Upcoming elections in May

With District Council and Parish Council elections coming in May, your monthly reminder to check that you have registered for your vote.

Your District Councillors are your voice within West Oxfordshire. They are elected to represent your interests regardless of if you have voted for them. There are two District Councillors for our area and both would be more than happy to take your questions about their role in our community.

Your Parish Councillors are you're your point of contact for any local interests and represent you from a local level. Due to low numbers of candidates, there has not been an election for over fifteen years. If you are interested in standing as Parish Councillor, you can contact any of your current Councillors or the District Council.

Changes with DIY waste at your recycling centre

Following a Government change to legislation, small amounts of personal non-household DIY will be accepted free of charge across all OCC sites from 31 December 2023.

From 2 January, you must book in advance for your free visit using the new booking system, bringing proof of your booking to the site. Failure to do so may mean you are charged the full advertised costs. (You only need to use the booking system for your free allowance visits).

NHS Health checks for the over 40s

You may feel fine, but as we get older our chance of developing specific health conditions increases. The aim of the NHS Health Check is to tell you if you are at higher risk of developing certain health problems such as heart disease, kidney disease, type 2 diabetes, stroke, or dementia.

Health checks are about prevention rather than treatment. Your NHS Health Check can detect potential health problems before they do real damage.

Having a free NHS Health Check in the community with Health Checks Oxfordshire or at your GP practice can help you stay healthy.

Changes to our roads.

You may remember we sent around a survey asking what you thought about making the villages 20mph areas. The results came back that the majority were in favour so we put forward a plan to have a 20mph area installed. The plan was accepted (you can see full the details online at

We are hopeful that this will be even more of a deterrent for speeding drivers through our village and make the roads safer.

THE EYNSHAM LINK Giving lifts to and from Eynsham

The Eynsham Link has been in existence for over 6 years. It was set up in response to the withdrawal of the Route 18 bus service by the County Council – largely because patronage was low and the subsidy the service required was very high.

But without the bus service villagers who don't own cars, and villagers who temporarily do not have access to a car, find it difficult to get to Eynsham and the main centres of Witney and Oxford. For many the bus services from Eynsham to Oxford, Witney, etc are good so the prime need is to get to and from Eynsham

The First and Last bus service, which started in 2022, was welcome and has part filled the gap but it only runs to Eynsham 5 times a day Monday to Friday so there are many other times when villagers need a lift. The Link works through a WhatsApp group so anyone needing a lift puts a message on the App giving the rough time they need a lift and this alerts all those in the group who have cars. They can respond if they happen to be going to/from Eynsham around that time and they then communicate via the App with the person requesting the lift as to the exact time and pick up point.

For this to work consistently there needs in our estimation to have a minimum of 100 villagers in the scheme/on the App. We need more villagers who own cars therefore to volunteer to give the occasional lift- and very importantly anyone who doesn't own a car to join the scheme.

So if you are willing to offer a lift from time to time please join the Link. And if you regularly or occasionally need a lift please join the Link. Apart from having a smart phone the only requirement is to contact John Brown at jbrown1uk@yahoo.com and he will add you to the group.



VOLUNTEERS NEEDED STANDING WITH GIANTS NORMANDY 80

Dan and his team desperately need volunteers to finish this impactful installation to commemorate the 80th anniversary of the Normandy Landings this summer. The memorial will be shipped over to France early April, and set up, before opening to the public for the summer. It will be part of high profile events and coverage planned to mark this important anniversary and is made up of 1,475 silhouette figures, one for each life lost under British Command on D-Day, 6th June 1944.
