COUNCIL NEWS

At the Council's last meeting it was given a presentation by Borough Council representatives regarding the new proposed Community Facility including a library at the former Barclays Bank. Three options have been drawn up, with Option 3 the preferred scheme as it offers the maximum facilities given the constraints of the site. Although the most expensive option it offers a more flexible space on the ground floor and two flats on the first floor (1 bedroom and a 2 bedroom) to help generate income for the project. It is anticipated a planning application will be submitted in June and hopefully be opened in Spring 2018.

The Borough Council is now seeking stakeholder's views regarding its plans/options and will be presenting them to parishioners at the Annual Parish Meeting at the Memorial Hall on 12th April at 7pm. Also at this meeting the Parish Council will be talking about its ideas for a Neighbourhood Plan for Hamble and seeking the community's involvement which is vital if it is to be successful.

Parishioners are always welcome to Parish Council meetings and there is a public session at the beginning of each meeting, after necessary formalities, for the public to ask questions or express their views. At its last meeting a resident from Kingfisher Close expressed her concerns about aspects to the new work at the Riverside Park and other parishioners expressed their concerns about the request to sell alcoholic drink at the Beach Hut Cafe.

The Parish Council has responded to the Borough Council's consultation regarding Sports Facility Needs Assessment and Playing Pitch Strategy. Much of the strategy appeared to concentrate investment and resources in high quality provision around Eastleigh Town and the Hedge End, West End, Botley corridor. The Parish Council has responded that Hamble residents would find these difficult to access and that there should be high quality accessible facilities for our area, with only the most specialist facilities centralised. Also the strategy was light on water based activities for which Hamble is renowned.



The Council has approved its budget for 2017-18 and has been reviewing other aspects of it finances, including its annual review of it Financial Regulations. It has also reviewed its Community Grant Programme and application process for next year. Small grants for local organisations are normally considered in October and March each year.

The Council has now formally agreed to give a £10,000 grant towards the running of HYPE. It has also agreed that HYPE can use the Roy Underdown Pavilion for meetings every first and third Tuesday in four, starting in April. This will be reviewed by the Council in 3 month's time. The Council has received two auditor reports which give guidance and advice on the councils work, internal processes and spending. This included reference to the Hamble Lifeboat project and public facilities there. The Parish Council continues its discussions with Hamble Lifeboat and other interested parties with a view to opening them as soon as possible.

This is the time of year people are thinking about planting vegetables, fruit and flowers in their gardens and a reminder that the Parish Council has a couple of allotments available at its site off Hamble Lane. If you are interested in having an allotment, please contact the Parish Office to find out what is available, the regulations and the application process.

As you can see this is the first Village Magazine to be produced in full colour and will be for a trial period of three issues to see if the extra expense is justified. New contributors to the magazine are being sought to broaden its interest to the parishioners and it is hoped that the introduction of colour will attract new advertisers. Finally everyone is welcome to the Annual Parish Meeting to hear the work of the Parish Council over the last year, but more importantly give your views on future initiatives.

HAMBLE LADIES GROUP

A couple of meetings to report on in this article. The first one being the meeting we had in February when Caroline Haynes, from Bursledon Brickworks Museum, came along to tell us the history of the museum.

The Brickworks was turned into a museum in 2012 after a National Lottery Award and opened 3 days a week for self guided tours in 2014.

The history of brickmaking in Southampton goes back as far as 1823 when Edward Hooper moved to this area from Middlesex. He leased Baltic Wharf on the Itchen River then in 1860 expanded and leased America Wharf in the docks. Through his marriage in 1860 his was joined in the business by his wife's family who were called Ashby and the business was known as Hooper and Ashby. The business continued in its success and after Edward Hooper died in 1864 it continued to be run by the Ashby family and they moved to Chandlers Ford. Then they moved to the site in Bursledon in 1890 which proved to be an ideal place for brickmaking because of the clay reserve along the Hamble Estuary, the Railway Link between Southampton and Portsmouth and Hamble River to ship the bricks up to the Southampton Docks. They started making bricks at Bursledon in 1896 and by 1935 they were making 20 million bricks and putting all other brickmakers out of business.

