#### Speedwatch

Speedwatch is still struggling to get enough active members on the system. We now have a scheme registered with the police but can't use it until we have enough volunteers. The volunteers will need to pass a simple online test to be registered. Without the right numbers the scheme will not be able to operate, which means we cannot monitor speeding traffic through the village.



## Easy Banana cake

If you're like me and find your bananas are a bit over ripe it's time to think banana cake - if I can make this I'm sure anyone can.

☐ 12oz golden granulated sugar

☐ 4 eggs

☐ 4 ripe bananas - chopped

☐ 16oz self raising flour - sifted

☐ 50ml Marsala wine (optional)

#### Method

Beat the sugar and butter until soft a creamy Beat in eggs

Add flour and mix in gently

Add chopped bananas and mix gently

Add Marsala wine and mix gently

Line a 9" cake tin with greaseproof paper and then fill the tin with your mixture.

Pop cake into preheated oven at 130°C

Cake is ready when you can insert a skewer into the middle and it comes out clean.

## This month Charlotte is reading


