LUSHAYS	SY 49 SW CHIDEOCK NORTH CHIDEOCK 6/102 Lushays - II Single house. Early C19. Rubble-stone walls. Thatch roof with stone gable copings, corbelled. Brick stacks at left and right gables. 2 storeys. 3 windows, 3 light wooden casements. Concrete lintels over. Front door at centre, wood with glass panels, C20.
CHAMPSLAND	SY 49 SW CHIDEOCK NORTH CHIDEOCK 6/101 Champs land - II Single house, late C17. Ashlar lias stone facade. Rubble stone at left hand bay (former Dairy). Thatch roof, hipped at left hand, gabled at right hand. Renewed brick stack at left hand hip and right hand gables. 2 storeys. 3 windows and additional 2 at left hand. Renewed 3-light wooden casements and glazing bars. Wooden cills and lintels. Upper floor windows with small leaded lights. Front door, right of centre, wood with 6 recess panels. Thatched gabled porch with weather-boarded front and carried on 2 wooden posts. Left door, plank with strap-hinges and heavy wood frame. Interior: ceiling beams, mid- chamfered with filleted stops. Large open fireplace with wooden lintel over. Dairy with heavier chamfered beams, with filleted stops. Window shutters throughout with recess-panels.
STONEBRIDGE	SY 49 SW CHIDEOCK NORTH CHIDEOCK 6/96 Stonebridge G.V. II Single cottage. C18. Lias stone and brick walls (Flemish bond). Thatch roof with gable ends and one brick stack at north gable. Gable end to lane. 1 ½ storeys. 2 windows, 3 and 2-light wooden casements with glazing bars. Wooden cills and lintels. Front door at centre of east elevation, plank, C20. Brick voussoirs over. Lias stone buttress and set-off at south east corner. C20 window-bay with hipped thatch canopy over to south gable wall.
SILVERBRIDGE COTTAGE	SY 49 SW CHIDEOCK NORTH CHIDEOCK 6/99 Silverbridge Cottage G.V. II Cottage, formerly farmhouse. C17, much restored. Coursed lias rubble walls. Thatch roof with gable ends. 2 brick stacks, C20, left of centre at ridge; at right gable end. 1½ storeys. 5 windows, 2 and 3 light wooden casements and glazing bars. Wooden cills and lintels. Half-dormers. Front door, right of centre, plank, C20. Flat stone canopy over on moulded brackets. Rear wing at right angles from middle of range. Rubble flint walls and brick quoins. Half-hipped thatch roof to north. Sash window in gable end.
BARN 30 METRES EAST OF DORMER COTTAGE	CHIDEOCK NORTH CHIDEOCK SY 49 m 6/98 Barn 30 metres east of Dormer Cottage G.V. II Barn c.C17. Coursed rubble-stone walls. Sleeper buttress towards north east corner. Thatch roof with gable ends. Barn doors, wooden, at centre of north wall and south walls, with wooden lintel over. Interior: 3 tie- beams project through the outside walls and are fastened with vertical slip- tenons and secured with a wooden plate between the tenon and wall-surface. Roof with pegged collars and through purlins.
DORMER COTTAGE	SY 49 SW CHIDEOCK NORTH CHIDEOCK 6/97 Dormer Cottage G.V. II Cottage, attached at right angles to ThreeWays at one corner. C15 core with early C17 ceiling of a small open-hall. Lias stone walls. Thatch roof hipped at left hand, gabled at right hand. One brick stack at ridge, backing on to cross-passage. 1½ storeys. 4 windows, 2-3 light wood case- ments, with glazing bars. Wooden lintels. Half-dormers to upper floor with thatch swept over. C17. 3 light leaded wooden casement with central opening and 2 fixed. Opaque glass. Front door, left of centre, wooden with flush panels, c C19. Square plank pitch door, upper right, originally to a small loft. Interior: roof of jointed-cruck construction, originally with collars. One truss visible, 2 in partition walls. 2½ bays of Open Hall formerly. 2 sets of through-purlins. Ground floor ceiling has deep-chamfered beams with filleted stops. C17
THREE WAYS COTTAGE	SY 49 SW CHIDEOCK NORTH CHIDEOCK 6/95 Three Ways Cottage G.V. II Cottage. c 1700. Rubble-stone lias walls with stone quoins. Thatch roof with gable ends. One brick stack at right gable. 2 storeys. 2 windows, 2 and 3 light wooden casements with glazing bars. Wooden cills and lintels. Front door at left hand, plank, C20, with plastic thatch canopy over. The one storey garage extension is not listed.

