We'll keep you updated on social special events such the Dog Show and Camping Night and when various catering is on, but of course the BIG ONE will be the Platinum Jubilee weekend in early June, for which we are aiming for a full Village Celebration - get your bunting ready!

Much further ahead on the horizon is Moulsfest in September, food and fun for all... Keep watching your Moulsford News and village social media and we can't wait to see you all again soon!



Your parish council has been kept busy for the last couple of months. Draft minutes of that meeting are already on the village Web site if you wish to take a look.

We learned of suggested changes to neighbourhood planning to make it more accessible to smaller villages like ours. Such plans give communities more of a say on development and potentially give access to the levies developers pay for essential facilities.

After a challenging 2021 social calendar, the council was hugely appreciative of a generous £1,500 donation from the events committee. This money will go towards the refresh of the recreation ground and playground. On that topic see the separate item by project lead Jo Baker.

Hopefully you will have seen the results of the 'big clean' initiative by South Oxfordshire District Council. They are returning to Moulsford in May to continue the work and we'd like to hear of any areas you think warrant attention. Please contact parishclerk@moulsford-pc.org.uk.

The issue of traffic and parking in Willow Court Lane came up again in February. The council plans to hold a liaison meeting soon with Cranford School where we hope to iron out at least some of the difficulties experienced by residents.

Finally the annual parish meeting. There has been no such meeting for the last two years because of Covid. To refresh memories, this is not a meeting of the parish council and is not to discuss council business. Rather it is a meeting of the parish, but organised and run by the council. It's a chance to hear about and discuss wider village matters, social events, village organisations, ongoing projects and the like. The date will be advertised nearer the time, but it will be in May. If you do have any matters to raise with the parish council then please feel free to attend our normal May meeting on Thursday 24th March at 7:30pm, or indeed any meeting before then.

EV Chargers in Wallingford

Engineers were due to begin installing electric chargers at the Cattlemarket car park in Wallingford at the end of February. This is part of the Park and Charge Electric Vehicle charging scheme, which proposes a total of up to 62 new charging points in car parks across the South Oxfordshire district. This will allow residents without off-street parking to park overnight and charge up using a 'fast' 7 – 22kw EV charging point as well as providing much needed battery top-ups to commuters and visitors during the daytime.

Council Tax Rebate

You have probably seen the announcement about the measures the Government is taking to help protect households from rising energy costs. Households in England, which are in council tax bands A-D, will receive a £150 rebate. The rebate to bills will be made by local authorities to households from April directly rather than through the Council Tax system. This will not need to be repaid.

On top of this discount, discretionary funding of £144 million will also be provided to support vulnerable people and individuals on low incomes who do not pay Council Tax, or who pay Council Tax for properties in Bands E-H.

We will be working with Peter Greathead of PWG Tree Surgery to make sure our trees get the best possible start in their new home.

Do come along and join the team to plant our new trees in the woodland areas. You will be able to find out how best to plant a tree; making sure it's not too shallow, not too deep, but just right. Everyone's welcome; anyone can plant a tree, with a little help if needed - and we have plenty to go round!

Refreshments will be available from the Pavilion after 10.30am thanks to our hardworking Events Committee, to make sure our tree-mendous volunteers are well looked after.

For this event, you will need sturdy footwear and gloves and if you can bring your own spade (border size fine), that would be very helpful.

We've heard that some folks might even have some little trees found as self-seedlings in their own gardens that they'd like to release into the wilds of the Recreation Ground for future generations to enjoy. Please do bring your little trees along; we would especially be interested in local natives likely to do best in our soils, but don't worry if you're not sure, we can check the identities for you on the day.

The day's efforts will contribute to the Queen's Green Canopy national tree planting initiative to celebrate Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee. 

Recreation Ground News

A team of volunteers came together on 26th February to carry on the work preparing for March's big tree planting day.

We spread woodchips around under the bigger trees to create some clearings and help protect the trees' roots from compaction. We also started building dead hedging along the boundaries and stacked dead wood piles, all of which will create new habitats and food sources for Rec residents such as hedgehogs and a wide variety of invertebrates. But perhaps the most noticeable change, was that the old cricket net has now been dismantled, ready to be rehomed elsewhere in the village.

A very big thanks to the all volunteers who came along to help!

Gardening diary

Hello!

This month, I have started to plant plants in my bed: onions and broad beans. Onions can be grown from seeds (these are cheaper but need more attention and are slower to grow) or sets (immature bulbs, which are more expensive but grow quicker and are less likely to get diseases). I grew them from sets and here is how I did it - it is really simple! First, I placed them roughly 10 cm apart. Then I pushed them down into the mud with the pointy bit up, until the tip was just peeking out of the soil. I firmed up the soil a bit, watered the soil and that's it!

I placed the broad beans about 20 cm apart, put them on their sides and pushed them 5 cm deep. I covered up the holes, watered them and then they were done too!

The bird feeder blew over and broke in the storm so my sister and my dad fixed it at the weekend.

On Friday at the Pavillion, we brought some seeds to the Seed Swap. There is another Seed Swap next month if you want to come, you can bring the seeds that you don't want and see if there are any new seeds which you don't yet have.

That's it for now, on to the quiz answers.

Answers for the last Quiz

- 1. Love apple is the original name for a tomato!
- 2. Aloe vera has soothing properties for things like burns.
- 3. Deciduous trees are trees which lose their leaves, normally in the autumn.

Challenge

If anyone uses pesticides, why not try not using them? Use mesh nets around brassicas to stop butterflies laying their eggs, or peppermint oil to deter ants, as mentioned in my first article.

Because the pesticides not only kill the slugs, snails and unwanted insects that eat the pesticides, but also harms the birds and hedgehogs that eat them.

Gardening Tip

If you don't already have one, it's a good idea to get a water buttress or big bucket, because it fills up when it rains and then you don't have to use tap water to water your plants.