Brickmaking was extremely hard work but the men in the area were keen to work there because it was good pay and steady work. The introduction of the brickmaking machines helped with making the work easier and they were able to produce a lot more bricks.

Caroline showed us some very interesting slides of the brickworks showing the way the men worked and the conditions they worked in and the machines they used, some of which are still on the site to see. She told us that the brickworks closed down in 1974 mainly because of the H&S rules and to conform with all the regulations it was too costly to put right. It was left as it was for years until in 1980 it was discovered by a Hampshire County Council Surveyor who was doing a survey of all the listed buildings along the M27 and came across the derelict brickwork site. He realised there was something special about the place and it was granted Industrial Heritage status and since then a lot of hard work has taken place to get it to how it is now.

Caroline said that they are hoping to have more visitors this year. Apart from being open 3 days a week there are going to be different events throughout the year which will include a Steam Punk Fair - sounds fun, a beer festival - even more fun and she also said that they would welcome anyone who would like to join them as volunteers.

A very interesting talk especially as it is very local to us and not far to go for a day out.

Our talk in March saw the return of Zoe Parkin who came along to tell us about her volunteer work in the townships of South Africa. Whilst visiting her daughter in South Africa over 10 years ago she volunteered to help out with caring for the people living in terrible conditions in the township near the village of Sedgefield. She described to us the awful living conditions they had with no electricity, no sanitation, no mains water and just rows and rows of tin shacks which were gradually getting added to from year to year.

Zoe volunteered to help with pre-school children and continued to do this until quite recently. She explained that these children literally had nothing but with the volunteering work going on their lives have begun to improve immensely. It is not only the children that are helped but also the elderly who are looked after with visits from health workers, clinics they can attend to and also they have small clubs they can join for social meetings. She explained that it was a terrible struggle at most times but when she showed us slides of the children and adults you could see that they all looked very happy and progress was being made.

The children are given their school uniforms by the charities but everything else has to be bought, for example pencils, paper, school books. The children are helped all the way through there school life and many now achieve good qualifications.

The government is gradually improving living accommodation by building new homes and getting rid of the shacks but the people live on very little money and employment is few and far between for them. Most of them are employed as gardeners or domestic helps for the white people but Zoe said that they are surprisingly happy people and find a lot of contentment with their lives.

Zoe told us how much she loved her work in South Africa and told us about the other amazing people who are out there also doing good work to help the people living there. A very interesting talk to a full house again and also some new faces who came along to join us.

Our next meeting is on 11th April starting at 7.30pm in the Priory Centre when we have Paul Ackland coming along to chat to us about Hamble Lifeboat - a great interest to all of us I think. Why not join us, everyone welcome.



Hamble Local History Society Netley Chapel and Hospital's History

£2.68 million project, what is happening?



At the Society's next meeting Paul Del-A-More, who lived in Hamble as a child, will be talking about Netley Hospital Chapel at the Royal Victoria Country Park.

Netley Hospital was once the world's largest hospital and today its chapel is all that remains. Paul will give details of the Chapel and its associated Hospital's history, which had links with Florence Nightingale and was a personal project of Queen Victoria who laid its foundation stone.

The Chapel is undergoing a restoration and conservation project funded through a Heritage Lottery Fund grant and Hampshire County Council funding worth a total of £2.68 million. Paul is responsible for overseeing this project and will also be explaining what is involved.

BERYL ROGERSON MEMORIAL LUNCHES 10 YEARS ON!

If you are 70 or more do think about coming along to our next lunch at Hamble Memorial Hall which will be around Halloween time, you can bring your spouse even if they are younger and if you need assistance bring your carer. The Hall is fully accessible.

In October we shall celebrate 10 years of the lunches that are named after the lady who lived at Riverside and who bequeathed her house to the Abbeyfield Society for conversion into accommodation for elderly people of the parish. Local people supported the project by raising money but after a while it was abandoned, the property was sold and the money put towards other Abbeyfield developments outside of the Parish. The Parish Council at the time recovered funds that had been raised by Parishioners and it was paid to a local charity, namely the Memorial Hall to be used for the benefit of the elderly of the Parish. A small committee was formed and at a meeting in August 2007 it was decided that the funds which amounted to just over £4500 should be used to lay on lunches for the over 70s in the Memorial Hall. The aim would be to get people together, especially those who lived alone or found it difficult to get around. The community bus would provide transport where needed. A caterer, John Davis who was known locally, would be hired and there would be wine and some entertainment. It would not be free, that way the fund would last longer, but the charge would be modest and when the money ran out then it would all finish.

