiritually and emotionally for her coronation. It was the Archbishop of Canterbury, Geoffrey Fisher, who guided her in these preparations by writing her 'A Little Book of Private Devotions' which set out 33 daily bible readings, reflections and prayers for the month leading up to her coronation. The most sacred part of the service (kept private by a canopy) was when the archbishop anointed the Queen with holy oil. Her anointing set her life apart for service to others, and she received an outpouring of God's Holy Spirit to strengthen and guide her. Her spiritual preparation for service to others, was based upon Jesus' commandment to love others as God loves us, and to love our neighbours by serving them.

And, of course, we'll remember in many of the Queen's Christmas broadcasts that she has spoken about the importance of neighbourliness and of looking out for and caring for each other. In 2000, she emphasised, "Jesus' simple but powerful teaching: love God and love thy neighbour as thyself – in other words, treat others as you would like them to treat you."

So, I'm sure the Queen will have been delighted by the countless community gatherings and events up and down the country last weekend, which brought people together in love. We spent a wonderful evening at The Cricketers Inn, Longparish, enjoying music sung by the very talented Longparish Village Choir - so a huge thank you to Cathy Yelf and her amazing group of singers & musicians for bringing so many people together.



If you haven't seen the short clip of Paddington Bear enjoying tea with the Queen — it's well worth a watch. I'll finish with Paddington's words: "Happy Jubilee, Ma'am, and thank you — for everything."





Highways - driver speeds reducing

Data collected from the Speed Indicator Device (SID) shows a significant reduction in driver speed since the last set of data was analysed. A comparison of the data for two similar length time-periods shows that 99% of drivers continue to drive at 35mph or less. In the most recent time-period, the number of cars driven at 25mph or less has increased from 60% in the last period before Christmas, to 80% in this period – in summary, more cars are driven more slowly. It is uncertain why this should be the case, but factors affecting driver speed may include rising fuel costs causing more careful driving, increased awareness of the Speed Indicator Device, or the recently added white lines on the stretch of road adjacent to the playground.

SSEN Resilient Communities Fund

The Parish Council has applied for a grant from SSEN's Resilient Communities Fund in the hopes of securing funding to purchase or lease an emergency generator to be sited at The Plough Inn community hub and pub, which we hope to designate as an emergency hub for the village. If the PC is successful in obtaining a grant, the generator will be available to provide emergency hot/cold food and drink as well as limited charging facilities in emergency situations such as prolonged power interruptions caused mainly by extreme weather conditions. The Plough Inn has a resident Management team, accessible facilities and community rooms and the PC feels that siting a generator at The Plough Inn is most convenient for public access in an emergency.

Football pitch

Following an accident at the football field recently, the PC voted to remove the wooden barrier adjacent to the pitch. This will be removed shortly.








The Greening Campaign gives advice to communities so that they can take meaningful action to reduce their environmental impact.

Phase 1 of the Greening Campaign is now complete. Thank you to all those who took part and displayed their pledge cards.

Together we saved 38.456 tons of CO² which is roughly the same as 38 hot air balloons. If everyone put the money they saved from

making these small changes into a pot, the community would save a total of £20,125 or £287.50 per household.

Phase 2 of the Greening Campaign focuses on three pillars: nature, retrofit and health and wellbeing.

Not to mention the many official and unofficial street parties – we certainly did Her Majesty proud!

LONGPARISH OF OLD

With the Queen's Platinum Jubilee now a memory, Hill and Valley has looked back at how Longparish celebrated the Golden Jubilee of Queen Victoria 137 years ago. A feast was held in the same school "meadow", where villagers recently held their FoLS Street party. Details of the event, on June 11, 1887 were recorded in a notebook owned by John Woodcock which was transcribed by Mary Jo Darrah some years ago.

As was tradition the event was mostly paid for by the "better off classes", in this case 49 farmers, landowners, and tradesmen including Mrs Ironmonger of Middleton House, Colonel Tippinge of Longparish House, the Rev Woodcock (John's father), H. Hawker of Greenholme - a total of seventy-seven pounds, thirteen shillings and six pence was raised; £10,806 in today's money. This was plenty to pay for a mouth-watering feast of roast beef, pies, hot potatoes, radishes, cheese, lettuce, buns and 200lb. of plum pudding cooked by the ladies of the village in their own ovens. The chronicler records that "about 30 gentlemen and ladies carved and the young ladies waited on the people, several men helping with the heavy joints and drink".

Mr Snow (Mary's father) had provided four horses and two men to fetch tents from Andover and Clatford and Mr Gwyer paid for them to be returned. The dinner tent was decorated by the ladies of the village. Drink flowed freely. It had been calculated the men would consume a quart of beer and women one pint each of beer or six bottles of mineral water. Altogether 117 gallons of beer and 1,128 bottles of mineral water were drunk.

