



Neighbourhood Priorities

Our main priorities will be to continue to tackle burglaries, which is one of the most serious offences we see on our area and will continue to hold a high priority.

During the few Parish Assemblies I went too once again speeding and parking issues were mentioned. From a policing perspective regards parking unless a vehicle is dangerously obstructing a highway there is little to nothing we can do, people parking on pavements etc. is down to civil traffic/parking officers from the local council so you should request a visit from them during what you believe to be peak times. A few people have enquired about changing speeding limits, again this is a highways process so please use the correct channels in starting that process. Please continue to report speeding issues via 101 online and we will continue to assess areas that have mentioned a lot of speeding as we may be used as extra evidence towards having speeding changes put in place, I don't want you to be put off reporting incidents to us.

Less of a neighbourhood priority per se but 101's poor service has also been mentioned, I know it is a high priority for PCC Donna Jones so should be seeing some improvements but please comment via the Constabulary website if you have a particularly bad experience so they understand more the problems they face.



Crime & Crime Prevention



Please bear in mind that these statistics cover the whole of the Test Valley Rural North including over 50 villages & hamlets so they may seem inflated but this is not the case.

ASB = Anti-Social Behaviour

RTI/RTC = Road Traffic Incident/Collision

TFMV = Theft from Motor Vehicle

On the face of it another relatively 'quiet' month in terms of crime, I've noticed most of the statistics above have dropped again since last month so a very welcomed downward trend for most crimes.

Increase in Drug offences from 0 to 5 incidents. I have looked into all these and they are all cannabis being seized from late night smokers in car parks etc. In a way this shows a good increase in patrolling these areas and we are catching more people in the act per se and enforcing the law.

As mentioned previously try and step up security especially those who use oil as an energy source, with the soaring prices we may see a correlation in theft of this commodity. I've seen plenty of oil tanks on show and plan to start stopping and offer advice to those. Keep the tanks covered and install alarms. Just in general it may a good idea whilst doing the spring cleaning to have a good thorough security check to see what can be upgraded. Side gates, CCTV, alarms, security lights, 'defensive' planting (planting of thorn style bushes to deter criminals from fences etc.). If you know someone who is vulnerable and could do with some external help check out the Blue Lamp Trust above in the contacts list.