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HELL FARMHOUSE	SY 49 SW CHIDEOCK NORTH CHIDEOCK 6/100 Hell Farmhouse - II Farmhouse, c 1700. Coursed lias stone walls and chert rubble walls. Thatch roof with gabled and hipped ends. One renewed brick stack at former left hand gable. One at former right hand rear gable. Originally a very short cross- wing. 2 storeys. 4 windows, 2-light wooden casements and glazing bars. Wooden cills and lintels. Front door towards left hand end, wood with small top lights, C20. Stone porch with pitched gable roof and concrete tiles. Rear wing has stone walls under a slate roof. C20 brick stack at west gable wall. Interior: 2 large open fireplaces with straight-chamfered wooden lintels over.
SILVERBRIDGE FARMHOUSE	SY 49 SW CHIDEOCK NORTH CHIDEOCK 6/94 Silverbridge Farmhouse - II Farmhouse. C17 core, C19 exterior. Chert rubble walls with stone quoins. Patent tile roof with gable ends. 2 brick stacks, left gable and left centre. 2 storeys. 3 windows, 3 light wooden casements with segmental stone arch- heads. Front door, left of centre, narrow plank. Interior: right hand ground room with deep-chamfered ceiling beams making 6 compartments. Blocked open fireplace.
BARN AND CART SHED 150 METRES WEST OF SILVERBRIDGE FARMHOUSE	SY 49 SW CHIDEOCK NORTH CHIDEOCK 6/93 Barn and Cart Shed 150 metres west of Silverbridge farmhouse - II Barn. C18. Rebuilt gable end with the datestone 1846. Coursed lias stone and rubble stone walls, evenly banded. Thatch roof, with gable ends and stone gable copings to barn and lower cart shed. Barn taller than cart shed. Pitch door in east gable. Enlarged opening in east wall. Attached cart shed, C17. 4 bays. 3 large rubble-stone piers to north (open) side. Brick round arches over with flush rubble-filled spandrels. Heavy tie-beams from top of piers and bedded into rear wall. Roof construction, collar-beam trusses with renewed butt-purlins and plated yokes. "RCHM, Dorset I", p 96 (21).
HOLLOW COTTAGE	SY 49 SW CHIDEOCK NORTH CHIDEOCK 6/92 Hollow Cottage G.V. II Cottage, formerly farmhouse. C18. Coursed lias stone walls. Thatch roof, gabled at each end. Lower thatch and gabled extension at right hand. 3 brick stacks, at centre behind ridge, at right inner gable, at far right gable. 2 storeys. 3 windows to main block, 2 and 3--light casements with renewed wooden cills. Large, stone voussoirs. Front door at centre, wood, 2-leaf, C20. Extension at right hand. One storey with 4 light casement window and 2 small single lights in gable end.
BARN AT THE HOLLOW	SY 49 SW CHIDEOCK NORTH CHIDEOCK 6/91 Barn at The Hollow G.V. II Barn, c 1700. Coursed lias rubble walls, with a straight joint to right hand side. Thatch roof, half-hipped and gabled. One storey. Barn door at centre, 2-leaf plank over raised plank floor. Small plank door to right hand with wooden lintel over, (separate store room). Loop to left of barn doors. Gable end with 2 round ventilation holes, now blocked internally. Pitch door over.
MANOR COTTAGE	SY 49 SW CHIDEOCK NORTH CHIDEOCK 6/90 Manor Cottage - II Single cottage. c. 1800. Ashlar stone walls at front, rubble-stone and cob at rear. Thatch roof with stone gable copings and flat kneelers. Gable ends. Brick stacks at left and right hand gables. 1 ½ storeys. 3 windows, 3 light wooden casements with straight depressed arch heads and projecting stone keys. Brick voussoirs. Small staircase with similar head. Front doorway at centre with a similar head. Plank and studded front door, C19.

