If you go down to the woods today you're in for a big surprise....

because...Dunton Green now has a wonderful bike trail for young people and families to enjoy in Price's Wood.

Price's Wood, near Pounsley Road, TN13 2XP was gifted to Dunton Green Parish Council to be cared for and maintained for the benefit of the local community.

The woodland, in the main, was left to its own devises prior to this change in ownership. Brambles had overgrown so much they had a strangle hold on the wood, some trees had become unhealthy and therefore a potential risk. The abandoned woodland had become a hot spot for fly tipping and it was mostly used as a dog toilet.

Now, with Dunton Green Parish Council, Sevenoaks District Council and Live Biking (www.livebiking.co.uk) working in partnership, this woodland has been given a new lease of life.

The trees have been taken care of by a specialist. The bramble has been cut back to a border that will now allow light to get to the woodland floor and encourage native flowers to bloom in the spring.

We also cleared off so much rubbish; from glass, dumped paint pots, a tyre, an abandoned wheel barrow and a shopping trolley to name just a few items



and have built in community use in the shape of a bike trail.



Please be aware that we have tried to clear as much glass from the ground as possible but some may remain. Please be vigilant and only adults are to pick it up.



The bike trail sits within the natural environment and is designed to be as in keeping with the woodland as possible. We hope you enjoy it.

We have put together a few points below to help embed this new community asset into the village so everyone is happy:

- Please respect the neighbours
- ♦ Please stay on the trail and always wear a bike helmet
- On not change the trail but leave it as it is for all to enjoy
- ♦ The trail works on a one way basis
- ♦ Respect each other and have fun
- ♦ Please take your litter home
- Dog walkers must please pick up their dog poo
- ♦ There isn't any parking near the wood so please park elsewhere in the village, or better still, come on foot!

No one is permitted to cycle on the public pathway so please keep your wheels in the

wood

PLANNING APPLIC ATIONS

19/01545/HOUSE Sunnydene London Road

Demolition of existing garage; insertion of two first floor flank windows; conversion of loft with rear dormer; addition of three roof lights to front and erection of a single storey rear extension. DGPC - Object. The Parish Council has concerns about the sheer size of the proposed development, particularly in Green Belt. Clarification is required, regarding the full scope of the expansion of this dwelling - both upwards and outwards. The proportion of the proposed increase

appears to be in excess of the permitted percentage increase allowed - the proposed new proportions are significantly larger than the existing dwelling (which may already have been extended from its original footprint). Clarification of the percentage increase permitted in Green Belt and the extent to which this property is proposed to be extended is required. The phrase 'conversion of the loft' does not reflect the full extent of the proposal which is effectively to remove and change the roofline significantly in order to 'convert' the loft space (it is by no means a conventional loft conversion). The Parish Council trusts that SDC's Planning Officers will look carefully at size of the rear extension in relation to the size of the current dwelling and will thoroughly assess the impact on neighbours and the street scene of the proposed raising of the height of the building.

19/01781/CONVAR North Downs Business Park Limepit Lane
Variation of condition 5 of application 19/00110/FUL to demolish existing building and ready-mix concrete plant and erection of warehouse building with amendment to substitute "very good" to "good" BREEAM. *DGPC - Support* 19/01839/HOUSE Renhold London Road

Demolition of existing rear single storey extension and construction of enlarged single storey rear extension. *DGPC - Support* 19/02150/HOUSE 61 London Road

Single storey ground floor extension with rooflights and alterations to fenestration. DGPC - Support 19/02221/HOUSE 30 Kingswood Road

Demolition of existing double storey rear extension. Erection of a double storey and rear extension. Alteration of roof and fenestration. DGPC - Object. LATER NOTE: There had been a misinterpretation of the original application; upon further investigation the Council withdrew its original objection (on the grounds of perceived adverse impact on parking) to the application. 19/02279/HOUSE 33 London Road

Formation of vehicular access. Relocation of steps and retaining wall. DGPC - Support

19/02333/HOUSE 93 London Road

A first floor and rear extension and a loft conversion. Dormer with Juliet balconies and rooflights. DGPC - Support The Parish Council supports the application in principle but is aware of neighbour concerns about the adverse impact in terms of privacy that have been raised in relation to the installation of two balconies rather than windows (which

be more in keeping with neighbouring properties). The Parish Council asks that these concerns be addressed when considering the application's validity.

19/02550/HOUSE 11 Bankside

Part garage conversion & internal alterations. DGPC - Support

19/027137HOUSE Paxtons Pounsley Road

Demolition of conservatory and erection of a single storey rear extension with rooflights. *DGPC - Support* 19/02244/FUL 20 London Road

Demolition of existing outbuildings. Erection of two storey building to form 2 no. 2 bed apartments. 5 no. parking spaces (including crossover). DGPC - Support. The Parish Council notes that concerns raised in relation to an earlier application for this site (18/0282/FUL) regarding lack of parking and the loss of a retail unit have been taken onboard and a more modest development of the site and retention of the retail unit is now proposed. Smaller, more affordable residential properties are desirable in Dunton Green and, in light of the changes to the proposals for this site, the Parish Council supports the application.

