The meeting commenced at 7:30pm

1. Apologies for Absence: County Cllr. D Humphries (DH), County Cllr. M. Humphries (MH)

2. Police Items - Sgt. Skelsey - wouldn't be able to pass on details of traveller movements to the parish council.

3. Open Forum- Parishioners of Newton Regis, Seckington and No Man's Heath Parish are invited to address the council on any relevant matter for a maximum of three minutes per person.

- a) Mr Arnold reported intermittent flooding on the corner of the No Man's Heath to Austrey lane. The ditch has been cleaned, but water can't get under the road. Mr Arnold has reported to WCC. On list but not yet done. DW will contact Mike Newham.
- b) Mr Walsh thanked the PC for helping facilitate the payment from Cameron Homes to fund News and Views. 250 magazines across the 3 villages. 1 Sept and 1 December. Have put in article asking for responses about facilities residents would like to see at the playing field and any other suitable locations. Speeding this is a problem in all 3 villages. Lount has new road markings on the entrance to the village. Mr Arnold requested that PC look at the style of these markings and pursue the installation of something similar at the entrances to Newton Regis. DW also suggested Mr Walsh contacts Highways as a resident. Parish Council will look at the markings at Lount and will also contact MH for suggestions/funding.
- c) Mr Powell has requested NWBC send a road sweeper through Church Lane, Seckington, something that had not happened. Mr Powell contacted NWBC about the smell from the drains again with no response but Mike Newham from County Highways attended and did not find a problem. Mr Powell is unhappy with the resolution. Gulley emptying PC to check who is the appropriate Authority to approach. DW

9. Village Issues

a) Newton Regis

- DC reported that the footpath from Kings Lane to Hames Lane is covered in dog mess. All agreed that a reminder sign sign is needed. DW will look for the Seckington Lane sign, if not will get a new warning sign printed and install near the problem area.
- ii) At bottom of Hames Lane, highways have cut half of it where it is a green lane, but footpaths have not cut their part. **DW** to report to County Footpaths. **DW**
- Damaged post near duckpond has been damaged again. Cameron Homes have agreed to help with costs of improving the fenced area. **DW** will ask Highways to repair the post if the Cameron option is **DW** unsuccessful.

iv) DW has found a contact at Bowls Club and the Tennis club.

b) Seckington - nothing current to report.

c) No Man's Heath - Salt St. - no progress. GH to find out where large concrete blocks can be sourced from. DW to find a contact at HS2.

10. Playing Field

a) Electrical problems with the tractor. Still able to use, but will leave repairs until winter season.

11. Playing Field Security

After talking to the head of the Junior Cricket Club, who is also a Police Inspector, advises that he has found that the most effective way to deter travellers from entering a carpark is to install a height barrier but to be aware that **DW** no solution is 100% proof. **DW** to find prices.

12. Speed Aware

DC reported that PC Simon Ackroyd has said that the site outside no. 10 Main Road can be used but that by the duckpond can't. DW checked on Google Earth and the opposite appeared to be the case. DC to contact PC Ackroyd to come back and confirm the correct site to use.

Duckpond -** Cameron Homes Health and Safety policy and insurance would not allow them to complete work off their site, so they will not be able to use their equipment to clean out the duckpond. There are 3 stages. - remove the fish, then the water, then clean out the bottom. Need to find a place to keep the fish tanks for over a week. Work will go ahead this year.