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<p>MANOR WITH ATTACHED WALL AND OUTBUILDINGS ON NORTH SIDE</p>	<p>SY 49 SW CHIDEOCK NORTH CHIDEOCK 6/87 Chideock Manor with 7.8.52 attached wall and outbuildings on north side. G.V. II Manor House in own grounds. c.1810. Architect unknown. Lias stone, ashlar walls with fine jointing. Coursed rubble-stone plinth. 2 stone plat-bands. Slate roofs. Rendered brick stacks at left and right hand parapets. Shape of roof not visible. 2 storeys. 4 bays: sash-windows with thin glazing bars and crown glass. Tripartite sashes to the segmental bay 3. Stone cills. Bay 2 has a square porch to ground and first floors. Front doorway with plain pilasters. Tuscan capitals, moulded semi-circular head and projecting key. 2 leaf front door with fielded panels. Large semi-circular fanlight with glazing bars. Recessed panel over. Parapet with flat stone coping rebuilt in concrete. South elevation with big segmental window bay. North elevation with the side entrance, round-headed with impostes and projecting key. Interior: plaster cornices with running scroll and rosettes on the soffit. Dining room with inserted stone fireplace, C16. Square lintel with 4 panels bearing 2 blank shields, Tudor rose, patera. Old kitchen. Stone fireplace inserted, C16. Tudor arch under a straight head. Foliage spandrels, left spandrel with /Xh M(SIC). Lintel has unusual framed with with rose at centre. Hall staircase with plain mahogany hand-rail. Domed oval light over. Attached brick wall in Flemish bond, c 1810, with two re-used C17 stone mullion windows inserted. C16 stone fireplace lintel (Tudor arch) re-used as a door- head. Beaters' Room attached on north end, early C19, brick walls with slate roof over. Polygonal. 2 light windows with elliptical heads and a doorway. "RCHM, Dorset I", p 95 (3).</p>
<p>SUMMER HOUSE AND ATTACHED GARDEN WALLS 30 METRES NORTH WEST OF CHIDEOCK MANOR</p>	<p>Summer House. Late C19. Lias rubble-stone walls and chert rubble walls. Rectangular structure of one storey with a modern corrugated iron roof, Wide segmental arch on west side with crenellated parapet over. Flagstone floor. Attached walls on the north and west, forming an enclosure, 8 metres, 20 metres, 25 metres. Crenellated parapet to wall.</p>
<p>ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH AT CHIDEOCK MANOR</p>	<p>SY 49 SW CHIDEOCK NORTH CHIDEOCK 6/89 Roman Catholic Church at Chideock Manor G.V. II Catholic Church, incorporating former barn-chapel. C18 (barn) and church completed 1874. Barn at right angles to C19 church and forming the 'transepts' of the later structure. Basilican plan with narthex. Coursed lias stone walls. Slate roof with stone gable copings. Narthex: triple arch (2 outer blind with lancets), with continuous hood-mould over, carried on responds with capitals. Stone cill interrupted by central doorway. West gable with large terracotta roundel, painted. Virgin of the Apocalypse at centre, small roundels with scenes from Christ's Passion. Latin inscription recording the rebuilding by Charles Weld and date 1874. Nave with north and south aisles, 5 bay nave. 5 cinquefoil windows. Clerestorey lights in threes, round-arched with responds and capitals. Crossing-Tower, octagonal with sexfoil roundels in diagonals. Mansard roof over with cross at apex and heavy cornice below. C18 Barn con- stitutes present north and south transepts. Lias walls with gabled slate roof and stone gable coping. 