- **3.** The minutes of the meeting on 1 October 2013: The minutes were approved and signed as a true record of proceedings. **Proposed: Tim Oliver, seconded: Bill Smyth**
- 4. Matters Arising from 1 October 2013
- **a.** Playground and Skatepark: Ed Smith has returned and filled in the gaps in the rubber matting surface. Bill has been carrying out weekly risk assessment checks and filling in the forms for the Clerk to keep on file. Thank you Bill.

- **b.** Older Person's Housing: Awaiting outcome of Parish plan questionnaire.
- **c.** Footpaths and stiles: Pat has received a letter from Cathy Hill stating that the footpaths in the field behind the school are not being kept in good repair, Pat is to report. Another villager has reported problems on using the footpath from Rock Hill Road through to the donkey sanctuary.

- d. Highways: There is some hedging which has collapsed into the road along New Road between Stone Hill Road and Green Hill Lane. The Clerk is to report to highways. Court Lodge barn the property of John Lumley, there is foliage over-hanging the road, the Clerk is to write and ask if it can be cut back. There is a survey to be carried out for KCC highways, Pat and Tim are to carry out.

- **e. Emergency planning:** The Emergency planning committee have the paper work in place, Peter is to send out electronically.

f. Wheelie bins: Following a request to ABC for another bin for Rob to use for the rubbish he collects while street cleaning, the answer was no. All rubbish generated by people who book the hall should be taken away by those who have booked. The wheelie bins should be used for people who clean the hall or by Rob. It has been suggested that some signs be put on the wheelie bins to make it clear they are not for general public use.

- g. Culverts: Kevin Gore the engineer for highways has been sent plans of the area in question, Peter has been keeping Bob Seaton informed of action taking place. There is water gushing out from a burst pipe in Forstal Road which is damaging the highway. The Clerk is to report.

- **h. Benches:** Bill has asked Anthony Hicks to clean and treat the benches on Elm Close, he will carry out the work in the Spring when the weather improves.
- i. Southern Water: Adrian Catchpole from Southern Water had a meeting with Bill and the Clerk to ascertain what works would be carried out to repair the track from Rock Hill Road to the sewage works. Adrian thought the work could be completed by his work force. He also agreed to send out Southern Water's contractors to manage hedging around sewage works.

- j. Code of Conduct: Following some amendments from ABC the Code of Conduct will be discussed and approved at the December meeting.
- k. Poppies: Bill has purchased the poppy seeds to put onto the bank between the upper rec and the cricket field once Richard Hopkins has roughed up the ground. It was proposed to put poppy seeds on the bank between Elm close and the car park, this was agreed so Bill is to purchase some more seeds and ask Richard to rough up the ground in this area as well.

- **I. Mowing:** Following a meeting with Countrywide Groundworks and Bill a quote has been received which Bill has compared with Heber Horticultural, the company who had the contract before. It was decided that cost wise the parish should continue with Heber.
- m. Solar Farm Pluckley: At the October meeting Peter had mentioned the solar farm at Pluckley, now a letter has been received from Pluckley Parish Council requesting that Egerton back Pluckley in petitioning against the solar farm.

- n. ABC Site Submissions 2013: ABC are preparing a new plan to cover the period to 2030 for homes, business and other facilities. Within Egerton two areas have been put forward but ABC stress it is very important to note that at this stage the council has not made any assessment of the information received. Nothing will happen until assessments have been made and a full consultation is made with Parishes.
