17. Further Information

Cllr Galton, in his role as History Society member, asked that the Parish Council lend the Society money for the publication of the next Parish History Book. He suggested £5,240 'draw-down.' The Society has applied for two grants, one of which has not been successful, the outcome of the other is awaited and could provide up to £500. Cllr Galton feels that the Society will be able to cover costs from any grant from the Parish Council and should it provide a draw-down facility; only what is needed would be used until the other grant comes in. He will also talk to Cllr Whittle. An advert inviting orders will be put in the Kent Messenger. The price will be £15, the same as the first book, and one free copy given per household in the Parish. The launch date is 12th December 2014.

This will be put on the Agenda for the next Parish Council Meeting, by which time print numbers, costs and any income from grants will be known and the Parish Council can make an informed decision.
