Grant Helps Ogbourne St George Village Hall

At last, the fantastic community of Ogbourne St George can celebrating the news that the Village Hall has received a £4,800 funding boost from the Hills Group Ltd. The money has been made available through the Landfill Communities Fund (LCF), which is administered for Hills by Community First, the Rural Community Council for Wiltshire.

You have all been helping the Trustees to raise enough money by supporting various events over the last five years. This grant means that after 40 years the Village Hall has been repainted and has had double-glazed windows fitted to improve heat retention.

The Chair of Trustees, Colin Jeffery, thanked both Hills and Community First for this grant and looks forward to welcoming representatives to the Village Hall soon.
