Charlton Neighbourhood Plan – Referendum at last!

A Referendum relating to the adoption of the Charlton Neighbourhood Plan will be held on 6 May 2021. A Neighbourhood Development Plan contains policies for the use of land in a designated neighbourhood area. In 2014 Charlton Parish Council decided to produce a Neighbourhood Plan and public consultation has taken place on the draft Neighbourhood Plan. There is a statutory process which must be followed for the making of a Neighbourhood Plan. The process involves the holding of a Referendum. The question, which is specified in the Regulations, which will be asked for the Referendum is:

'Do you want Test Valley Borough Council to use the Neighbourhood Plan for Charlton to help it decide planning applications in the Neighbourhood area?'

If more than half of those voting in the referendum vote 'Yes' in response to the question above then the Neighbourhood Plan must be 'made' (adopted) by Test Valley Borough Council and the Neighbourhood Plan will be part of the Development Plan for the Borough. This means that the Plan will be used in the determination of planning applications for the designated area of Charlton Parish.

Recycling



The Parish Council is actively engaged with TVBC to try and improve recycling opportunities for the village. Tesco has been asked to confirm its recycling policy and facilities. A battery recycling facility is available but it is tucked away by the Post Office counter.

Communications

Thank you for those who completed the online survey or the questionnaire in the spring edition of Charlton News. Not a huge response and so it is difficult to draw firm conclusions. But:

- Confirmed Quarterly Charlton News delivered to households was liked.
- Newsletter is available on Parish Council website and so suggestion that individuals should be able to opt out of paper copy (saves paper). The mechanics of doing this would be considered.
- Some support for moving to a Community website with Parish Council as a page but no volunteer webmaster has yet come forward so this may be difficult.
- A Charlton App had some support and may be looked at further.
- Charlton Chat is useful.
