## **Parish Council Report**

In the middle of May, MPC received exciting news from SODC and Vale of White Horse that Moulsford's application to participate in a pilot scheme for Local Placemaking Plans has been successful. This initiative is described as a national pilot for a new, simpler approach to neighbourhood planning; we are one of four community groups selected in the South Oxfordshire area. After our introduction to the project we will be in a position to set up a working group which will be chaired by ClIr Sue Powell with at least one other member from MPC, other members we will co-opt from our community.

Also in May, we held our Annual Parish Council Meeting which, for this council, marks the start of our final year. The Annual Parish Meeting of Electors (APM), the first in person since 2019 and the first with digital presentations was held towards the end of the month. With a mixed agenda of parish council plans to see out our term and a variety of community interests, (this meeting had not taken place at time of writing) hopefully well received by those attending. We are interested in making the most of the APM so would welcome your constructive ideas, please email them to the clerk: parishclerk@moulsford-pc.org.

Finally, we are sorry to be reporting that our clerk, Geoff Twibell, has handed in his resignation and will be leaving us at the end of June.

When this council started back in 2019, Geoff came with glowing references from the previous council; unbelievably he has more than met our expectations. Geoff's boots are going to take some filling, not just for his understanding of council procedures but also his encyclopaedic local knowledge. He'll be sorely missed.

We hope to hold interviews for the post in late September which should mean we will have a new vicar at the beginning of 2023.

#### Watercress Painters

The Ewelme Watercress Painters will be playing their part in the upcoming Festival of Ewelme over the Jubilee weekend, 2-5 June 2022 with an exhibition along the theme 'What Ewelme means to me' with artworks depicting various aspects of this historic South Oxfordshire village as well as other paintings and arts and crafts by Ewelme villagers.

Also featured will be the delayed unveiling of their huge composite of David Hockney's Spring Tunnel consisting of 12 x A3 parts of this painting in different media. This started as an idea in 2019 when



members brought along copies of paintings which they each felt a passion for and a vote was held. The winner turned out to be one of David Hockney's depictions of the Yorkshire Wolds – the joyful Spring Tunnel celebrating Spring in all its glory. He completed large canvasses of the same scene in winter, spring, summer and autumn and each was shown at his exhibition 'A Bigger Picture' held at the Royal Academy in 2012. We can't say that it will sell for £20.3 million as per the sum paid a couple of years ago for his wonderful painting 'The Splash' but it will hopefully bring some joy!

The exhibition will be held in the beautiful village church of St Mary's, Parsons Lane, OX10 6HS, on Friday, 3rd - Sunday, 5th June from 10-4. #### **Gardening diary**

Hello! This month I have filled up my bed by planting some more plants into it, including my dahlias and salvias. First we had to make sure that they were hardy enough to live outside in the allotment. We took them on "day trips" outside, and then started to leave them in the greenhouse at night.

The first time the peppers and tomatoes were outside during the night it was really cold. My dad made this really cool radiator by getting a candle, putting it on the ground and putting the baking tray above it using some bricks.

I also potted on some stocks and thinned our nicotina.

I don't know if you remember, but last year I took some cuttings of rosemary and sage. They have been coming on very nicely and we have sold a few at a car boot sale, along with some oregano, some peppers and chillies which we planted this year and some mint. I am hoping to sell some more outside my house soon as well, so if you want any plants then be sure to wander round and buy some. All the profits will go to PLAN INTERNATIONAL who are helping Ukrainian refugees.

#### Challenge

If you buy plants from garden centers, always keep the plastic pots which they come in! It's tempting to throw these away to not have too much stuff lying around, but they are very useful for future garden projects, for example when taking cuttings or sowing seeds.

#### **Gardening Tip**

You can grow spring onions from old spring onions. All you have to do is cut off roughly 5 cm off the bottom of the spring onion and soak it in water until the roots start growing. This is normally a week to ten days. Then you just plant it up.

- 1. Achillea millefolium is the latin name for yarrow.
- 2. The venus flytrap is in the family Droseraceae.
- 3. Larch, dawn redwood and bald cypress all drop their needles regularly.

BONUS: Horse chestnuts (conkers) will give you a stomach ache if you eat them but sweet chestnuts are definitely edible. They are often roasted.




