How will SPC spend the Parish Precept in 2020?

The precept is the amount you, the Parish householder, pay as part of your Council Tax. This year, we raised the precept by 4.9% to £155,250 from £148,000. This is the first increase we have made for two years. So, what do you get for this?

- We spend just over half on running the council's business, including implementing decisions, liaising with KCC, Kent Highways and Kent Police, training for staff and Councillors, insurance and audits. Other overheads include salaries, NI and pensions for four part-time staff (Clerk, Assistant Clerk, Admin Assistant and Groundsman). This amount also covers repayment of the loan taken out for the build of the office in 2011.
- We spend around £25k maintaining land owned by the Council. This includes

Langton Green Recreation Ground, the Green at Groombridge, Pocket Park (and other small parcels of land) in Speldhurst, and areas in the Boundary, Langton Green.

- We continue to allocate funds for highways improvements; £10k is budgeted for this year.
- We have allowed £20k for grant applications. We also maintain an annual contingency of between £15k-£25k. Previously, this has been used to support, for example, Speldhurst village shop, and additional tree maintenance arising from the Ash Dieback threat.
- We carry over monies not spent or use reserves to pay for items like playground equipment.

New play equipment at Langton Green Recreation Ground



Did you know, SPC is responsible for maintaining play equipment at Langton Green Recreation Ground? We regularly inspect the playground and the older children's area and, following a recent

safety assessment, felt it necessary to replace the Bicycle Mill. Due to its popularity, Councillors agreed a new version of the same thing be installed again. Installation, equipment and new flooring for this piece cost £13,000, paid for out of SPC reserves. We also replaced and repaired flooring in other parts of the playground. Users suggested

we install additional equipment in the older children's area, which we will explore when we budget for 2021.

Speedwatch Update



Volunteers in Langton Green and Speldhurst have now carried out Speedwatch sessions to monitor and record driver speed at various sites in the two

villages. Details of any vehicle traveling over the speed limit are sent to a central database; if that vehicle is then recorded to be speeding on a further two occasions, they will receive a letter from the Police. Thank you to all who have ventured out in this winter weather – just the sight of volunteers in their hi-vis jackets makes an excellent speed deterrent. We still need people to undertake Speedwatch in Ashurst and Groombridge, where speeding is a real concern. If you can spare some time every few weeks, do consider volunteering.

Parking on the School run

Before Christmas an incident took place, which resulted in a Langton Green resident complaining to Langton Green Primary School about the parking habits of parents in Lampington Row. Thoughtless parking on the school run does not just happen in Langton Green – it is an issue for residents living near Speldhurst Primary School too. If you drive your children to school, please be considerate to others and respectful of resident access.

Meanwhile in Langton Green, the council is investigating ways to make crossing the road to school safer, which we hope will encourage more families to walk.

Langton Green Recreation Ground drainage project update

Langton Green Community Sports Association (LGCSA) have reported a considerable delay to works as a result of rain last Summer and Autumn, meaning that the ground could not be seeded before the colder weather set in. Seeding and final groundworks, together with the installation of a ramp from the pavilion down to pitch level, will now have to wait until April at the earliest. The new grass then needs to settle and establish, so the rec is likely to remain out of action until October. LGCSA say that while this is a blow for users, it is unavoidable, and should not lead to cost overruns.


LGCSA continue to meet with their contractors Agrifactors to discuss the effects of the recent severe weather, and discussions are ongoing as to whether further remedial measures are necessary. This winter has been exceptionally wet, with heavy rainfall on already saturated ground leading to widespread flooding. The situation will be the subject of close review.
