20.56 Chairman Welcome and Announcements

The Chairman welcomed everyone to the meeting

20.57 Apologies

None as all Councillors were present

20.58 Disclosable Pecuniary Interests

20.59 Dispensation

There were none at this time

20.60 Report from Shropshire Councillor

There was none at this time

20.61 Public Participation Session

PSCO Jacqui Fletcher reported that there had been notifications of suspicious vehicles in the Parish but otherwise things had been quiet. She is contact with the Highways Department and will raise the issue of safety in relation to the condition of the roads in and out of the village.

20.62 Minutes

It was proposed, seconded and resolved to approve and sign the minutes dated 13th January 2020

20.63 Matters Arising

The Chairman noted that on the matter raised of discharge of water from Hall Cottage (minute 20.48) a letter had been send to the owner, and in the reply received it was advised that when the cellar pump was set up, guidance was sought and that some discharge onto the highway was acceptable. This matter is now being taken up with Shropshire Council.

Online banking has been successfully set up, although the Parish Clerk has advised that a change of address notification will be need to be set up and that this will require another bank form.

20.64 Highways

20.64.1 Condition of the roads

The Chairman, Cllr Martyn Bidgood, said that there had been nothing had been done since the last meeting, and that there had been little response. He was not satisfied with the response from Highways that significant repairs had been done on Grindle Road as it remained in poor condition. He noted that numerous residents had reported the condition of the roads on the 'My Shropshire App'.

There was some discussion on the condition of the roads, particularly concern that there is only one serviceable road in and out of the village. Evelith Lane remains in a poor state and is a concern for those who have no choice but to use it. Concern was also expressed at the safety issue of the condition of the roads particularly as more people are using them for walking and cycling. It was also noted that a fly-tipping incident had blocked Field Lane on one occasion.

It was requested that the Parish Clerk re-contact Shropshire Highways to highlight the concerns expressed.

Cllr Mark Lea raised an issue with a drain overflowing onto the highway that is causing erosion and that he is awaiting a reply to the case he has raised with Shropshire Council. It was requested that the Parish Clerk chase up a response.

20.64.2 Kemberton Junction

The proposals for the box junction is to change the speed limit to 50mph, this is out for consultation until 17th March.

It was proposed, seconded, and **agreed**, that the formal response of the Parish Council is that the speed limit should be lowered to 40mph.

20.64.3 Any other Highway matters

Cllr Mark Lea reported that the drain on Greens Lane in still gushing out.

20.69 Environment

Treeworks: Concern has been expressed by residents about tree works that have been undertaken in Grooms Lane and Hall Meadows and if authorisation had been sought for the works.

The Chairman, Cllr Martyn Bidgood, advised that this matter was being dealt with by Shropshire Council, and that a tree officer had been notified and had visited the site. The West Mercia Police wildlife officer has also visited the site.

Cllr James Rennison said that there were two issues: potential damage and the precedent about the need to obtain the necessary permission. Cllr Mark Lea commented that there was a legal obligation to ask permission before carrying out site clearance as there would be with any other development work. He also detailed past Historical Heritage guidance on the site as having significance in its pattern of medieval rows and furrows.

The Chairman, Cllr Martyn Bidgood, said that public concerns had been followed up and that as there is no official response at this time, it was therefore requested that the Parish Clerk ask for details when the investigation is concluded.

Footpaths: The footpath is blocked again by Kemberton Mill.

Wildlife Crime: Cllr Mark Lea has spoken to the West Mercia Police wildlife officer about alleged incidents of hare coursing
