Following on from our conversation about the proposed sign, I have had a look into the legal agreement application which has yet to be decided. The proposed wording does not take into account the erection of a mounted sign so this would have to be amended perhaps when you have a chance to look at this you might provide an amended version of the proposed wording.

I have also looked into the advertisement regulations - I believe that this would require Consent to Display an Advertisement which can be applied for through this Council. You would need to detail the location, size, height and information which would be displayed. We would assess whether this had any highways or public safety implications and would relate this back to how it responds to the cross project.

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What sort of information plaque is to go near the cross?
Where should it be sited?
Of what should it be made?

Draft inscription for the information plaque:

The original date of the cross is unknown but it is believed to be medieval. It stood within 50 yards of its present site in the heart of the village, perhaps marking the forking of roads, until 1857 when it was removed to the churchyard. [At that time it was furnished with a longer shaft which culminated in a cross. This fell in the 1950s and is now to be found on the window ledge of the west porch of the church.] The Victorian re-siting in the churchyard was [also] recorded in a deeply cut inscription, parts of which are visible on the stones of the base step.

The restoration and return of the cross to the village and its dedication in memory of those from village and college who gave their lives in the two World Wars was largely financed by a grant from Heritage Lottery, through its *First World War: Then and Now* programme. The project also involved extensive research into the village at war, into the lives and deaths of those who lived here and those who fought abroad during the Great War, and it culminated in the establishment of a village archive, held in Ripon College, a pageant performed in the church involving local schoolchildren and a publication

The cross was rededicated on Remembrance Sunday 2015 to the Glory of God and in honour of the war dead of the village and college. Their names are recorded on a 'War Shrine' in the church.
