SPRING SHOW - 6TH APRIL 2024

Rules for Exhibitors

- 1. All exhibits in classes D1 D4, 1 20 and 29 40 shall be the bona-fide property of the Exhibitor, grown in his or her own garden or allotment. See Rule 9.
- 2. All entries shall be made on the Form provided and delivered to Lesley Schofield (see entry form) on or before Wednesday 3rd April. Earlier entries will be appreciated.

Entry fees: Adults - 25p per entry Juniors - 10p per entry

- 3. Exhibits must be staged for judging between <u>8am and 10.30am</u> 6th April in the Church Hall, Denmead. <u>Exhibitors must not move other exhibitors' entries.</u> Should more space be needed, please ask the Show Secretary or Stewards.
- 4. a) No more than three entries in any one class may be made by the same exhibitor.b) Only one cash prize in any one class will be awarded to the same exhibitor.
- 5. The Judge's decision is FINAL regarding the merit of exhibits. All matters of dispute shall be settled by the Society's Show Committee. Any protest shall be made to the Show Secretary by 3pm with a payment of £1 which will be refunded if the Exhibitor's complaint is upheld.
- 6. NO EXHIBITS or prize cards shall be removed until after an announcement is made approximately 4pm.
- 7. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry.

- 8. Cups, Medals and Diplomas will be awarded on the Judge's decision of merit and points will be awarded as follows:

 1st 4 points, 2nd 2 points, 3rd 1 point, HC ½ point.
- 9. The Committee reserves the right for its official representative to visit, by appointment, before or after the Show, gardens from which produce has been entered for competition.
- 10. The Committee cannot be responsible for exhibits or personal property.
- 11. All prize money will be paid out by the Treasurer after 3pm. All prize money must be checked before leaving the Treasurer and must be collected on the day. Any money not collected on show day will be assumed as a donation to the Society.
- 12. Exhibits in Homecraft may be cut at the Judge's discretion. Cake covers will be provided.
- 13. Exhibitors shall provide plates and vases (although vases are available). A 'vase' has a greater height than the width of its mouth. A 'bowl' has a width measurement at least equal to, but usually greater than, its height.
- 14. In all horticultural classes, varieties should be named (if known).
- 15. Novice classes are restricted to entrants who have never won a first prize for the material exhibited in any of the Shows held by the Society.
- 16. All trophies must be returned, cleaned, to Anne Hughes, The Poplars, Hambledon Road (opposite Lincoln Green Nurseries) Denmead, one month before the next Spring Show.

SET RECIPE (Class 56, page 11) Lemon, Parsnip & Hazelnut Cake

Ingredients

For the cake:

350g parsnips, peeled and grated (squeeze out any moisture)

Finely grated zest of 3 lemons

250ml rapeseed oil

3 large eggs

85g roasted hazelnuts, chopped, plus 25g to decorate.

125g stem ginger, chopped

250g self-raising flour

175g soft light brown sugar

Lemon frosting:

125g butter

250g mascarpone

2 tbsp lemon juice

125g icing sugar



Method

- 1 Preheat the oven to 190C / fan 170C / gas mark 5. Grease and line two 20cm round sandwich tins.
- 2 In a large bowl, combine the parsnips, lemon zest, oil, eggs, hazelnuts, and stem ginger, then add the flour and sugar. Mix well.
- 3 Spoon the mixture into the tins, spreading it evenly. Bake for about 30 minutes or until a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean. Turn out onto a wire rack to cool completely.
- 4 To make the frosting, beat the butter until smooth, then add the mascarpone and lemon juice and mix until combined. Finally sift in the icing sugar and beat until light and fluffy.
- 5 To assemble the cake, place one of the cooled sponges on a serving plate and spread half of the frosting over the top. Place the other sponge on top, then use the remaining frosting to cover the top. Decorate with the extra hazelnuts.



For Classes D1 to D4 please see the definitions of divisions on page 9 Daffodil is the common name for bulbs in the genus narcissus and where a division is not specified, they may be single or multi headed. Classes 9 to 14 - Bulbs/plants to be shown in the container in which they are grown.

- D1 Vase of trumpet daffodils (div 1) -3 stems, 1 variety
- D2 Vase of large-cupped daffodils (div 2) 3 stems, 1 variety
- D3 Vase of small-cupped daffodils (div 3) 3 stems, 1 variety.
- D4 Vase of double daffodils (div 4) -3 stems, 1 variety
- 1. Vase of 5 stems of daffodils (one variety)
- 2. Vase of 5 stems miniature daffodils (one variety)
- 3. Vase of 5 stems of daffodils (mixed varieties)
- 4. Vase of mixed cut spring flowers
- 5. Vase of 5 tulips (one variety)
- 6. Vase of 5 tulips (mixed varieties)
- 7. Vase of 5 stems of polyanthus or primroses (mixed varieties)
- 8. Vase of flowering shrubs
- 9. 5 daffodils growing in a pot or bowl.
- 10. Hyacinths (any number) growing in a pot or bowl.
- 11. Flowering spring bulbs other than those already mentioned, growing in any type of container.
- 12. Viola growing in a pot or bowl.
- 13. Cyclamen growing in a pot or bowl.
- 14. Polyanthus or primroses growing in a pot or bowl.
- 15. Container of cacti/succulents
- 16. Container of Tillandsia (air plants)
- 17. Flowering pot plant
- 18. Foliage pot plant
- 19. Fern pot plant
- 20. Vase of mixed foliage



DIVISION 1 TRUMPET DAFFODIL CULTIVARS

One flower to a stem; corona (trumpet) as long as, or longer than the perianth segments (petals)

DIVISION 2 LARGE-CUPPED DAFFODIL CULTIVARS

One flower to a stem; corona more than one third, but less than equal to the length of the perianth

DIVISION 3 SMALL-CUPPED DAFFODIL CULTIVAR

One flower to a stem; corona not more than one third the length of the perianth segments

DIVISION 4 DOUBLE DAFFODIL CULTIVARS

One or more flowers to a stem; with doubling of the perianth segments or the corona or both

Section 2 FLORAL ART

Judge: Margaret Davis

Judging to be in accordance with NAFAS schedule definitions, except classes 25 and 26.

An exhibit is composed of natural plant material with or without accessories, displayed in a niche 61cms (24") wide, 61cms (24") deep and 76cms (30") high.

Novices and gentlemen may enter any Floral Art classes. Please state on entry form if Novice – see Rule 15, page 4

- 23. 'On With The Show', an exhibit depicting a favourite musical.
- 24. 'Spring is Sprung' an exhibit, without using floral foam.
- 25. An arrangement for a low table NOVICE only class. Space allowed 60cms (24") in width and depth.
- 26. 'Man Cave', an exhibit Gentlemen only
- 27. Petite arrangement, overall size not to exceed 23cms (9") in width, height, and depth.
- 28. Miniature arrangement, overall size not to exceed 10cms (4") in width, height, and depth.

Denmead Horticultural Society Flower Arranging Workshop meets at the Memorial Hall, on the 2nd Wednesday of each month (except August) starting at 7.30pm.

At each session a different style or aspect of Floral Art is demonstrated, and members can then try it out for themselves. The evening is very friendly and informal, beginners welcome.
