What with the recent lockdowns and the uncertainty about availability of our Printer, it has not been possible to maintain the monthly publication of Village Voice. Accordingly there was no November edition to continue the series of updates about local infrastructure developments.

However, to make sure everyone is kept aware of the latest position I include the following update:

SO, WHAT IS HAPPENING ABOUT FIBRE BROADBAND?

The contractual date for network completion is, apparently, in May. Openreach were comfortably within schedule but there have since been a couple of setbacks. Firstly, it was found that existing ducting down the side of Acol Hill, which it was hoped to reuse for the new fibre, had been broken-into by tree roots and cannot be used. An alternative approach routing new ducting along Manston Road and

down Margate Hill has now been agreed upon and we were advised that the "contractual" completion date should still be achieved. However, a second problem is that Openreach are unable to use an existing telegraph pole in the centre of the village, as they had planned, because it is becoming unsafe and due for replacement at some time next year. So far, no alternative has been agreed upon, and network provision to the south of the village - that most in need - could therefore be delayed.

The project is clearly running over budget and, although we had enough households signed-up to the Broadband Voucher scheme to cover our Community's share of the original network cost, any further voucher commitments would be welcome. Please contact Richard or Karen if you haven't yet signed-up but would like to. I will continue to provide any updates as, and when, I get them.