5 brick arches, with keys, 2 blocked, rest windows. East gable wall with 3 niches and decorative tile work under the coping. Interior: Narthex, round-arch entrance to church, 2-leaf wood door. Inscription from Habakuk 11:20. Nave: 5 bays, short columns, carved foliage- with-motifs block capitals, eg Crown of Thorns, Symbols of Passion, Sacred Heart pierced by Cross. Low round arcade with labels and shield stops in spandrels, eg Dove with olive branch. Row of Catholic martyrs' portraits below clerestorey windows. Roof with coving and pointed barrel vault over in 40 panels. Stencil decoration. Pointed sanctuary arch carried down on octagonal columns with Byzantine-style block capitals. Sanctuary with columns and capitals set as an octagon-in-square. Pointed arches over carry walling, pendentives, heavy cornice and circular elliptical dome with stencil decoration in the crown. East wall, stencil decoration, gilded figure of Virgin, independently lit. Fittings: Font in south west baptistery chapel, round bowl carved with quatrefoils on an octagonal stem. North west chapel with crucifix and Our Lady of Sorrows. North and south aisle chapels with stone altars carved in shallow relief. North chapel with half octagonal lit dome. Gilded figure of Christ (Sacred Heart) in alcove. Wooden altar from old chapel c 1800 with "Altare Privilegiatum" and "Hic jacet corpus S. Mecius martyris". Old chapel with former sanctuary at south end. Segmental ceiling. Wall paintings throughout with Apostles, scenes from The Life of Christ, etc. Sculptors for 1874 church, Thomas Gadsby (Dorchester) and Charles Weld. 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GARDEN HOUSE, 50 METRES NORTH OF GATE FARMHOUSE	SY 49 SW CHIDEOCK NORTH CHIDEOCK 6/86 Garden House, 50 metres north of Gate Farmhouse. - II Garden House. C19. Very small square structure. Lias stone walls with a pyramidal tiled roof. Round-headed entrance on north side. (No door). South side with a trefoil-cusped window opening.
GATE FARMHOUSE	SY 49 SW CHIDEOCK NORTH CHIDEOCK 6/85 Gate Farmhouse - II Farmhouse. C17. Coursed rubble-stone lias walls. Thatch roof, half hipped and gabled. Renewed brick stacks, backing on to cross-passage, at right hand gable. 1½ storeys. 4 windows, 2 and 3-light wooden casements (C20), some with glazing bars. Crown glass. Wooden cills and lintels. 3 half dormers. Front door, left of centre, plank and studded C20. Hipped thatch porch canopy carried on 2 wooden posts. Raised stone pathway along front of house to front door. Interior: mid-chamfered beam with filleted stop. Blocked fireplace with segmental lintel over. Plank doors with iron hinges. "RCHM, Dorset I", P 96 (17).
MORTUARY CHAPEL (ROMAN CATHOLIC)	SY 4292 CHIDEOCK NORTH ROAD 9/82 Mortuary Chapel (Roman Catholic) G.V. II Mortuary Chapel. Latin inscription with date 1857. Cruciform, small and steep. Rubble stone walls with diagonal buttresses and set-offs. Plinth. Plain and fish scale slate roofs of steep pitch. Central roof, of pyramidal form; tall gabled roofs to the arms, with window-openings (eg mandorla) in the gables. 2 lancets in eastern arm. North doorway with shouldered arch and straight- chamfered jambs. Large cross of brick headers in east wall with lozenge stone centre with Papal insignia; Alpha and Omega. Low relief stone rood (Christ Crucified) on west wall, in quasi-late Carolingian style. INRI over and 2 doves and lamb. Foliage and nail-head ornament in the spandrels.
BETCHWORTH HOUSE	SY 4292 CHIDEOCK MAIN STREET NORTH SIDE 9/47 Betchworth House 5.9.60 G.V. II Attached house. Early C19. Lias stone ashlar walls. Slate roof with gable ends and boxed-in eaves. C19 brick stacks at left and right hand gables. 2 storeys. 3 windows, 2-light wooden casements with glazing bars. Stone voussoirs to windows. Centre upper window, blocked. Front door, at centre, C20, wood and glass-paned throughout. C19 lias stone extension to right. Two storeys, one bay under a hipped slate roof. Same window-type as above.
