### **NEWS FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL**

At the suggestion of Mark and Lucie Godfrey, who had collated details of many overweight vehicles travelling through the village over several days (for which, many thanks ) Richard has written, as Council Chair, to the three most prolific violators of the Acol thoroughfare 7.5 tonne weight limit.

Additionally, the first joint enforcement activity by the police and Acol Speedwatch Team has been planned for Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> November. Wider enforcement activity, covering all Thanet villages, will take place later in the month.

Wendy reported on her meeting with Cllr. Neville Hudson, Chair of Birchington Parish Council, to learn more about its preparation of a Local Neighbourhood Plan and confirmed our own aim of developing an Acol plan, which will commence with an initial "village appraisal" and canvassing of residents' views.

The meeting featured a good deal of discussion of the extensive development, planned and underway, across Thanet, with concerns about continuing loss of grade 1 agricultural land, pressure on scarce resources and unscrupulous

developers. KCC Councillor Derek Crow-Brown also noted that the urgent need for new and improved infrastructure to accommodate new development was recognised by both the KCC and TDC Leaders.

Sarah outlined plans for a New Year's Eve Party in Acol Village Hall. Details to follow soon.

The next Parish Council meeting (Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> December at 7.30 pm) will consider the draft PC budget for 2024. Please contact any Councillor with suggestions or views you may have on what should (or should not) be included. Full minutes of the Parish Council meeting are on the Acol PC website, which now includes a meeting attendance record that will be updated for every future meeting.

### **VILLAGE HALL**

*Please can anyone who receives notifications about Road Closures or planned Power Outages ensure that I am advised ([inchley@btinternet.com](mailto:inchley@btinternet.com)) or ring 847705 at the earliest opportunity so that I may include the information in Village Voice and also advise hirers of the Hall. The closure of 30<sup>th</sup> October - 1<sup>st</sup> November meant that two hirings involving two sessions and about twenty embroiderers had to be postponed at the last minute due to lack of parking and heating for the hall. Please do not assume that, because you have received notification, that everyone in the Village has. Eg Dilnot Lane has an underground electric feed, whereas the Street is fed overground, so we don't get told about replacing poles. Further, because Dilnot Lane is not on the main road between Minster and Birchington, we got no prior notification that access to the Village and through the Village was to be closed!*

# Kent Fraud Alert System



### BT Phishing Scam

Scammers are sending emails claiming to be from BT. These messages state that you need to 'refresh' your account due to security measures. The emails include a fake link that will encourage you to 'verify' your account but it is all a scam to steal your personal data.

Below is a copy of the type of message that is being sent.

If you think that you may have been a victim of this or any other type of scam, then contact your Bank immediately, which you can do by ringing 159 and report it to Action Fraud at [www.actionfraud.police.uk](http://www.actionfraud.police.uk) or call 0300 123 2040.