The first lunch was on 25 October 2007 with a theme of Halloween and proved to be a success so we held another the following February with a Valentine's theme. And so we carried on with 60 - 70 people coming twice a year. We have had lots of different entertainments, piano playing, guitar, solo and group singers, our local magician, lan Underdown showing us pictures of old Hamble and a few quizzes. There is always a raffle and local businesses have been very generous in donating prizes. The original money has long since been spent but we have been generously supported by local companies and associations. From the start we have had donations from BP Hamble terminal and more recently regular support from Coopervision and Esso. When, a few years ago, it looked as though funds were running out, Hamble Parish Council stepped in with a grant.

It seems that everyone is keen to keep the luncheons going, including the committee of local people who organise the events. It is a friendly and informal affair where people can meet up with friends and neighbours and enjoy the food and a chat. Over the years many guests have come along and sometimes we show slides of past lunches with poignant reminders of dear friends who are no longer with us. Look out for the date and application form in the September and October editions of the Hamble Parish Magazine. We look forward to seeing you.

HAMBLE CONSERVATION VOLUNTEERS

The recent annual maintenance day revealed that the local birds take full advantage of the protection offered by our bird boxes. We now have 37 boxes located across the Common with a variety of entrance sizes to suit different birds. All but a handful were used and it would be reasonable to assume that the song bird population is larger as a result.

With birds nesting scrub clearance is at an end until the autumn and our attention turns to maintaining the network of paths criss-crossing the Common. Although it was a relatively storm free winter the paths still suffered and need attention, otherwise the enjoyment of the Common would be confined to those with high mobility.

Path maintenance cannot be carried out by mechanical plant as it would be too disruptive so please help if you can spare the time. Some of the work is arduous but there are roles for a wide range of agility.

Monday beach cleans are on 3rd and 17th April.

The next conservation task is:



Hamble Club Football Club (nickname 'The Monks') is having its most successful season in its history and at the time of writing is top of the Sydenhams Wessex Division One. which is level 10 of the English Football League system.

This season it opened its new facilities at the Hamble Community Facilities, off Hamble Lane, after signing a new lease with the Parish Council. Hamble Club FC won the Hampshire Premier League in the 2014/15, but did not have the require facilities to be promoted. Fortunately in 2014 it gain a new financial backer and sponsor, who provided funds to upgrade its facilities including a sports pavilion with changing room & club area, new floodlighting, managers boxes and spectators stand, that enabled it to play in a higher league.

The club was formed by John Foster and 3 local lads as a youth team in 1969 and has made a steady progression through the leagues over the past years, reaching the Hampshire League in 1993. It joined the Wessex League in 2004 in Division 3 and then became founder members of the Hampshire Premier league in 2007.

Its first five seasons in the Hampshire Premier League were a struggle for the club and led to its withdrawal in 2012. The club rejoined at the start of the next season in Division 1 and ended as runners up to gain promotion back into the Premier Division. As mention previously 2014-2015 saw the club take the Premier League title.

The front cover shows Hamble Club FC against local rivals AFC Stoneham and they won a very interesting game 1-0, with the opponents having 3 players sent off.

75 YEARS AGO – Visit of Transport Manager & Bus Manager such application must come only from the County Council, who were the major authority. The Parish Council approaches must be through the medium of the County Council. Both Mr Connoly & Mr White convinced me that they had no love of Parish Councils, and they looked upon them as nuisances.

APRIL 1942

75 YEARS AGO – Resident Doctor raised the question of the need of a resident Doctor in the Parish all agreed that the need could not be disputed, but the war time problems make such a request difficult at the present time. APRIL 1942

50 YEARS AGO – Appeal by R.A.F. Yacht Club Ltd. Against refusal of planning permission for the construction of an access road and footpaths, the erection of 36 flats and garages and the erection of a new yacht club house (to replace that existing) on land at Riverside House The Inspector recommended that the appeal be dismissed.