THE WARREN HOUSE	SY 4292 CHIDEOCK MAIN STREET NORTH SIDE 9/48 The Warren House, 7.8.52 formerly listed as Warren. G.V. II Single house. C17 with C18 re-fenestration. Lias stone ashlar walls. Thatch roof of steep pitch with stone gable copings. 3 brick stacks at: left hand gable, backing on to cross-passage, at right hand gable. 2 storeys. 4 windows, 3-light wooden casements with glazing bars. Wooden cills. Stone lintels and keys, which project at right hand. West gable wall: 2 small attic windows with labels over. One 2 light mullion window, labelled, lower down, C17. Front door, right of centre, wood C20. Cast iron porch with open trellis-type supports. Concave hipped hood over. Cast iron railings along front sleeper wall. "RCHM. Dorset I", p 95 (11).
MONTYIKE, GINGERBREAD COTTAGE AND STOKE COTTAGE, FORMERLY MONTYIKE AND 1 AND 2 NORTH ROAD	SY 4292 CHILEOCK NORTH ROAD 9/81 Montyike, Gingerbread 5.9.60 Cottage and Stoke Cottage, formerly Montyike and I and 2 North Road3 attached cottages. c C18. Montyike: stone walls, rendered and washed. Thatch roof with stone gable coping to Main Street. Brick stack at gable end. 2 storeys. 2 windows, 2 light wooden casements with glazing bars. Front door on opposite (west) wall (C20). Gingerbread Cottage: rubble stone walls, thatch roof, one brick stack at ridge (centre). 2 storeys. One window, 2 light casements with glazing bars. Flat brick arches. One dormer with thatch canopy. Front door at right side, C20 wood with glass panels. Stoke Cottage: same materials. Roof has gable end to north. 2 storeys. One window, 2 and 3 light wooden casements, with glazing bars. "RCHM, Dorset I", p 95 (10).

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<p>CHIDEOCK PARISH CHURCH (ST GILES)</p>	<p>SY 4292 CHIDEOCK MAIN STREET NORTH SIDE 9/49 Chideock Parish Church 5.9.60 (St Giles) G.V. 1 Church. C14, C15, major 1880 restoration by Crickmay. West Tower, Nave, South aisle, north transept, Chancel with a south chapel, south porch. Coursed Lias stone masonry with ashlar dressings, plain tile roof with cresting, stone gable copings to chancel and east end with crosses over. West Tower: rectangular plan, 3 stages with south east newel stair rising above parapet. Plinth with set-back buttresses and weatherings. 2 plain strings and a parapet string. 2-light bell openings with 'Somerset tracery'. West door with pointed head and moulded jambs. 3-light Perp window with panel tracery over. South elevation: 2 windows - porch - 2 windows. 3- light mullions, trefoil-cusped in a square head. Small carved gargoyles at the main divisions. Diagonal buttresses with set-offs. Crenellated parapet. South porch entrance with 4-centred head, continuous moulded jambs. Flush foliage carving in the spandrels, no label. Signs of blocking of small window over entrance. Crenellations with gargoyles. Chancel rebuilt entirely 1880. 2 light mullion window with trefoil-ogee heads. Interior: nave with 4-bay south arcade, later C15. Conventional shafts with plain moulded capitals and 2-centred arches over. No clerestory. Roof rebuilt 1880. High collars with king-posts and curved struts over. Minimal arch-braces bolted through to principals. All carried on simple stone corbels. South aisle with compartmented ceiling beams, 1880. Arch into Arundell chapel, heavy keeled responds with moulded bases and capitals, C19. Arch into north chapel, segmental-pointed dying into the jambs, rebuilt C19. Barrel-vault. North chapel has an intersecting tracery early C14 window in north face. Chancel: of 2 bays, chancel-arch with double-keeled respond arrangement, carried into arch. Pointed wagon roof in 36 ceiled compartments. East window of 5 lights with net-panel tracery over. Side windows: 2-light, ogee-cusped under a square head, big hollow chamfers. Rere-arches. Fittings: Font, c.1500, thick octagonal panelled stem over chamfered plinth, octagonal bowl with 2 quatrefoils-in-circle sunk in each side. Cover: wood, pyramidal, with a solid finial, C17. Arundell Tomb, South chapel, Purbeck marble, early C17. Large tomb-chest with recumbent effigy of a knight in armour. 3 painted shields replace the original brass. indents. Tomb chest with turned baluster half-shrifts. 4-centred stone frame at rear of tomb. Two C13 paintings of the Church and Street, showing medieval chancel. Pulpit, 1880, hexagonal on a trumpet-stem, with panelled sides. Choir-stalls, wood, 1880. Stone piscina in south aisle, trefoil cusped under a pointed arch, C19. "RCHM, Dorset I", p 93 (1).</p>

