Welcome & Introductions/ToR	Jon shared the context of the Environmental Action Working Group, as a vehicle to embrace the enthusiasm and participation of local residents who are interested in developing strategies for proactively improving the Village Environment. The Terms of Reference & Parish Council Code of Conduct were shared with attendees and the application to become a member of the Working Group shared with a request that these be fille din and returned to the Parish Council Offices. Areas of Interest	Tom gave a thorough explanation of the Lower Slaughter Community Composting scheme that he chaired and that was launched in 2004. (An Info Pack and DVD was shared with Jon)	Jon to return DVD to Tom
	Alex expressed interest in a number of aspects from rewilding the river, development of an environmentally focussed design code. (We need to share in summary form all of the ideas and suggestions developed under the aegis of the Bourton Tourism Action Group.)	
	Jon talked about waste minimisation through replacing single use plastics (such as The Cotswold Cup Scheme) and seeking to influence fast food vendors to find better alternatives to large cardboard boxes (in order to reduce the number of bins on the green). Facilitating a meeting of takeaway providers to introduce the Zero Waste ambitions and explore the options for introducing reusable food containers may be a good first step	
	He also raised the suggestion made by the Platinum Jubilee Working Group that there be a water fountain installed in the village (to negate the requirement for residents or visitors to purchase water in plastic bottles), part funded by profit from the programme of events and potentially funded from the Tourism levy on the Rissington Road Car Park. Andy mentioned the possibility of maybe a couple of water fountains, one outside the CDC owned public toilets next to Cotswold China & Cookware on the High Street and maybe something on the Village Green or more feasibly next to the Victoria Hall.	
	One afterthought is the development of signage that would communicate to visitors the Zero Waste ambition that has	

	been embraced by the Parish Council and how they play a part. (From car parks to village centre/Information Centre.)
