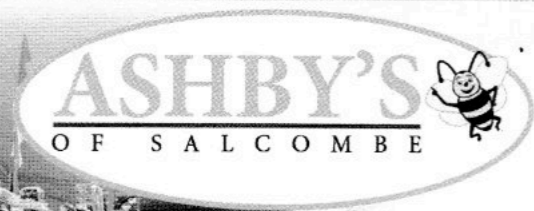

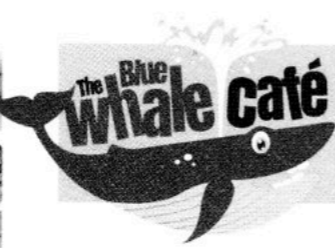

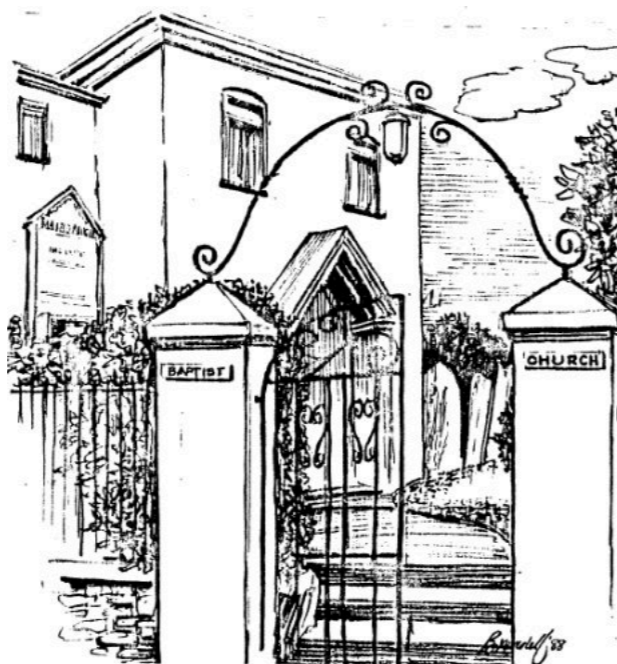

The planting season is over until autumn; the new hedgerows that were planted last year have taken well so will hopefully survive the dry weather. We are still continuing to finish replacing fences around the Bolberry/Bolt Tail area through the spring and summer.

We have had a digger on site levelling out areas of the new permissive bridleway at Bolberry, removing rocks, roots and suckering blackthorn. The signage for the route will be installed over the next month. There are a few sections of fencing to complete before it can be opened.

The rangers and Life on the Edge apprentice have been carrying out the early footpath cuts, leaving wildflowers where they can until they set seed. If you notice any paths that need a cut back please let us know.

Kingsbridge Estuary u3a

‘My Devonshire Darlings’ was the title of our monthly talk in April. Rebecka Pearson appeared in authentic dress from the time when the Land Army was formed to help out on farms during the first and second world wars.

She had slides from the era illustrating the tasks the volunteer girls were expected to perform from milking, looking after pigs and chickens to catching rats. Some, known as ‘Lumber Jills,’ were sent into the forests and trained to cut down trees for the production of wood products.

The girls, some as young as 17, mostly came out from the cities. The lucky ones were made welcome in the farmhouse while some had to make do with a bunk above the cowshed. They had special uniforms and wore black armbands. No smoking or visits to the pub for any of them and they were under strict instructions to get eight hours sleep at night, well-needed one imagines. There was training available at Great Bidlake and later at Seal Hayne and Bicton.

The Land Army was set up originally by Dame Meriel Talbot in 1917 and disbanded in 1950 having played a crucial role in keeping our country supplied with food in very difficult times.

Our talks are very varied. On June 26th we welcome back Alex Leger who will let us know how much can go right or wrong from his long experience of directing Blue Peter.

Malborough and Salcombe Feoffees

This is one of the oldest Devon charities founded in 1573 and was originally set up by a number of local people who donated houses or land which were then let to residents in Malborough and Salcombe. The charity is run by the Parish Church with representatives from local people including Parish Council members from both Malborough and Salcombe.

Nowadays the charity owns just one house which is let but they also receive donations and have investment income. In Malborough the income is donated each year to students in further education as travel expenses and towards the provision of emergency lifeline alarms for elderly or vulnerable residents.

In the last twelve months four travel grants have been given and nine residents have been helped with alarm expenses. If you know of a young person who would qualify or someone who needs an alarm please contact the secretary Pauline Greaves on 843068.

District Councillors Report to the Annual Parish Council Meeting

We, Councillor Samantha Dennis and Councillor Mark Long, are pleased to be able to work with and support the Parish Council in all you do for this area.

The last year has seen announcements by the Government of the biggest changes in the structure of local Government in this area in 50 years and how they

expect it will work going forward. Fortunately, not directly changing Parish Councils.

The Government is pushing forward on major Local Government structure reform with the creation of Unitary Councils through the abolition of District Councils such as South Hams and County Councils such as Devon. Various proposals for what Unitary Councils could look like here in Devon were submitted to the Government by all the Councils across Devon. The final decision will be made by the Government, on what area and form the Unitary Councils will take, and is expected to be announced by 29th July.