II Churchyard wall, attached to west tower and running 25 metres north of tower and 10 metres south of tower, C17. Rubble-stone with flat stone coping, standing to about 5 feet. Gate piers into churchyard at corner with main road are included.</p>

(1) Immediately east of chancel. To Thomas Daniell, Steward of Chideock Manor. Stone with round-arch panels and modillions, 1668. Brass plate added 1885 by Sir F Weld. (2) To Henry Roper, d. 1780, with fluted pilaster corners and stone plinth. (3) To Giles Roper, d. 1814 with ogee-headed Indian-style pilaster corners and moulded top. (4) and (5) both early C19, overgrown and with illegible lettering.</p>
<p>CHIDEOCK HOUSE HOTEL (Formerly listed as Chideock House.)</p>	<p>SY 4292 CHIDEOCK MAIN STREET NORTH SIDE 9/52 Chideock House Hotel 5.9.60 (formerly listed as G.V. chideock House) II Single house, now hotel, with rear attachments, early C17. Coursed Lias ashlar walls. Thatch roof with gable ends and stone gable copings. One brick stack at right hand gable. 2 storeys. 3 windows, stone mullions with hollow chamfers, of 3, 4 and 5 lights. C20 metal casements therein. Stone mullions in west gable, part blocked. Front doorway, left of centre, stone surround" .,with slight hollow chamfer. C20 door, wood with many glass panels. Thatched rear wing at east gable end with canted bay. Interior: early C17 mid-chamfered beam with small fillets. Fireplace in right hand room: massive lintel with straight chamfer. "RCHM, Dorset I", p 95 (4).</p>

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BRIDGE COTTAGE	4292 CHIDEOCK MAIN STREET NORTH SIDE 9/53 Bridge Cottage 5.9.60 G.V. II Single cottage, formerly two attached cottages, c.C18 with C20 alterations. Rubble-stone walls, washed, with wall set back at right hand end. Thatch roof with gable ends and higher eaves-line at right hand end. 2 brick stacks, at ridge (party wall), at right hand gable. 1 ½ and 2 storeys. 4-5 windows, left end has C20 metal casements of 2 and 4 lights with wooden cills. Right end has C20 wooden casements with lozenge leaded lights. Front door of plank at centre of right hand part. Rubble-stone outshuts at rear with concrete Roman tile roof.
ROAD BRIDGE OVER RIVER WINNIFORD	SY 4292 CHIDEOCK MAIN STREET 9/76 Road Bridge over river Winniford G.V. II Bridge. Early C19. Stone walls with single segmental arch, with voussoirs dying into the abutments. Attached ford surface of cobbles beneath the bridge, visible between the abutments. Modern road bridge on top of old bridge, not listable. Cast iron railings with arrow-heads and finials, forming balustrade, early C19.
BY THE STREAM AND STADDLESTONES	SY 4292 CHIDEOCK MAIN STREET NORTH SIDE 9/54 By The Stream and 7.8.52 St addlestones G.V. II Two attached cottages, early C19. Lias stone walls, washed. Slate roofs with gable ends and tile ridge. 3 brick stacks, at left hand gable, party wall and right hand gable. 2 storeys, whole range is 4 windows. 2 light wooden casements with glazing bars and wooden cills. Some old glass. Front door at centre, left, wood with flush panels and 6 glass lights. Continuous C19 outshut at rear of both, washed rubble walls and Roman tile pentice roof. Iron railings to front area with fire-tongue finials and urns.
APPLE TREE COTTAGE AND APPLE TREE THATCH	SY 4292 CHIDEOCK MAIN STREET NORTH SIDE 9/55 Apple Tree Cottage 7.8.52 and Apple Tree Thatch G.V. II Attached cottage and house, C18. Apple Tree Cottage: stone walls, rendered and washed. Thatch roof with big catslide hip at left hand.
