(1) Earthwork remains of medieval manorial site; it has 2 elements. The western and largest one only survives in its northern half, but was originally a rectangular enclosure c.130m square. The enclosure is formed by a bank and ditch, the bank 4 ft (1.2m) high and the ditch 16ft (4.8m) wide and 6ft (1.8m) deep below the crest of the bank. In the interior is a sunken area (2), rectangular in shape, probably the site of the manorial buildings. At the NW and NE corners are protruding platforms up to 27ft (8.2m) in diameter. The NE one has stone foundations visible in it. To E is a smaller rectangular, ditched and banked enclosure, c.75m by 80m; its E side has been almost completely obliterated. It is possible that the smaller, eastern earthwork represents an earlier manorial site which was succeeded by the larger western earthwork.

A plan of the earthworks is held in the Moated Sites file on the AHBR shelves.

(1) In a report, apparently derived from a publication contemporary with the discovery of the Bacchus mosaic, a rectangular stone building is described. The building, 85ft (25.9m) long and 50ft (15.2m) wide was built of mortared flint walls which had collapsed inwards covering a chalk floor. On the floor were 2 parallel rows of free stone 21ft (3.96m) apart. The building appears to be some sort of aisled structure, with the mosaic at one end. This structure, however, is not recorded by any other report of the site contemporary with its discovery (e.g. 2) nor was it revealed in 1893 when Rev. Engleheart reexcavated the site (3). Therefore some doubt over the existence of the building must exist.

EVENT AIRFIELD Built Modern - 1941 to 1942

Thruxton Airfield began in construction in 1941 - troops were present from 225 Squadron RAF and Westland Lysanders during the construction process. The airfield officially opened in 1942 and became a base for both British troops from the Royal Airforce and American Troops from United States Army Airforce, the airfield was decommissioned in 1946.

Area 1 of the Airfield contained the largest distribution of buildings and included amongst other buildings Barrack Blocks, the dinner room, officers quarters, flight office and hangers.

EVENT AIRFIELD Built Modern - 1941 to 1942

Thruxton Airfield began in construction in 1941 - troops were present from 225 Squadron RAF and Westland Lysanders during the construction process. The airfield officially opened in 1942 and became a base for both British troops from the Royal Airforce and American Troops from United States Army Airforce, the airfield was decommissioned in 1946.

Large numbers of buildings are associated with this airfield which have been classified into nine seperate areas of buildings.
