#### 20.39 Chairman Welcome and Announcements

The Chairman, Martyn Bidgood, welcomed everyone to the Council's first Zoom meeting.

# 20.40 Apologies

Cllrs Mary Wright and Giles Greenwood were not present

# 20.41 Disclosable Pecuniary Interests

Cllr Philip Jones declared an interest in item 14.a) cheque payments, as this included a payment to reimburse him for expenses

No requests for dispensation had been received

# 20.43 Report from Shropshire Councillor

There was none at this time

# 20.44 Public Participation Session

There were no questions from the public at this time

## **20.45 Minutes**

It was proposed, seconded, and **resolved** to approve and sign the minutes dated 9<sup>th</sup> September 2020

## 20.46 Matters Arising

- i) It was noted that correspondence from Phillip Dunne M.P had said that Renew relocation from Grindle Farm would be finalised by 30<sup>th</sup> September 2020. The Chairman reported that this did not look to have been the case, but understood that it the site is now vacated and he expressed the hope that this would be the final time this matter was mentioned.
- ii) A gift had been given to Mrs Diana Russell thanking her for all the work she has on the Parish Newsletter on behalf of the community

# 20.47 General Power of Competence

It was proposed, seconded and **resolved** to state that the Parish Council is an eligible council to exercise the General Power of Competence in accordance with the Localism Act 2011 ss 1-8 as i) the Parish Clerk completed and passed CiLCA in October 2020 and ii) as two-thirds of the Councillors were elected and not co-opted

The Parish Council offered its congratulations to the Parish Clerk.

# 20.48 Highways

i) Condition of the roads

Correspondence has been sent to Shropshire Council Highways about the condition of roads out of the village but there has been no response as yet. Cllr Mark Lea said that the worst sections of Evelith Lane falls into Shifnal Parish and that the amount of work done has been miniscule. People might want to use the lane to go into Shifnal but don't use it because of its condition. It was agreed that a reminder email should be sent about the poor condition of Field Lane, Grindle Road, and Evelith Lane. It was also agreed that an email should be sent to Shifnal parish Council about Evelith Lane.

# ii) Kemberton Junction

There was some discussion about the lack of notification and discussion with the Parish Council about upcoming work on Kemberton Junction, due in four weeks. Whilst there was agreement that the work is likely to be maintenance rather than substantial changes, more information and dialogue would be welcome. It was agreed that Highways should be chased up about consultation on Kemberton Junction.

# iii) Any other Highway matters

An overflowing drain on the junction between Field Lane and Mill Lane has been causing problems in cold winter weather with the overflowing water freezing into a sheet of ice. It was agreed that this issue should be included in correspondence to Shropshire Council Highways.

There a report of a cellar pump going onto the pavement and then onto the road on Mill Lane. It was agreed that this issue should be raised with Shropshire Council Building Control.

# 20.53 Environment

A flytipping incident has been reported after being captured on a resident's CCTV. The car did not have up-to-date tax according to DVLA records against its registration number. This has been reported to DVLA.

There was some discussion on possible strategies for addressing the problem of flytipping and the value or otherwise of putting up advisory signage. It was agreed that the Parish Clerk contacts Shropshire Council to ask what

strategies it might suggest to address the problem.

# 20.54 Any Other Parish Matters

It was noted that the affordable home on Mill Lane remains empty. Two properties have been approved as affordable homes in the village, one of which is not currently being used as a home.

It was agreed that the Parish Clerk should contact the Planning Department for clarification on the current situation as an unoccupied house is not serving the purpose of affordable housing for the community.

A report had been received about trees being cut down in the Conservation Area and it had been questioned if permission had been sought for it. It was agreed that the Parish Clerk report this to Shropshire Council.
