#### **From Your Parish Council**

Parish Council activities in the last month have included selecting a contractor for the pavilion driveway project, completing bus shelters and bench refresh projects, keeping track of SODC activity associated with STP works and allotments, progressing repair to playground equipment, reviewing planning applications, dealing with ad hoc queries and planning for the forthcoming local elections in May 2019.

#### **Parish Council Projects**

Projects to cost effectively repair, refresh and repaint the two bus shelters and replacement of almost all of the public benches in the village have completed as planned. New football goal nets and fixings and basketball net are also now in place. A contractor has been selected for the pavilion driveway project so in the next few weeks we expect to have – for the first time – the pavilion driveway with high kerbing up the length of driveway and with posts either side that have low level lights built in.

#### **Local Elections - May 2019**



As you'll be aware from recent editions of Moulsford News, the Parish Council is now into the fourth and final year of its term of office. In May 2019 there will be local elections and a new Parish Council will be formed as the current term of office completes and all five current Councillors stand down. If you are thinking of putting something back into the village by standing to be a parish councillor then you'll have the opportunity to quiz some of the current Parish Council at the MEC Winter social on Friday 1<sup>st</sup> March. The village will need a minimum (quorum) of three candidates to register but ideally five or more so that voting takes place. Nominations to stand as a Parish Councillor will need to be completed within quite a short time period, sometime during week the beginning 18th March - when the notice of election is issued by SODC - up until the 4pm deadline on Wednesday 3rd

April. Submissions must then be **hand delivered** to the SODC offices at 135 Eastern Avenue, Milton Park, Milton, OX14 4SB. If there are less than three valid nominations received by 3<sup>rd</sup> April 2019 another election will have to be run in Moulsford – costing the village <u>another</u> £1,500 (approximately). If after this second election there were still less than three valid nominations then we would lose the Parish Council and control would pass to SODC. Clearly

we don't wish for either of these situations to happen as it is the people of this village that are best placed to represent our particular interests but unless we do have at least three new prospective councillors coming forward, it will happen. More details on how to get nominated will be in April Moulsford News but very simply, you must be a British, Commonwealth or other European Union Citizen and not require leave to enter or remain in the United Kingdom or have indefinite leave to remain. You must also be 18 years old or older.

#### **Underhill - Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) Works**

The latest update from SODC is that that the wording of the license with OCC for the connection of effluent from the proposed plant to the highway sewer has now been agreed. There is however still work to be completed on other property related agreements that need to be finalised before SODC can go out to tender. Initial internal checks have been completed by SODC procurement and contracts officers and documentation has been sent back to their partner Capita for compilation. It should therefore be a relatively straightforward process to finalise tender documentation once legal and property agreements have been confirmed. Potential start date remains late summer / early autumn 2019 and more likely later. Parish Council will continue to monitor and seek updates from SODC.

From the Vicar Andrew Petit

My dear friends,

It's been a great delight to have some of the Cranford House senior school students in Moulsford Church recently for a short service at which I was asked to talk about the meaning of Lent.

For most people, mention Lent and they immediately think about things that they might try and give up - either because they think this might impress God, or more likely because they think it could be good for them. Sometimes it is good for us to give up something for a period, like alcohol or smoking or meat, especially if we think it has got a bit of a hold over us. If Lent provides you with the incentive to do that, then that's great, but don't think for a moment that this will impress God or for that matter that it is what Lent is really all about. God loves us unconditionally and in any event Jesus himself said that God is more interested in what comes out of our mouth (i.e. our words expressing the thoughts of our hearts) than what goes into them!

The origin of Lent dates back to the days of the early church when new Christian converts were baptised at a sunrise service on Easter morning. What better day for someone to celebrate their new life as a follower of Christ than Easter Sunday, when we celebrate the new resurrection life of Christ, having conquered death. Such candidates for baptism would of course have a period of preparation, to ensure that they understood the message of Jesus and what it meant to be his follower. Sometimes this would take as long as 3 years! Many years later when Christianity became the official religion of the Roman empire in AD 380, huge numbers of people wanted to be baptised. Because of these huge numbers, the period of preparation was reduced to the 6 weeks leading up to Easter – probably recalling that Jesus himself had spent 40 days and 40 nights in the desert in order to prepare for his public ministry.

Later still, Christians would renew their baptismal vows every Easter – something that still happens in many churches, including our own cathedral in Christchurch, Oxford at the Easter vigil service on Easter eve. The 6 week period that we now call Lent (from the Old English word *Lencte*, which simply means *Spring*) was kept as period of preparation for renewing their baptismal vows. These vows are to turn away from sin and a self-centred life to a life that is centred on following Christ as Lord and Saviour and as the way, the truth and the life.

So, the purpose of Lent is not so much about giving up things, as taking the time to draw closer to God and deepen our understanding of the Christian faith. There are all sorts of ways in which we might try to do this: spending more time talking to God in prayer, reading the gospels and the rest of the New Testament – maybe with the help of some daily Bible reading notes, coming to church, or reading one of the many excellent Lent books which are

available. If you would like to explore any of these ways, please get in touch. One thing you might like to consider is our short informal and reflective service of Holy Communion that we hold at 8.30am on Wednesdays throughout Lent (i.e. from Ash Wednesday, 6<sup>th</sup> March onwards). The service itself finishes at 9am but breakfast is available for those who can stay on.

# **Westminster Update**





Highways England and the Secretary of State for Transport have been examining options for the location of the new **Oxford-Cambridge Expressway**, and have narrowed it down to one broad corridor. Within this, there are up to one hundred specific routes the road could take. Highways England will be engaging with communities and local organisations along the corridor throughout 2019 and 2020 before announcing their preferred route in Autumn 2020.

There is also an opportunity here to include the A420 in the plans, which would take the route to the West of Oxford and add connectivity to Swindon, a considerable bonus. I also hope that this road can help relieve pressure on the A34, which is not currently fit for purpose and badly needs better infrastructure to support it.

I've no doubt that like me many of you were shocked and surprised to see an article in the 6<sup>th</sup> February edition of the Herald titled 'Oxfordshire physiotherapy private contract fiasco exposed in full.' I have been trying for some time to lead efforts to coordinate between the different health care managers and providers, hosting roundtable meetings and leading discussions on how to move forward in providing the correct services that residents require. Therefore I'll continue to lobby hard locally and in Parliament for better healthcare. I am meeting Ministers in the Department of Health and Social care to discuss these important issues and will continue to engage locally as well.

#### **Constituency Visits**

It was a great pleasure to plant a tree as part of the Woodlands Trust Commonwealth Canopy Project at the Sylva Foundation and receive a tour of their fantastic establishment. I've also met recently with a delegation from local

parish councils to discuss improvements to the A420, and attended a working session of 'Didcot First' at Milton Park to hear updates about the local economy, businesses and community actions.

SODC has just introduced a new cooking oil recycling service for residents as part of food waste collections.

After cooking and once it has cooled, any leftover oil can be poured into a plastic bottle no bigger than one litre in size. The bottle and its contents can then be placed into the kerbside food waste caddy, along with other food waste, and put out for the weekly collection. For those who don't want to use a plastic bottle, oil can also be poured straight into the caddy along with other food waste.

One litre of cooking oil can generate enough electricity to make 240 cups of tea!