If the Government follows the expected timelines they laid out when announcing plans for Unitary Councils, the elections for any new Unitary Council will take place in May 2027 the new Council shadowing and transitioning for a year, with South Hams District Council and Devon County Council, both councils would cease to exist in April 2028. We await the announcement from the Government to confirm what will happen.

This past year has also seen announcements by the Government of many changes in planning regulations and at the same time the announcement of massively increased government housebuilding targets for most councils including the South Hams with numbers being imposed that greatly exceed previous demands.

Among the planning changes the District Council is required to prepare a new Joint Local Plan to ensure we have looked at the ability to respond to these increased housing supply numbers, employment development, ensure adequate infrastructure across the area, make sure we provide the housing and facilities our communities need, at the same time protecting our area and environment. This new local plan will only cover South Hams and West Devon, and not Plymouth as before. Work has started on preparation for pulling this plan together and Parish and Town Councils will be consulted and involved as this is developed. The Government has set a 30-month timeline for the preparation of a Local Plan.

This will run alongside any changes to the organisation of Councils in the area, which will make it an interesting challenge, but we aim to achieve the delivery of a new Local Plan for this area, which will carry through into any new Council.

All these changes will bring challenges to the Parish Council, but exactly what may be clearer once

Government announcements have been made, and over the year ahead.

Malborough Village Hall

Like many in the village, we were deeply saddened by the death of John Jevans, and our thoughts are with his family and all his friends. John has been a long term supporter of the Village Hall and Playing Fields and has served on the Committee for many years, taking a lead on coordinating the outside sports and more recently supporting Matt with the finances. He will be very greatly missed by all.

As I write, Start Point Flooring are half way through their work to restore the wooden floor in the main hall. We are still open for bookings in the Annexe and outside and we will be keen to welcome users back to the main hall in June when we will have a beautifully restored floor marked out for pickleball and badminton.

The cleaning of the external walls is now complete and it looks a lot brighter. Inside, the carpets have been cleaned and the walls repainted below dado level, but the carpets were badly marked within a few days of being cleaned and the walls are having to be touched up every month to deal with scuffs. We love the fact that the facilities are so well used – but please help us keep it looking clean and tidy!

We are currently getting ready to put on the first village fete for five years on July 4th and we hope that you will come and enjoy yourselves. If you have a little time to help on the day or with the clearing up please do get in touch. Also, if you could be a qualified first aider, we would be really grateful for your help! Many thanks.

Saint Peters and All Saints Church

Some of you may know that our parish churches are in a vacancy, Father Daniel having left last September to work in London, as Chaplain for the University of Greenwich. During this time, the parish is run by the Church Council (the PCC) and the Churchwardens.

It is a busy time for us, because as well as ensuring the smooth running of our churches and that services continue, we have also been working to produce the Parish Profile, which is a document attached to the advert to appoint a new Priest in Charge. Our May meeting has two parts – the Annual Parish Meeting followed by the Annual Parish Council Meeting. At the first we received reports from our District and County Councillors, the Primary School, the Feoffees and the Parish Council. All reports were published in advance. The report from our District Councillors is included in this issue as it outlines many of the forthcoming changes that will occur in the next year or so. 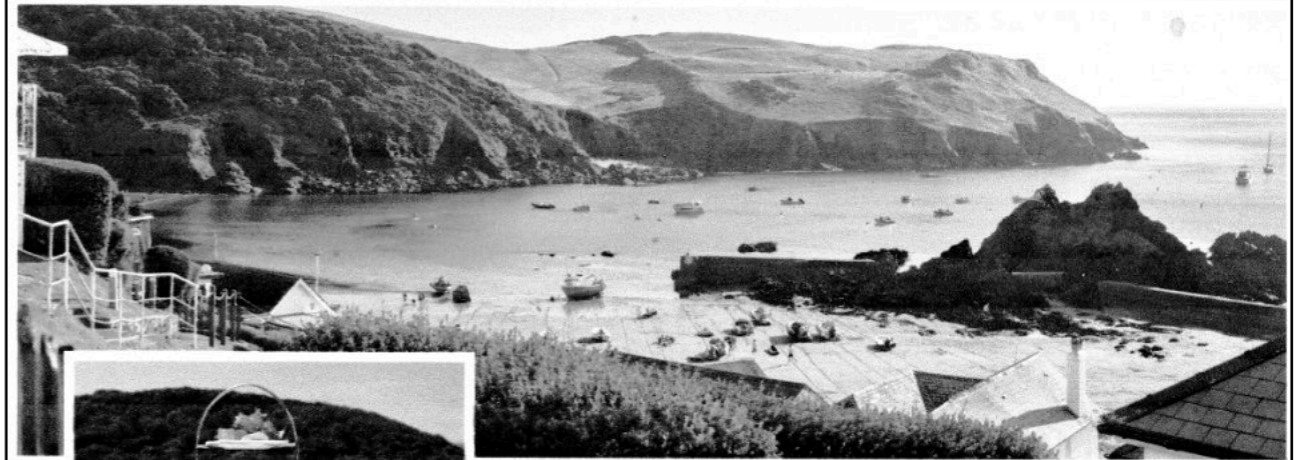
