dig up the village green. It won't get rid of all the road digging but it will reduce it considerably.


Have a Happy Christmas all and let's hope for the best in 2018 for Dunton Green.

PLEASE NOTE that whenever you report a lighting fault you will be asked for the **column number** (which is on the street light) and the location. Please ensure that you have these details to enable a prompt response.

COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH



What is Community Speed Watch?

Community Speed Watch (CSW) is an initiative that allows groups of residents to volunteer and contribute to their local safety and quality of life by helping to reduce excessive vehicle speeds on roads in their own communities.

What are the Objectives of Speed Watch?

- 1 To increase the public awareness of speeding.
- 2 To reduce deaths, injuries and collisions on Kent's roads.
- 3 To improve the safety and quality of life in local communities.

How Does Speed Watch Work?

Operating at risk assessed roadside sites during daylight in 30 and 40 miles per hour (mph) speed limits, a group typically of three CSW volunteers monitors the speed of passing vehicles using a portable speed indication device

They record the speed and identifying details of vehicles travelling at or above nationally specified speed thresholds (35 and 46 mph). The registered keepers of vehicles observed repeatedly or excessively (speed limit plus 50%) speeding anywhere in Kent in a 12-month period are then sent warning letters and advice by Kent Police.

How does a scheme for Sevenoaks District start up

Sevenoaks District Community Safety Partnership (CSP) has purchased 6 speed boards which can be loaned out to volunteers.

Training is arranged by Kent Police online to all members of the community. Site areas are then e-mailed to Kent Police who will risk assess the area. The boards are then lent out went the volunteers are ready.

Kent Police also collates the roadside data and uses it to send warning letters and speed awareness advice to speeding vehicle owners.

COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH IN KENT FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

When and How Often Does a Speed Watch Team Go Out?

All Speed Watch teams go out as often and for as long as the practitioners want to - during the hours of daylight.

What Data is Collected at the Roadside?

In addition to the date and location, CSWs also collect the time, speed, colour, make and model of passing vehicles. The data is transferred to an Excel-based spreadsheet supplied by Kent Police. This is then e-mailed to the Speed Watch Support Team.

What Happens to the Roadside Data?

The information sent in is added to the Kent Police CSW database. This is then analysed and used to send letters to the registered owners of vehicles detected speeding. Kent Police also uses the data to inform its own pre-planned operations targeting speeding vehicles.

What Criteria Are Used to Send Letters to the Vehicle Owners?

• A second and subsequent detection at any Speed Watch scheme in the county within the previous 12 months for speeds between 35 and 44mph in a 30mph limit and between 46 and 59mph in a 40mph limit.

• Speeds detected that are 50%+ above the limit (45 and above in a 30mph limit and 60 and above in a 40mph limit) are considered 'excessive'. These will receive more strongly-worded warning letters on the first and all subsequent detections.

How Long Has Kent Had Active Speed Watches?

Since 2006.

Wild about Dunton Green

Something I've always loved about Dunton Green happens in the late summer/early



autumn every year: the geese. Flying low, loud and in sometimes large numbers, moving between lakes and meadows just before dusk most evenings. Although they're around all year, they're really noticeable around this time. They're mostly greylag geese, a fairly large, grey goose with pink legs and an orange bill. The

greylag geese can also be seen easily at the nearby Sevenoaks Wildlife Reserve.

Right on our doorstep, the Sevenoaks Wildlife Reserve was created from what was once a gravel pit, but thanks to the hard work and commitment of volunteers, and the Harrison family, is now a Site of Special Scientific Interest, and the first conversion of gravel pit to wildlife reserve anywhere in the UK.

Fed by the River Darent, which flows through the site, the Reserve contains 5 lakes, ponds, woodland (largely planted by hand!) and a visitor centre. As of 2006, over two thousand species have been identified on the site, ranging from



water birds like the greylag, Canada geese, tufted ducks, mallards, coots, moorhens and swans (and more!) to songbirds and woodland birds like woodpeckers, warblers and tits; and insects (including 13 types of dragonfly!).

The Reserve is easily reached by foot from Dunton Green (it actually runs alongside the Ryewood Site) via a good footpath from Rye Lane. Alternatively, there's a carpark on site via Bradbourne Vale Road. The visitor centre is open 10.00 am to 5.00pm daily.



There are some restrictions though – due to the nesting birds, there are no dogs allowed (except guide dogs), and no bicycles or jogging. The site is largely accessible to all though, with the hides and most of the paths wheelchair friendly.

You don't need to be a nature buff either, there is plenty of information to help you spot and identify the birds. A pair of binoculars will come in handy, and it's worth remembering that the birds are wild, and therefore don't perform on cue, so some quiet patience is often rewarded. The

Wildlife is not just limited to the reserves though. Around the village I've seen wild deer, grass snake, slow worm, stag beetle, hedgehog, numerous song birds and woodland birds, birds of prey, common lizard, shrew, vole, fox and lots of different insects and spiders! It's all around us, you just need to be quiet, observant and in the right place at the right time!

DUNTON GREEN - Then & Now So, where do you think we were in the village?



Hodder & Stoughton were located in what is now the Mill Road estate, near the southern end of Longford

Meadow. The tall tree in both of these photographs is, in fact, the same tree in the 'Then' photograph! Some things do stay constant!

Well, you guessed, it's the railway station but long gone is the old station building which would have been manned in days gone by. The Sidings development provides quite a different background now too. Which do you prefer? Then or Now?








And the third photograph was the Longford Lido which was enjoyed by many right up until its closure in 1952. It's difficult to describe exactly where it was before the Mill Road estate was created in the 1990s. The Lido was next to Longford Mill which was roughly where the car sales showroom is now located.
