THE HYGIENE BANK

The Hygiene Bank (THB) is a grassroots, people-powered charity that started in 2018. The idea formed in response to the injustice that people may be unable to participate fully in society due to hygiene poverty.

People in poverty find themselves having to choose between heating their home, paying rent, buying food or keeping clean. Hygiene poverty can be shaming, humiliating and excluding and can result in social isolation. I have been volunteering for THB for 3 years now and collect and distribute donated hygiene products to a number of community partners locally, including schools, youth clubs, food banks, women's refuges and other charitable organisations.

Need is greater than ever recently, so please do think whether you are able to donate. Simple basics are most useful - shampoo, conditioner, body wash, antiperspirants, toothpaste and toothbrushes, sanitary products. Maybe take advantage of the 'buy 2, get 1 free' sort of offers and donate the 3rd. I have a collection box located at the Village Hall in Mentmore, which can be accessed at weekends and Bank Holidays when the second-hand books are on sale. The Parish Council has secured a grant, from the Ivinghoe and Wing Community Board, to plant three trees to commemorate the Coronation of King Charles III. These trees will be planted in Crafton, we'll know more about the variety once they've been chosen.

We know that speed through our villages is a major concern for many of our residents. The Parish Council is continuously assessing ways to help slow passing traffic. Alongside our Speed Indicator Devices (SIDs), we're pleased to announce the installation of white wooden gates at the entrances to Mentmore, Crafton and Ledburn. Research suggests that on seeing these gates and welcome signs, drivers consider that they are moving from a high-speed country lane into a residential setting and adjust their speed. They also make for a pretty addition to the village landscape. Installation is planned for late summer 2023.

NEWS FROM ST. MARY'S CHURCH



Birds of a feather flock together; that English saying about sticking with those who are just like us. The saying came to mind because the Church has just celebrated the festival of Pentecost. Pentecost means fifty; it came fifty days after the first Easter and the risen Christ kept his promise to send his followers the Holy Spirit. Jesus' followers were gathered in Jerusalem as were people from across the then known world. The Holy Spirit came upon

Jesus' followers and they began proclaiming the Gospel of Christ to all around them. There were many different languages spoken amongst those in Jerusalem, but each could hear Jesus' followers in their own, native, language. It was the miracle of Pentecost and why it holds a special place in the church year. It is recorded in Acts chapter two.

The message of Pentecost is that the Gospel of Christ is for the whole world which included us here – we should never forget that Christianity did not begin on our shores, but came later. In the sixth century Pope Gregory sent one Augustine to tell us about Jesus only to find that the story was known already via Celtic Christianity, probably from the second century. And here's the thing, Celtic Christianity began without any formal church structures; no clergy, no synods. The Holy Spirit was out and about.

Pentecost also contains a challenge and quite a subversive challenge at that. As we know, no language translates exactly into another and that's because language, words, are shorthand for ideas, emotions, principles. All of which are culturally based. That may therefore mean that the language of "those people over there" may give them a richer appreciation of some aspect of life, including faith, than our language gives us — whoever "us" happens to be. And therein lies the subversive challenge of Pentecost. The Gospel is not to be owned by one particular group and as Acts unfolds, Paul writes "I now know that God shows no partiality".

In the 1980s there was a sit-com called Birds of a Feather which starred Linda Robson and Pauline Quirk. Two sisters, the irony was that they were completely different. In today's social media world with its many opportunities to register our "likes", Pentecost calls us beyond that, whoever we are, to ascribe greatness to the Lord, our God. Or, in phonetic Urdu, khudar harani chattan caro-y-bayan.
