AUTO SPEEDWATCH

At the next Acol Parish Council meeting (Monday 26th September, 11.00 at The Village Hall) the Council will consider a report recommending the installation of an Auto Speedwatch system for the village.

Auto Speedwatch is based-upon a solar-powered device that captures images of the rear of speeding vehicles and sends these, together with speed and registration data for checking, to an Internet Dashboard. Community Speedwatch volunteers then need to check and verify the information for onward transmission to the Police via the Community Speedwatch system. Communities that have already introduced the system have seen significant increases in the numbers of speeding offences reported, followed by correspondingly reduced speeding incidents.

Whilst Auto Speedwatch can reduce the load on volunteers in roadside sessions and help maintain a more consistent speeding deterrent, its backing by Kent Police is contingent upon there being active Speedwatch teams in the communities in which they operate. Acol struggles to maintain an active Speedwatch presence, and we are therefore appealing, once more, for additional volunteers to come forward to help in mounting regular Speedwatch sessions on our roads. The time commitment is minimal - typically two or three hours per month. Initial training is online and followed in practical session with experienced volunteers.

VILLAGE INFORMATION

IMPORTANT ADVICE

On 28th June 2022, the Police, Crime, Sentencing and Courts Act introduced new powers for police forces to ban Travellers setting up camp illegally on other people's land. This will now be a criminal offence and, if they refuse to move, they could be liable to up to 3 months in prison or a fine of up to £2,500 or both and/or seizure of their vehicle. The Home Office advise that the government has a £10 million capital grant fund for 2022/23 to support local authorities in providing accommodation for them. If villagers notice any illegal parking, please advise the Parish Council in order that police action can be taken.
