#### Annual Meeting of the Parish

Thank you to all those who joined in at the Annual Meeting of the Parish. The Parish Council members are very grateful for the feedback they received, to represent you effectively we do need your input. We volunteered to serve the community. A special thank you to all the representatives of organisations that hosted tables and shared with our community information about their organisation and provided you with opportunities to participate or provide feedback.

### Waste Bins

Many of you may have noticed some changes with Stanton Harcourt and Sutton's rubbish bins in the past few weeks. This is due to the new policies that have been adopted by West Oxfordshire District Council around municipal waste bins in a bid to 'rationalise' their use. Across the district, the Council has been removing some dog waste bins and general litter bins, provided there is another nearby. Where possible, the removed dog waste bins are being replaced by larger, dual-purpose bins that can take all waste, including bagged dog waste.

The contents of these 'dual' bins will be sent to Ardley Energy Recovery Facility (ERF) in a move that is helping to direct 95% of the country's municipal waste away from landfill. The Parish Council are working closely with the District Council team to review the changes that were made in Our village. We want to ensure bin placement suits our community's needs and highlight any issues, such as a lack of capacity/frequency of emptying in the most heavily used bins. The Parish Council is charged byWODC for the emptying of these bins and for the provision of extra bins, so it is in our interest to have the sufficient bins in the correct positions.

If any residents encounter problems, we urge you to get in touch with us. In particular, we would like residents to let us know of:

Any bins that are not being emptied at all

• Any bins that are being emptied too infrequently (getting too full or smelling unpleasant)

Any locations where an additional bin would be useful

### New Stanton Harcourt Community Hall

As many of you will know by now our village has a new facility that has been gifted to the Parish Council by Hayfield Homes. The Guard Room on the old airfield site will be available to rent very soon at a competitive hourly rate. The facility is fairly small, suitable for seating a max of 30 people, has a small kitchenette and lovely garden. Details about the hall and the hirer rates are on the Stanton Harcourt Parish Council website.

When the facility has not been hired out, you are all welcome to sit in and enjoy the garden, however when the facility has been hired out the garden will be closed to the general public, to give the hirer the full benefit of this asset.

### Village Hall Car Park

A draft specification for the new car park design is being developed, from this specification quotes will be requested to inform funding to cover the cost. If anyone has expertise in tarmac and car park layouts etc, expert comments would be very welcome. Please contact <u>gill@shpc.co.uk</u>

### Village Hall Solar Energy Project Update

The order has been placed with our chosen 'best value' supplier JoJu, a local company. Planning permission has been obtained and the application for the G99 certificate that we need from the electricity board is in progress. It won't be long now before you see scaffolding go up and panels installed. This project is a Village Hall Committee initiative supported by the Parish Council.

#### 20mph proposal

The next stage is to present the proposal to Oxfordshire County Council for a formal consultation which we hope you will support.

#### Changes at the West Oxfordshire Council

The recent election has resulted in a significant change at West Oxfordshire District Council (WODC), with a Conservative majority replaced with a Liberal-Labour-Green coalition. We now have two WODC representatives, one Conservative and one Liberal Democrat; they have informed us they will work together in the best interests of our community.

Introducing The Honourable Raphaël Ambrosius Costeau, gin connoisseur, purveyor of rare crystals, and part time poet. A member of the peafowl family, Raphaël is a rather fabulous blue, or Indian, peacock. His iridescent blue and green plumage set him aside from most birds you find on the British Isles, and he knows it.

Peafowl are forest birds that nest on the ground, but roost in trees. You'll find Raphaël on his country estate, perched atop the highest tower chanting his very distinctive squawk as he leads his daily

meditation classes.

Peacocks are considered to be royal birds, which is no surprise considering their beautiful plumage. The peacock is a prominent feature of the Harcourt family crest, which is why the peacock symbol is found in various places/organisations in the village. Why not pay a visit to the historic church and see how many depictions of the peacock you can find? If you look carefully, you might spot Raphaël practising his Paso Doble or reciting his latest sonnets to his adoring fans.



## Lovely Jubbly! Vegan Lemon Cake

It's cake month in Stanton Harcourt - we hope you're as excited as we are!

We had planned to share the official Jubilee pudding - Lemon Swiss roll and amaretti trifle (winner of the Platinum Pudding competition) which sounds fantastic. Alas, when we looked at the method it was a bit of a faff, plus Sainsbury's are out of lemon Swiss rolls and we didn't want to contribute to a national shortage of the coveted swiss roll. Sometimes it just makes sense to go back to basics...

To coincide with World Environment Day on 5th June we've got the perfect lemon cake recipe for you. Adorn your crown and serve perched atop a velvet cushion with a tasteful scattering of raspberries, edible glitter and dairy free cream for a truly royal experience.

#### Ingredients: (serves 12, or 6 if you really like lemon cake)

100ml vegetable oil, plus extra for the tin

275a self-raising flour 1 tsp baking powder

- 200g golden caster sugar - 1 lemon, zested, 1/2 juiced



- 1/2 lemon, juiced

#### Method:

1. Heat oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6. Oil a 1lb loaf tin and line it with baking parchment. Mix the flour, sugar, baking powder and lemon zest in a bowl. Add the oil, lemon juice and 170ml cold water, then mix until smooth

2. Pour the mixture into the tin. Bake for 30 mins or until a skewer comes out clean. Cool in the tin for 10 mins, then remove and transfer the cake to a wire rack to cool fully.


3. For the icing, sieve the icing sugar into a bowl. Mix in just enough lemon juice to make an icing thick enough to pour over the loaf (if you make the icing too thin, it will just run off the cake).
