



Summer Sorbet

Ingredients

- 2 pounds fresh fruit, any combination of berries or stone fruit
- 8 ounces sugar
- 1-ounce freshly squeezed lemon juice
- 1/2-ounce vodka
- Pinch of salt



Directions

Berries: Rinse, stem and halve large strawberries. Peel the stone fruits, halve, pit, and chop larger specimens into 1/2-inch pieces.

Puree the fruit in a food processor or blender along with the sugar, lemon juice, vodka and salt. Pour into another vessel and refrigerate until the mixture reaches at least 40 degrees F/4.5 degrees C, 4 to 6 hours.

Churn in an ice cream machine according to the manufacturer's instructions until the mixture resembles soft serve ice cream. Freeze for at least 4 hours in an airtight container or until ready to serve. If you do not have an ice cream machine mix by hand-this will produce a more crystalline sorbet

Update 2 Weston Turville's Role in the Cold War

Last year's request for information about the ROC Nuclear Monitoring Post has helped us piece together a more complete timeline for the site.

1953	The Post at Stone was relocated to Weston Turville and an above ground brick post constructed with a movable corrugated iron roof over the store. It was raised about 2M above the ground.
	ŭ
1959	this was supplemented with an underground Nuclear
	Monitoring Post.
1968	the Post was closed
2012	The site of the post is included within the boundary of the
	proposed Hampden Fields development. The "Archaeology
	and Cultural Heritage" report by Wessex Archaeology
	categorises the post as "Negligible Value".



In our view however, the fact that the monitoring post was demolished above ground but not filled in means that it has been undisturbed for 50 years, escaping the vandalism that has plagued similar sites. In other

parts of the country the role of the Royal Observer Corps is being celebrated by restoring and preserving their posts and naming streets in their honour.

We also now have an aerial photograph of the site from November 1957 (before the Golf Club arrived next door). Many thanks to everyone that responded.





PARISH COUNCIL NEWS



The Parish Council Annual Parish Meeting was held in April with speakers from both Thames Valley Police and a representative from the company fitting the new street lights. For those persons who did not attend I will precise the information as best as I can:

Thames Valley Police have reviewed the current patrol strategy to accommodate changing crime patterns and Government Financial restraints. The new patrol policy will still have 'Neighbourhood Teams' covering our area but all immediate response requirements will be covered by Aylesbury Police response officers. A greater emphasis will be put on to the investigation of reported crimes with larger multi skilled teams being allocated the investigations after initial police attendance. They also mentioned the current increase in reports of anti-social behaviour and assured us that a multi-agency investigation was being conducted and additional patrols undertaken. Everyone was encouraged to report any incidents as soon as possible for optimum results.

The street lights owned by the parish council are in the process of being changed to more effective and efficient LED lights. It is anticipated that 50% will be converted/changed within the next financial year, prioritising the lights that have stopped working. The lights are designed to reduce light pollution by shining down onto the pavements rather than the ambient light of the old lamps. The old lights can no longer be repaired because the parts are now obsolete and the new lights are considerably cheaper to run as they use less electricity. The new lights are programmable to reduce the light emitted after a certain time to reduce light pollution further but these need to be set prior to installation. Anyone with concerns about the new lights should contact the parish clerk.

We currently have a new vacancy for a parish councillor: why not come along to a meeting to see what is involved and maybe you could help shape the parish for the future in these uncertain times?

The tree maintenance required in several areas throughout the parish is being undertaken so as to reduce damage to the health of the trees and so not to disturb feathered residents. The tree which was recently removed from the village hall car park because it was dying will be replaced later in the year.

The new children's slide in the play area of the playing fields which had been requested by many users should have been installed by the time you read this and the tennis courts should also be fully painted and operational again.

During the consultations for the Weston Turville Neighbourhood plan; we were requested to consider the installation of a skate/BMX park. We would like to hear from some of the youths who will be using this facility to help in the planning of the park. Please speak out as otherwise it will be designed by people who are not going to use it! Contact the clerk for information on getting involved.

The consultation regarding the installation of parking restrictions in Hampden Hall has now closed and the new yellow lines will be painted on the road at the entrance and on bends to restrict parking which has been causing obstructions.

Speeding and HGV's through the village is still an issue and the Parish Council continues to work with Bucks CC Highways department and others to obtain a suitable resolution. It is anticipated that permanent traffic calming will be introduced through the village as part of mitigation measures being funded by developers. We are still waiting for the BCC to install the ground screw holders for the MVAS (mobile speed indicator) at the locations requested by residents.