19/02426/HOUSE Vacuna Rye Lane

Ground floor single storey side and rear extension with rooflights, removal of chimney and alterations to fenestration with a balcony at the rear on the first floor. DGPC Support Support is given to this application on the proviso that the extension of this property falls within guidelines and does not exceed 50%. The Parish Council would be grateful if SDC could confirm this.

19/02447/FUL (adjoining parish consultation) Fort Halstead Crow Drive Halstead Relocation and re-installation of six explosive magazine stores (Use Class B8) and construction of four surrounding concrete pendine block wall. DGPC - No Comment The Parish Council members did not feel suitably qualified to comment on the merits or otherwise of this application.

19/02254/HOUSE 1 Crescent Cottages Station Road

Single storey rear extension with roof lantern and alterations to fenestration. DGPC - Support, with the following comment: It is noted that a drive/parking area has been created at this property with no dropped kerb and no planning permission for a drive. It appears to be being used by contractors on a development site opposite. The road in this area is especially difficult to navigate being on a bend and close to a roundabout junction and the introduction of a drive should be investigated by KCC and SDC. 19/02244/FUL - AMENDED CONSULTATION 20 London Road

Demolition of existing outbuildings. Erection of two storey building to form 2 no. 2 bed apartments. 5 no. parking spaces (including crossover) 'Amended plan received showing change to the first-floor side window and internal change to bedroom 2 serving existing flat.' DGPC - No Comment. It was resolved that the proposed amendment had no significant impact and that the comments that the Parish Council had previously submitted in relation to this application would suffice.




PARISH COUNCIL News Highlights...

* Great progress has been made this last year with the Parish Council's objective 'to make Dunton Green greener'. Significant improvements in the standard of grounds maintenance have led the way and we have now introduced new hanging basket posts along the length of the village green; have added baskets at the recreation



ground and even have some new planters on the railings at the zebra crossing on Longford Bridge. The baskets will provide year round colour and interest.

- * At time of print, the finishing touches were being made to the new bike trail at Price's Wood. Urgent and necessary maintenance to the trees has almost been completed, the bike trail itself has been created with the help of many willing volunteers, a new entrance to access the wood has been fashioned and signage outlining how the trail should be used is pending. We hope that many of our younger residents and their families will get an opportunity to explore the trail and enjoy the woodland surroundings.
- * There has been a good deal of unauthorised encampment across the Sevenoaks District this year. To help protect our community assets and open spaces ,the Parish Council took steps to install further incursion measures at the recreation ground. The introduction of bollards is intended to prevent unwanted activities and keep the recreation ground a safe place for the residents of Dunton Green to enjoy.
- * At its October meeting, the Parish Council reviewed its donations for 2019/20 to charitable organisations. A number of grants were awarded, including funds to ensure that the Age UK Pop In Café will continue to run in Dunton Green, donations to the new Education in Full Fund and the primary school's PTA, and donations to a number of organisations that have had an impact on residents in Dunton Green. The Parish Council reviews donations each year at its October meeting and any local organisations are encouraged to submit a request that can be considered.
- * The Parish Council continues to work with Southeastern and SDC, to explore further the possibility of a project to provide a mural or 'StreetArt' in the tunnel to the station. Whilst some tentative steps have been taken, it is proving to be difficult to get everyone on board...
- * The Parish Council continues to fully fund the Tuesday football sessions at the recreation ground and the associated holiday sports sessions. See page 37 for details of some sessions scheduled for the Christmas holidays.

Out of disaster, comes a good news story!

The Parish Council was contacted by a new Ryewood resident who, having seen the last edition of Dunton Green News, wanted to share their experience...

There was a car crash at the Riverhead roundabout. I am a Police Officer with the Met and this happened in front of my car (off duty); I got out and had to use my first aid kit on one of the drivers. Luckily for us one of the other drivers who witnessed the crash was a Paramedic on her way to work so by the time Kent Police arrived between us we had it all covered!

One of the things that really struck me was the community spirit. Seconds after the crash people came out from their houses, other drivers stopped and local business owners offered assistance. I believe it was the staff at Franks Barbers who came out with ice cold bottles of water for everyone, which was a relief as it was a very hot day. I had my 2yr old son in my car at the time and although we weren't involved in the crash, I had my car doors open to give him some air. Another driver, who was behind me, left her car and kept my son entertained for the half hour or so whilst we waited for Kent Police and whilst I was away from the car, working on the injured parties.

Both drivers were okay in the end, with the driver of the Mini receiving cuts to his arms from impact and his window breaking. The driver of the white 4x4 was in shock and very concerned as she had her own child in her car.

Kent Police were also great when they arrived and got things moving again quickly.


