

The WI display is for 2 craft items of different media displayed on a 16" front facing square board, a backboard must be attached and be no more than 20" high. Also, that there are Regional differences throughout the UK, as well as between English speaking countries, e.g. USA. She also explained that

facial expressions and body language were an integral part of BSL. Members were given a printed sheet with the sign for each letter of the alphabet and, after practising each letter, they signed their first names for Mandy to "read". This was followed by them all learning how to sign the colours of the rainbow and, after a practice signing "I Can Sing a Rainbow", it was great fun and they were left with a much better understanding of communicating with those who are deaf.


