COUNTRY NOTES MARCH 2016

12th March

The temperature is around freezing point and a cold clammy fog reduces visibility to seventy five yards, the bare trees in diminishing shades of grey recede into the distance until they blend imperceptibly into the sky. A crow calls unseen, a voice from the mist. Along Hodcott track a pair of ravens, their presence announced by their "kronking" calls, fly from the direction of Folly Farm, they approach unseen until they emerge from the fog, so low they barely clear the thorns alongside the track, they see me at the same moment as I see them, wheel away in surprise and disappear towards the Winter Gallops. Nearing The Furze the fog thickens, visibility now down to twenty five yards. The full, liquid notes of a robin's melodious song contrast with the thin, but still musical, tune from a hedge sparrow. These sounds are joined by the plaintive bleats of recently born lambs and the answering voices of their anxious mothers. Approaching the Ridgeway the eastern sky begins to brighten and a weak sun starts to burn off the mist. Returning home the rookery behind the house is noisy with activity, a stream of birds fly in carrying thin branches to build new nests and to repair the old. A returning bird feeds it's sitting partner, is she

incubating eggs or is this a gift to reinforce the bond between them?

17th March

For some days now the lawn has been the scene of a territorial dispute between two cock blackbirds, both resplendent in their new breeding regalia, sporting bright orange beaks and matching eye rings. The tension has been heightened by the presence of the bird feeder. Both males want access to this food source but the more dominant wants to keep it for himself and his new mate. This morning the dispute was resolved by a third party, a sparrowhawk! The lawn was littered with feathers but a body was nowhere to be found, carried off by the hawk to somewhere more private to enjoy it's breakfast. Perdix

I am writing to you on behalf of the club committee to offer a warm welcome and to herald the 2016 season, and also to outline some of the planning we have been discussing over the winter months. The season really starts for all in mid-April, and all plans and preparations do make for what promises to be a really exciting season for all connected with West Ilsley CC.

I hope that you will have seen the flyer which was produced regarding training nights for all age groups, and following the season starter - the presentation evening on Friday 15th April, the Juniors will be getting ready for the first of over twenty home matches during the season, starting on 1st May. I am delighted to confirm that the Minis will be in Friday evening action for 2016, thanks to a group of parents stepping forward to organise our youngest members.

The senior 1st XI start on 30th April and have nine home fixtures in the re-organised OCA division 4, under the captaincy of John Bowness, and they would really welcome your Saturday support at home - and for that matter away - at some grounds across Oxfordshire which are nearly as attractive as ours! After last year's cup success we venture into that too, with a very tough first round draw away at Eynsham. The Sunday XI, captained by Andy Brown, have ten home fixtures to look forward to, including a series of friendlies with a T20 format, starting on 17th April. Please do make yourselves available to enjoy these opportunities on the field, or just come along for a drink and a cheer.

This season we have also entered a team for the Wednesday evening Red Kite Building Solutions' Downs League - T20 fixtures starting promptly at

6.15pm, with the home team in the field. There are six of these Wednesday night fixtures, starting on 25th May, and it would be great to see the whole village in attendance - by August 3rd we hope to have sealed promotion from Division 4 of this competition. It's always good to have a clear target!

Friday evening will, as ever, be an important social time at the club, and we have planned to bring back the Vicars Game raffle every week, plus a barbecue whenever the weather permits. There has also been some planning for some social events too, including a Quiz evening or two, and a Cheese and Wine party - or similar - which has been much enjoyed in the past. If you have ideas for social events, or could help to run these, we would love to hear your suggestions or have your involvement. Most importantly, come along and support these functions, and bring some friends to become new club social members.

All of the proceeds from the bar, and any profits from such functions as above, will be going towards our project for 2016 - the replacement of the artificial wicket on the square and the resurfacing and refurbishment of the net. We have made applications for some grants and match funding towards this, and we are awaiting outcomes, but we aim to run some fundraising activities, and we will also be actively seeking sponsorships and donations during the year. The committee feel that this particular development project will give most the benefit for cricket from the Minis all the way up through the club.

Joining the club, in all categories of membership, is vital to our success in every way - so please use the website or come to see Justin Pilditch as early as possible in the season and get signed in and paid up. We do need to remind everyone that playing membership of the club is imperative with regard to insurance, and that social membership of the club is also a requisite to use the licensed bar. This is something that we will be reminding you of discreetly on Friday's social evenings - the committee are reminded it is a condition of the licence as a private members' club. During the winter a number of people responded to an invitation to become Vice Presidents of the club, with a donation of £50, and this invitation is now extended to all members of the club. It is certainly not a male preserve, incidentally, and I hope that many of you would think of supporting this club in this way. 