A showman paid £1 to set up his traditional "swing boats" in the school meadow and apparently did a roaring trade. Roundabouts and shooting galleries erected in Mrs Gwyer's meadow nearby also did good business. The precious notebook is lodged in the Hampshire County Archive in Winchester.

Thank you, Mary Jo, for your diligent research.



BIRDS OF LONGPARISH BY CHRIS BOWMAN THE CUCKOO



Everyone knows the cuckoo; some say a swallow is the first sign of spring, others the say it's the cuckoo. When I was growing up in the village they were calling all day long but not so now they have been put on the red list of endangered species. I have heard and

seen it more times this year than I have for a long time. They arrive in April and leave in late June/July.

They migrate all the way to the Congo in Southern Africa, those satellite tagged are tracked down the west coast and east coast and others fly straight across the Sahara dessert. The longest returning one is called Colin. Every spring he returns to Thursley common in Surrey and it's his ninth time! Photographers leave food out for him and he has become so tame they can photograph him really close up.

Cuckoos are very similar to kestrels in size and shape. Rather small head, long narrow edged wings, long rounded tail, grey chest and a white barred belly. They are parasites: they lay their eggs in other birds' nests. The female watches birds making their nest and when they lay, the Cuckoo lays one in it as well. The egg hatches in twelve days, it will then push all the other eggs out of the nest so it gets all the food. They fledge in three weeks but the host parents will feed it for another two, by this time it's about three times the size of its hosts. Cuckoo's favourite food is hairy caterpillars and insects.

Hill and Valley - how does it reach you?

On the last weekend of the month in 10 months of the year Hill and Valley drops on your door mat. You may wonder how the process of producing it works...

At the top of the chain there is an oversight committee which sets the constitution of the magazine and monitors the finances. This is chaired by Michael Widen in St Mary Bourne who shares the production role with me. All 3 parish councils are represented on the committee. The magazine costs about £1,100 per issue to have printed, paid for by advertising and a small annual contribution from all 3 parish councils. Michael has been involved with the magazine for many years and is the mainstay of its production. He organizes the 12 pages of advertising, sources the photo for the front cover (usually one of his own photos), prompts the clergy for the church pages, and composes the back cover with the diary dates.

The copy deadline is always a Wednesday. Our village editor (currently Georgina Montague) collates the articles submitted from the village and after it is proof-read by Jeremy and Maggie Barber, she sends the finished 6 pages to me by Sunday. The other parish editors in Hurstbourne Priors and St Mary Bourne do likewise. Generally, by about 7.00pm on Sunday I have the whole magazine contents which I put in order together with the advertisements and send them to the printer. At 7.00am the next morning Andover Printing Company send a proof of the whole magazine which I check and clear. They print and box up 1,250 copies of the magazine by the following Friday. Meanwhile the Barbers prepare the diary and special notice insert.

Usually on the last Friday of the month the boxes are collected, the St Mary Bourne and Hurstbourne Priors boxes dropped off and the 350 Longparish copies to our house, whereupon Alix and I put the diary insert into each copy, then split them up for our amazing team of deliverers who ensure that every house in the village receives their free copy. On the Saturday I do a tour of the village dropping off the bundles to: Mary Jo Darrah, Elia Chamberlen ,Rosie Lowry, Corrine Bowman, Sarah Harris, Kim Lampard, Christian Dryden, Kay and Norman Bunce.

A huge thank you goes to our dedicated wonderful contributors, helpers, deliverers and to our outgoing editor. Please see below how you can join our editing team!

ANNA BYE 27th November 1931 to 16th April 2022



Anna Bye, who died on 16 April aged 90, was born in Cardiff. She had deep Welsh roots - her mother's family had lived at Dinas in the Rhondda Valley since the 17th century. Mum was particularly proud that a recent DNA test showed her ancestry to be 98% Welsh!

She spent her early years at Blackwood, Monmouthshire before

moving to Catbrook, a small hamlet above the Wye Valley near Monmouth, where her father had been appointed headteacher in 1940. After the Second World War she became a weekly boarder at Monmouth Schools for Girls and then, in 1950, she went to university in Exeter where she studied English Literature with Latin as a subsidiary. It was there that she met her future husband, Gerry Bye, who had completed his degree in Chemistry and was studying for his doctorate. After she graduated in 1953, Mum remained at Exeter for a further year to train as a teacher.

