Cllr McFarlane proposed that the Administration Costs were reduced by £250. This was				
agreed.				
A discussion was held about the recreation ground car park fencing and gate under Major				
Projects. It was agreed that it was unlikely that this would be done in the next 12				
months. However, a new path would need to be made to the pavilion and some posts				
around the car park would need to be changed. It was agreed to reduce the amount				
under Major Projects by £2,000.				
Cllr Saint said that there was a meeting with Yeovil Without and Brympton parishes and				
Somerset Council on 2 <sup>nd</sup> February to discuss the Parish Lengthsman Scheme. It was				
agreed not to change the amount in the budget for the lengthsman.
