Parish Council News - Dawn Hall

Gonalston Lane

The Parish Council has been informed that the council will be proceeding with double yellow lines on Gonalston Lane

Village Hall

From April this year, the independent Village Hall Committee will end and will be replaced by a working group which will come under the Parish Council's legal umbrella. Lindsey Clifford (the Chairperson), Caroline Nall (Treasurer) and Maddi Goodwin (who has carried out more roles than we have space to print!) are taking a well-earned rest. We thank them for their many, many years of dedication and service.

We are very grateful to Janet Hopewell and Nadine Gilbert who have agreed to stay on to help take the village hall forward as part of a working group.

For many years the village hall has relied on volunteers to provide their time and their services to enable the Village Hall to operate. As lives have got busier it has increasingly not been possible to run the Village Hall with volunteers alone. In order to make this task easier, as we move forward, the Parish Council will be taking on the treasurer function and some of the administrative tasks to ensure the village hall can continue to operate, both as a venue for hire and as a community hub. In addition, the village hall already has an appointed booking clerk, cleaner and caretaker. It is hoped that by having these paid roles and the Parish Council taking some of the administrative burden, the working group can focus on the key (and hopefully more interesting) tasks.

Most of the funds needed to run the village hall are generated through hiring the village hall for events and a limited number of weddings each year. Volunteers are needed to help market and attract bookings to the village hall and help it to function as a venue. In addition, the village hall relies on fundraising activities to top up this revenue- the Minkley Club draw is one way we do this but there also needs to be additional activities as well as community events that keep the village hall serving residents.

If you would like to volunteer to help us take this forward please contact Dawn on 07791 608035, speak to any Parish Councillor or speak with Janet or Nadine. This is not as formal as a committee so you do not have to be elected onto the committee and you can volunteer for a specific project or choose to be involved in some things but not others. It is a great chance to get involved and to meet new people and to become part of the community.

Defibrillator

There have been a few questions recently about the defibrillators in the village.

There are four defibrillators and all are registered so that the emergency services are aware of them. The one you probably already know about is on the outside of the village hall. However, the cricket club have also relatively recently installed one on the outside of the club house. Thank you to Nikki Whitelaw who has also confirmed there are two more; one

located on the wall at the gate next to the entrance of Hoveringham Mammoth Self Storage and a further one at the offices of A1 mobile.

The Defibrillators are designed to be used by someone who is not medically trained and the machine itself talks you through the process. In the event of an emergency the first step is to give CPR and this is the priority. You should not stop CPR in order to access the defibrillator. If another person is available to assist, then you may use the defibrillator. A defibrillator can be taken to where it is needed once the case is opened. To access the defibrillator you should ring 999 and give the defibrillator location and you will be given the access code which you type into the key pad. The access code for the village hall defibrillator is 3333 followed by the "tick" symbol. After this the emergency services will talk you through the process and the machine itself will give instructions. Hov Runnaz......Running into a new year!



Remembering Richard Leman

Richard Lived in Boat Lane in Hoveringham for many years with his wife Judith. They moved to Southwell some years ago but Richard's contribution to the community remains with us! Richard died in January this year.

John Fawcett and Pat Dean – both ex villagers also have sent these memories of him for our Newsletter:

The Cinderella pantomime was written in the autumn of 1994 and performed sometime in February 1996. Richard played the part of Sir Anthony Grant, the Royal Announcer. We had him dressed up in Regency costume with powdered wig and lots of make-up and of course he played the part so well. Judith, with others was much involved in dressing the players and getting them on stage exactly on time,

I knew Richard quite well as did so many others and found him a delight in private and in company. Of course he had a distinguished legal career in Nottingham after graduating from Oxford with a degree in law. He and Judith were married in his college chapel.

He had a lovely dry sense of humour and was close to a number of people in the village and always keen to help and become involved in local matters. He successfully opposed a scheme to allow a green belt plot on Boat Lane to be developed into a medical surgery.

We were all rather saddened when they left Hoveringham, but unsurprisingly he kept up his connections and friendships here in the village.

Richard and his wife Judith were part of a group of my friends who went on holiday to Costa Rica and Panama. We were taken to a small uninhabited island for a day and the guide told us that there was some spectacular coral and a group of sharks living about 100 yards offshore. The sea was very choppy and only a few of us decided to go. Richard asked me to show him how to use a snorkel and insisted that he was coming with us. He was not a strong swimmer and coughing and gasping he struggled and eventually managed to get to our stunning destination. The coral was beautiful and the sharks (of a non-bitey variety we were assured) came scarily close. It had been a difficult swim for all of us and we were in awe of Richard's determination to succeed. He told me that it was one of the most exciting things he had ever done. Well done him!

Richard's funeral is on Friday 24th February at 1.30pm at The Minster, followed by a burial in Hoveringham.

We would like to express our sadness on behalf of the village to learn about the sad passing of longstanding members of our community in the last two months.

Condolences to their families for the loss of Little Kath Clarke, Tina Townsend, Chris Lee and Richard Lehman who all contributed hugely to life in Hoveringham during their years of living here.
