I have very kindly been lent three scrap books that belonged to the late Audrey Tizzard.



## MALTHOUSE WELL

The Malthouse well level bottomed out in the first week of January and it is now slowly rising. It currently stands at 17.8 metres (approx. 58.5ft) below ground level. The January weather has been kind to us rain wise and we had only about 25mm (1in) rain during the month. Adding this to the lower than average rainfall in November and December it has helped to lessen the effect of a much wetter than average October.


The graph below shows the big difference between now and when we had the floods in 2014. The groundwater level is currently about 15 metres (49ft approx) lower now than back in February 2014. Provided the rain in this month and March is in the normal range the ground water rise will continue to gently rise as the ground warms up and Spring arrives.

#### **UPDATE FROM CAROLYNE CULVER DISTRICT COUNCILLOR FOR RIDGEWAY WARD**

The Compton Institute planning application for 160 homes on the former animal health institute site was debated at Western Area Planning Committee on 12 January. Motions for and against the planning application were lost, so it has been deferred until 23 February.

We had a very lengthy and robust discussion about the number of homes being proposed, the mix of housing (ie how many bedrooms), traffic implications, impact on local schools and doctors' surgery, contamination on the site, community assets including the cricket pitch, Pickled Pig and Piglets Nursery, the proposed employment area, green space, flooding and sustainable drainage, and so on.

The public referendum on Compton's Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) takes place on 10 February, and all residents on the electoral roll in Compton can

vote. If this document is accepted it will carry great weight in planning application decisions in the future, and the village will get a greater proportion of so called Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) funds to spend on projects in the village.
