CARLTON HOUSING NEEDS SURVEY

Carlton Parish Council recently engaged Housing Needs Midlands to conduct a housing needs survey in the village (at no cost to the PC it should be noted). The PC will be discussing the results at the next Parish Council meeting, on 3 October. Anyone living in the Parish who would like to support or oppose the matter is very welcome to attend and make their views known.

The survey looked at whether current housing stock was affordable and met the needs of Carlton residents and those with connections to the area who would like to live here. The key facts from the report are as follows. The full report is available at *carltonontrentpc.org.uk* and is available to read in the phone box.

- 31% of households responded (120 surveys were distributed)
- Over 80% of respondants were couples or single person households.
- Nearly 70% of respondants had lived in Carlton for 10 years or more.
- Respondants thought that there was most need for homes for elderly people, small family homes and homes for young people
- Very few respondants recorded members of their household leaving the village, recently, and of those that left none did so because of lack of affordable housing.
- 80% of respondents thought there was a need for a small number of new homes in the village specially designed to meet local people's needs, but 55% said there was no lack of adequate housing currently.
- 8 respondents indicated a need for housing and as a result the report suggests the building of 5 open market homes and 3 affordable homes.*
- An exception site (land not usually allowed for building) could be used for development provided a landowner willing to sell was found.
- These homes could be developed as part of a larger development*
- * Fifi note: not at all likely according to the Local Plan, which has 95% of local development taking place in Sutton and already allocated to Persimmon Homes.
