  - Number of divisions
  - Division boundaries
  - Names of the divisions
- 10 week consultation that closes on 5<sup>th</sup> November
- Draft to be published by Feb 2019 then more consultations


What is the set up now?




- 20 community areas in Wiltshire – Ours is Amesbury
- Community Area Board in each with 6 councillors for Amesbury Area
- Each councillor looks after an area

# Boundary Review

- Boundaries will change due to changes in population (new houses etc.)
- Distribution of councillors needs to be within 10% variance of average figure of 4264 electors
- Boundaries need to suit the area - rural – urban – identity
- Berwick St James unlikely to be changed
