### PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

Bonfire night was a great success so a big thank you to the Village Hall Committee and especially Tony for all his efforts, much needed funds were raised and a good time was had by all. The annual autumn tidy up of the church and church yard before Remembrance Sunday was well attended as was the service on Sunday. Thank you to all those who helped clear the roads and paths and for the general tidy up after the freak storm at the end of October. We also owe a huge thank you to Jody Reekie as she has been single-handedly inspecting the play area and emptying the bins for over 18 months and we are looking into better signage and bin provision along with a rota to spread the load. The WIPC past and present would like to thank Martin for providing IT support and technical expertise, completely free of charge, for the past 20 years! and he has decided to take a well-earned rest from idiotic queries from PC's (particularly the Chair). Graham Woods has kindly offered to step into Martin's shoes but if anyone can help with the IT please contact Graham. Let's all look forward to an enjoyable Christmas (fingers crossed it stays Covid-free) and remember there is still a vacancy on the PC, so if you are interested please email our Clerk at [clerk@westilsley.org](mailto:clerk@westilsley.org) or alternatively have a chat with one of the Councillors. ### DRAINAGE UPDATE

Measures taken by the Parish Council to alleviate flooding in general in the village and reduce sewage discharges on to Main Street have recently been implemented with the cooperation and financial support of West Berkshire Council and two large projects have been undertaken. The first is the construction of several large one cubic meter soakaways with associated grips up the Catmore Road; these are to reduce the volume of water coming down into the pond and with the excavation of an extended ditch from the pond up the road to take the remaining water readily into the pond. Silt samples have been taken from the pond and laboratory analysis has been conducted. The silt is free of pollutants and is cleared for disposal on to agricultural land. The second project is the excavation of the silt from the pond, hopefully weather permitting, work can now commence and we are awaiting a convenient time for the contractor to start. It is estimated that there will be more than 100 tons of silt to be removed. The bund at the rear of the pond will also be repaired and heightened to ensure water is retained in the pond and not discharged into the paddock behind. In addition, to reduce silt entering the pond from the Farnborough end of the

village, two silt sumps will be constructed either side of the entrance to the recreation ground opposite The Harrow. The flood alleviation scheme around the Village Hall is now complete and this will divert any flood water from the rising water table underground thus hopefully safeguarding the work carried out by the Village Hall Committee in constructing the new suspended and insulated floor and walls. Other flood related work organised by the Parish Council has been undertaken following lobbying at the Pang Valley Flood Forum, of which West Ilsley Parish Council is a member, and a CCTV survey has been carried out to almost all of our sewer runs to ascertain if there are any breaches in its construction, where at times of the water table rising allow water ingress into the sewer system and forces sewage out onto the gardens and the road. The survey identified areas around West Ilsley House requiring clearing of blockages, but generally the sewer system is sound. And finally, the numerous soakaway chambers up the length of Bury Lane have been inspected for capacity and were found to be sound and all the road drainage sumps have been cleared, again to reduce the amount of water coming down Bury Lane and on to Main Street.

- Have, for the previous 12 months, had your principal or only place of work within the parish.
- Have resided in, or within 3 miles of, the parish during the previous 12 months.

In total the night raised a total of £1,680 after all expenses. This will go to making further improvements to the Village Hall.


