Patrick Abrahams of the Frome Men's Shed said, "The German TV crew were from an independent TV producer for German public broadcasting stations ZDF and 3sat. The crew were in Frome for two days spending time at the Frome Medical Centre and the Frome Men's Shed, as well as filming in the town.

"They were filming two documentaries of the same topic, how to tackle loneliness. The 3sat science documentary is 45 minutes long and additionally features more scientific aspects like why are we human beings due to evolution more or less dependent on being member of a group? There are more experts (psychologists, sociologists and evolutionary biologists) involved talking about their



study subject.