Our parents were married at Rhymney, Monmouthshire in 1955. After a honeymoon on the Isles of Scilly they began married life in Reading. There Mum taught at St Joseph's Convent while Dad worked as a research scientist at Aldermaston. After two years, when Dad became a lecturer in Chemistry at Liverpool Polytechnic, they moved to the Wirral. Mum taught at West Kirby Girls' Grammar School. During their eight years on the Wirral Philip, Matthew and Gavin were born.

In 1966 the family moved to Sheffield where Dad had been appointed to a lectureship at Sheffield University and it was here in the Department of Ceramics that his research involved the chemistry of cement which was to dominate the rest of his career. An invitation in 1969 to join the Research Department of Blue Circle Cement resulted in the family moving south to the village of Shorne, Kent.

With her children now growing up, and with her mother now living with us, Mum was able to return to her career as a teacher. She taught English and Latin and at Wombwell Hall; Northfleet until she took early retirement.

In 1985, they moved to this village, Hurstbourne Priors, in Hampshire and it became their home. They found it idyllic and enjoyed the countryside and village life with kind neighbours, making many friends and being involved with the church. Mum also sang in the local choir and was involved with the PCC, the May Fair and Ladies Coffee Mornings. Mum and Dad also shared a common interest in travelling on art and classical antiquity tours in Italy and around the Mediterranean.



Postcard from Binley July 2022

Freak accidents to several important members of the Binley Sheep Moving Team, none of them alcohol related which is unusual for this place, meant that after 27 years of sitting on the subs bench, I finally got the call and was invited to join the first team. My dreams had at last come true. At 6pm, as ordered and beyond excited I was out in the lane, my trusty stick in hand waiting for the other participants. Neighbour's curtains twitched. I could hear the plaintive cries "Why him and not me?" Jealousy is a terrible thing. I practised my stick moves, a thrust, a parry! "Gercha!!" All good. Confidence oozed from every pore. Then the team arrived, Team leader dressed in a motheaten checked shirt, volumous baggy shorts and mismatched socks and plimsoles, a sartorial look only the English upper classes can pull off. I felt overdressed. The team all carried sticks, but these sticks were like cudgels, as thick as your arm with grafted on goat horns and hooks. Medieval stuff! I looked at my puny stick and not for the first time felt inadequate.

Team leader gave a rousing briefing. There was talk of Tupps and Hoggets (whatever they were?) and delinquent lambs hell bent on causing trouble. I sucked on my teeth and punched the palm of my left hand with my right fist. Like Batman. Bring it on!

We emptied a field of Hoggets to start. I know now these are animals in their second spring or summer, so aged between one and two years old. They trooped meekly out with no dramas, like lambs to the...well, you know! But now things got serious as it was the turn of the delinquent youngsters and there was a heightened tension in the air. People became twitchy, palms sweaty. Positioned strategically not twenty yards from my own home I feared for my young dahlias. And then they were on me, the ewes and their lambs; and they were delightful, no trouble at all! We wandered happily up the lane behind them towards Blacksmith's Cottage in a scene that could have jumped straight from the pages of Laurie Lee's "As I Walked Out One Midsummer Morning". I find myself more and more attracted to sheep (in a healthy way) and admire their maternal instincts, their toughness and fortitude. Binley without sheep would be like Andalucía without larks or Malta without apes. Bereft.

The wrens in the barn have fledged and are pinging around everywhere. Their home, a ball of moss tucked between two joists in a dark corner, is as cosy as can be and has done them well. These nests are dotted all around my garden from previous years, behind drainpipes, under guttering, thatch and in hidden corners. They don't seem ever to be re-used and the Jenny wren could save herself a lot of time and trouble should she consider it. But I guess it is not in her nature. Tonight we have two sets of fledglings being fed on a little table in the courtyard at the back of the house and it is wonderful to watch.

I never realised how much fun retirement was going to be. The other day my wife complained that a bathroom tap was dripping. I said it wasn't. We went upstairs and stood staring at it for half an hour. She saw a drip, I denied it. I thought I'd won. No. She got a cardboard centre from a spent toilet roll and put it by the plug hole. The following morning she proudly presented this piece of sodden evidence at the breakfast table. I said it was caused by moisture coming up the plug hole. I thought that was the end of it but she has now fastened a cellophane sandwich

bag over the offending tap to catch the drips so I'm having to sneak upstairs every few hours to empty the damn thing! Is this how the rest of my life is going to play out?

Today we bade farewell to Rod Sutcliffe, a man I have known now for almost forty years. A stalwart of the church and community here in SMB, a proper chap in every sense and someone who always approached me with a twinkle in his eye. My early days here in the valley were spent ruinously in the George with Rod as Landlord. Here I witnessed the Llama incident and the great soda syphon fight which was started by Wyndham Culley and finished when Joe Hirst thought a bucket of old cooking oil in the kitchen was a bucket of water. The entire bar was covered in this stuff and you could sit and watch it travelling up the wall like blotting paper. Particularly sodden was Kate Mann, the voluptuous and buxom barmaid. What a character she was! Rod's wife Lynn stormed into the bar and demanded to know what was going on and where was Rod?

