## Lilleshall's Hidden Treasures

Spring has arrived and now we look forward to the blooming of flowers and the arrival of our summer migrant birds again. Lilleshall is very fortunate in having a diverse range of habitats suitable for all wildlife and getting to know the species of flora and fauna that are present, can be both rewarding and exciting.

Over lockdown, my wife and I have done a detailed study of the bird life in several parts of the parish, focussing mainly on the Kynnersley Drive and Donnington Drive past Parson's Barracks. During the two years we have recorded 84 different species over the full 12 months but it is the spring that brings us the greatest pleasure.

One of the first summer visitors to arrive is the chiffchaff whose characteristic disyllabic song can be heard from late March onwards and heralds the arrival of other visitors. Blackcaps are common especially in the woods near Whitegates and the males begin singing in early April. Later on that month they will be joined by the less common garden warbler whose song is very similar and it takes a lot of experience to separate the two! Incidentally, if you download the Merlin Bird free app on to your mobile, you can use this on your walks to tell you what you are hearing and so identify any bird calls or songs that you are listening to. Swallows and house martins arrive in April to breed on local farm buildings, whilst the cuckoo can be heard frequently from late April to mid- June. In the hedgerows and along the sides of streams in the surrounding fields, common whitethroats and several pairs of sedge warblers can be heard singing their distinctive songs. Even the odd pair of reed warblers can be heard with their staccato-like songs in reed beds right on the parish boundary near Kynnersley.





The other more exotic and colourful summer visitor is the yellow wagtail that appears in the fields near The Humbers and is sometimes seen on the settling beds of the sewage works down Donnington Drive, along with the very graceful grey wagtail and pied wagtail, both of which are resident here. On a spring morning one can hear the clarion calls of the green woodpecker along with the drumming of its cousin the greater spotted woodpecker, as well as the far-ringing calls of the nuthatch, not to mention the beautiful outpourings of the skylarks. If you are really lucky you might also spot the blue flash of a kingfisher along one of the brooks or hear the enigmatic call of the quail, which sounds like 'wet-my-lips'. However, even winter has its charms with many visitors arriving from further north, such as redwings and fieldfares with the passage of birds like snipe and the now far less common lapwing. Even the red kite can be seen in the sky, perhaps sharing the air space with our buzzards, kestrels and ravens.



I haven't said anything about the prolific number of flowers in spring and summer, nor the sightings you can have of foxes, squirrels, hares or even badgers. So, go out there, see what you can find and enjoy the spectacles that the natural world is waiting to give you!
