Fund raising

All profits made by village events normally go back into village projects. For example, money raised from the 2021 Christmas gala is being used to purchase a new bench near the Pavilion which is slightly higher than normal (and hence suitable for those with hip replacements, etc.), and also to carry out running repairs to other benches. Any residual will be channeled to our new Jubilee Tree Avenue.

Parish Council Report

Rec Project

The end of March saw Moulsford's recreation ground project move forward into the initial tree planting. It has taken time, consultation, preparation and more than a little hard work to get here and we are now seeing the green shoots (sorry – couldn't resist it!) of the project! Our thanks to the rec committee, particularly Cllr Jo Baker and to Peter Greathead for getting things started.

There's more detail from Jo elsewhere in Moulsford News explaining the tree planting and how it ties into the Queen's Green Canopy scheme marking the jubilee. There's also something on what more is planned for the rec in future.

Neighbourhood Planning

SODC advised us of a pilot scheme for local place-making plans, a simpler, more cost-effective approach to neighbourhood planning. Neighbourhood plans give local councils much more of a say on developments in their area.

SODC has invited applications from parish councils who do not currently have a neighbourhood plan, and MPC is applying for a place on the initial pilot trial. However, we expect a lot of competition as the scheme is restricted and other councils will be applying too. If we are successful, it will require a lot of work over a 12-month period and we will be looking for volunteers to help.

Traffic and Parking

Traffic and parking in Moulsford are increasingly causing problems. But when complaints are only being made to those seen as responsible, we don't get to see the overall scale of the issue. To this end we have created a dedicated email address solely for traffic and parking issues. We ask parishioners to also send to us the basic details every time they make a complaint. The address to use is trafficandparking@moulsford-pc.org.uk.

In this way we can refer as appropriate, and more importantly catalogue all the issues. We can then use the collected data to help frame our own plans, and importantly make planning objections in the future when these are likely to impact traffic and/or parking.

Recreation Ground Update

Moulsford's Trees for the Platinum Jubilee: a new feature avenue on the Recreation Ground

As readers will probably know, we were granted a collection of trees for planting on the Rec which will help revitalise its woodland areas, but will also form part of the Queen's Green Canopy commemorating this special Platinum Jubilee year. With the delay in the tree planting, plus the wonderful fundraising from the Moulsford Events Committee together with a donation received previously from Cranford House School towards the Rec project, we realised we had an opportunity to add something extra special to the Rec over and above the Woodland Trust's donated trees. (We should also mention here that this will only use part of the funds raised by the MEC; we are also planning as previously mentioned to enhance the Rec's array of benches).



Some young village saplings (and their dog) showing the approximate line of the proposed avenue along the northern side of the Rec. Vehicle and footpath access to the Rec will not be impeded and the first tree will be at an appropriate safe distance from the Pavilion.

The loss of the grand horse chestnuts along the northern boundary of the Rec was keenly felt by many villagers and affected both the character of the Rec and its wildlife habitats. While a new generation of young horse chestnuts are growing on, discussions last year between the Rec Working Group, Parish Council and ASA Landscape Architects identified the boundary as somewhere we could potentially plant new feature trees to bring back some of that lost grandeur in the long term. To this end, the PC have liaised with Peter Greathead to source seven native limes, one for each decade of Her Majesty's reign, to plant, forming a Jubilee avenue along the northern side of the Rec.

We have chosen limes for several reasons. Apart from being a traditional favourite for avenue planting due to their stately character, limes have great wildlife value year round, plus have the useful advantage of their height being readily manageable over time if needed. They are also known to do very well in our parish; explorers of the village may already know at least two individual village lime trees that have been recognised with Tree Protection Orders for their value to our local environment.

We hope to welcome these splendid new trees to the Rec as soon as possible.

Church Chatter

I am sure Ukraine has been upper most in the minds of many people over the past month. It was good to hear that £200 had been donated at the two recent Events Committee gatherings and many others have donated via the D.E.F. If you are out and about in the village do pop into church and spend a few minutes quietly at our Ukraine prayer corner. Alternatively why not sit peacefully in the churchyard soaking up the spring flowers, a blaze of defiant daffodils, and the uplifting birdsong as they herald once again this wonderful season of Spring. As we acknowledge God's gifts to us, not least our freedom and the opportunity to live peaceful, for so many people life will continue to be a struggle as they face the harsh reality of the lack of resources for food, heating or both.

On 9th April we plan to do a grand Spring clean of the interior of the church as part of the preparations for Easter. It would be great if you were able to join us for an hour or so- many hands make light work - and refreshments will be available. So Easter will shortly be here and we will love to welcome you, young and older, as we celebrate the Resurrection of Christ along with Easter eggs, bird's nest cakes and joyful singing. This year we hope to have some new banners made by a small group of keen seamstresses, decorating the village church.

Looking ahead, at the end of May we will be celebrating the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. We would like to invite all our young children to help. We would like to create a Flower festival with a difference. So we need your help! We are proposing that you fill a jam jar with garden or wild flowers, greenery or twigs so that we can place your decorations around the church for this special Jubilee weekend. We hope during your Easter school holidays you can begin to think about how and what you might choose to fill your jam jar and we will look forward to seeing these exciting decorations at the Jubilee. Thank you for your help.





Gardening diary

Hi guys! This month I have been doing lots of stuff. We ordered some plants and what we really had wanted to order was 6 big salvias but they accidentally sent us 24 micro plugs (really mini salvias in tiny pots). We repotted **GARDENER** them straight away into much bigger pots and guess what we did then: Yen we water this expect to have so many small ones, we weren't

complaining, because now, only three weeks later, our salvias are just as big as the ones we had wanted to order and we have 24 of them for the exact same price and just a few more weeks of care! We put some more soil into the mini pots from the salvias and planted some tomatoes in them. They look really cute but the pots aren't the best for home gardening because they're so small and they dry out really quickly so they need constant attention. I also planted some dahlias in little pots. I got the seeds from the seed swap last month. My sister and I went to badger bank to collect tons of sticks for the epic toad/frog hole that my mum was making. I also helped saw some of the thick sticks so that they fit in the toad/frog hole. We used to have a little wild marjoram in our herb garden but it grew tons and spread a lot until there were lots of wild marjoram plants dotted all over half of the herb garden. I left the 3 bigger plants that were supposed to be there and I dug up the other 9 and put them into smallish pots. Once I'd done that, I watered them (obviously) and left them. Once they've gotten used to their pots, we can find new homes for them. At the weekend, I did the tree planting for the Queen's Jubilee. It was very fun and I planted 4 trees for the hedging by myself. I also helped with 1 big lime tree and 2 trees in the glade. Now onto my quiz!