"Upstairs assisting Kate in the shower!" said the everhelpful Wyndham.

Lynn's face was a picture!

"What???" "Right!!!!" And up the stairs she went! Poor old Rodders! Oh, such happy times. NA

Rodney Walter Sutcliffe (Rod) 19th December 1933 – 20th May 2022

An Appreciation (compiled from tributes made at Rod's Thanksgiving Service)

On Saturday 11th June, St Peter's Church was filled to capacity with the family & friends of Rod Sutcliffe. They came to pay tribute to a man who made a positive difference to others throughout his life. Rod was hugely respected by everyone who crossed his path and he is remembered with gratitude as a "giant among men".

The foundation of Rod's life was the Church and his Christian faith. He would joke, "Why not? Christ was a friend of publicans"; and throughout his life he demonstrated Christianity at its best, with love running through the heart of everything as a "thread of gold". Rod's love of music, his good humour, his hospitality and generosity, his sense of duty and

honour, his leadership qualities and his deep love of family were expressed through music, readings, prayers and family reminiscences during the Thanksgiving Service at which his son the Revd Richard Sutcliffe and the Revd Canon Martin Coppen officiated.

Rodney Walter Sutcliffe was born in 1933, the second child of William & Doris. He had an older sister Pamela (Pam) and two younger brothers Terry and Martin. The family lived in Kent during his childhood, and music played an important part in his

early life. Rod sang in the church choir, later progressed to playing the flute and guitar, and subsequently became the Drum Major of the Royal Marine Cadets Band in Chatham Marine Barracks. Some years later, Rod was invited to be the Drum Major for the Middlesex Yeomanry Band. He led many parades in London at the Cenotaph, Horse Guards Parade and the Lord Major's Show, and he also organised special parades in St Mary Bourne to the delight of local residents in the 1980s.

Rod was called up for National Service in 1951 and served with the RAF in the Canal Zone at a tricky time leading up to the Suez crisis. On a home posting in 1954, he met and married Lynn. For both of them it was "love at first sight" and they maintained a happy and supportive marriage for the next 67 years. Sandra was born in 1961, followed by Richard in 1967. When Rod left the RAF in 1956, he worked in Middlesex and London, but in 1980 Rod & Lynn joined his brother Martin and wife to buy The George Inn in St Mary Bourne. The Sutcliffe family then left suburban life to start a new adventure.

Rod and Lynn ran the pub for the next 6 years. It was hard work but they made a great impact on village life. Rod loved people and was a wonderful host. When they retired due to Lynn's ill health, they moved across the road into Summerfield and Rod continued to throw his energies into helping the local community. He was Chair of the Fundraising Committee to build the new St Mary Bourne Village Centre in 1993 and was central to the building and opening of the new Village Shop in 2002. He served on the Parish Council for many years and was Chairman of the Bowling Club which oversaw the creation of the new Bowling Green in Bells Field. He played an active role in the British Legion, was an occasional performer with Priors Players, and his commentaries on the tortoise racing at the annual Flower Show became legendary. In 2002 he was proud to be elected a Church Warden at St Peter's where he was a faithful worshipper, and he fulfilled that role with distinction.

> Another major influence in Rod's life was Freemasonry. In 1968, he was initiated into the West London and Electric Lodge No 7404 in Middlesex and became Master of the Lodge in 1976. He spent several years supporting the Province of Middlesex and his commitment was recognised when he was appointed as a Grand Lodge Officer by the Duke of Kent at a ceremony in London. On moving to Hampshire, Rod joined Ariel Lodge No 8166 and was also a Visiting Officer to three other local lodges which ensured their continued success. The highlight of his Masonic journey was when he was awarded

the "Certificate of Service to Freemasonry in the Province of Hampshire and Isle of Wight" by the Provincial Grand Master in 2015. He always offered encouragement and guidance to others and was highly respected.

But central to Rod's life was his family. His love for Lynn was an unquenchable fire which lasted until death. He was a proud father, grandfather and greatgrandfather. He provided sympathy and strong support through disappointments and deep family tragedies and he rejoiced at the happy events that came along, such as discovering and getting to know his daughter Lynda, building strong links with Lynn's US family, and getting great happiness from seeing his grandsons mature into men and start their own families. Rod was a man of high standards and he inspired others by his example. He was much loved and is very much missed. A great good man. May he rest in peace and rise in glory.
