Message from the Eynsham Neighbourhood Police Team

As we approach the change in season we would like to remind residents to "Be Safe Be Seen" Sandra and Helen have been Back to School to talk to children about the importance of being seen in the darker evenings. Whether walking, on cycle or on scooter we would like people to consider if they can be seen by others. The pupils of Stanton Harcourt School have taken part in the Egg Helmet Challenge to show the importance of wearing a cycle helmet.

In addition to being seen outside the darker evenings can also put homes at increased risk of burglary. If no light is on in your home, curtains are not drawn and no car is in the drive it is an obvious sign to an opportunist burglar that nobody is at home. There are several measures that can be taken which can reduce the chance of your home becoming a target.

- Use a timer switch this could be used on a lamp, radio or TV to give the impression that someone is home.
- Keep Valuables out of sight
- Lock your doors and windows. If you have a UPVC door make sure you have double locked it.
- Use a Property Marking Scheme (UV Marker Pen or similar – if you would like one please contact the team)


