

This months bird is Bonnie. and she's a Sparrowhawk! Sparrowhawks are small birds of prey, although as with all birds of prey the girls are bigger (and tougher) than the boys. Sparrow hawks like to hunt in smaller spaces like woodland

and gardens, and they often eat smaller birds although the girls can eat birds upto the size of a pigeon sometimes even eat bats! Sparrowhawks are often blamed for the decline in songbirds but scientific research shows that they have little impact relative to other factors. More importantly if you help songbirds with food and nestboxes it'll help them thrive and Bonnie wont go hungry either!



### Dear Editor,

The October edition of The Village Voice carried a notice advertising a vacancy on the Parish Council. I attended the September Parish Council meeting when Councillor Colin Wells announced his intention to retire, but no discussion was allowed about how the vacancy would be filled as a letter of resignation had not been received. Fast forward to the October PC meeting. When the floor was opened for public questions. I enquired if the vacancy was now official and what would happen next. I was astonished to learn that not only had a letter of resignation been received, but a notice had apparently been posted on the PC noticeboard on The Green for the statutory period of 14 days and because no petition for an election had been received, the council would now move to co-opt someone. I was not the only person surprised by this news – none of the members of the public present and two Councillors were also taken aback. Hearing our protests, the Parish Clerk undertook to see if the notice could be republished to allow appetite for an election to be gauged. he following day, in the space of less than 12 hours, I collected 34 signatures from voters in the Parish calling for an election, so the appetite certainly exists! I delivered the petition to the Parish Clerk and West Oxfordshire District Council but it was rejected on the grounds that it was received after the statutory period had elapsed and subsequent appeals from myself and other residents have fallen on deaf ears. Ears so deaf, it seems, that the Parish Clerk has not

An online poll on the Village's Facebook group revealed that only 3 out of 88 people had been aware of the vacancy notice. When the Parish Council regularly use other noticeboards in the Parish plus email, online groups and The Village Voice to advertise matters of importance, it beggars belief that anyone could reasonably claim that a single notice on a board that is not often casually viewed fulfils the legal requirement of being conspicuous. It leaves the question – was this a deliberate move by The Parish Council Chair to keep certain members of the Parish Council and members of the public in the dark? Was it designed to deny us the opportunity of electing a new representative, but instead bring about the position where a compliant individual might be appointed via co-option? Yours faithfully,
