Spire added to Harby Mill

Those of you who heard the helicopter the other day will probably not have realised why it was here. The spire was added to the Harby Mill, by the helicopter using specialist laser GPS navigation aids to accurately place it following a grant from the Water and Windmill Conservation Society which under special provisions granted under a little known Industrial Operations Building Act of 1843 Section 3 (a) allows for mills to be enhanced to conserve their strategic importance to industry and maintain the fabric of the structure.

On 25 February the group returned after the extended Christmas break.

Richard Croft presented us with yet another excellent illustrated talk, this time on “Curious Lincoln”. His slide show went in chronological order, starting with the Romans, showing us parts of Lincoln that have changed and that are also still there. Many historical aspects that are still with us are missed or not recognised as what they once were so this was very educational as well as entertaining. Richard is now working on “Curious Lincolnshire” to present to us next year.

Our next meeting on 25 March is “Meet the Ancestors”. This will give members the opportunity to share interesting stories about a past relative or bring along items that belonged to them to show off.

On 29 April we are going on a Lincoln Ghost Walk. This private guided tour costs £5 a head or £3 for under 12s. Meet in the village hall car park at 7pm so we can share lifts. I would be grateful if you could call me if you'd like to go as I need to compile a list of names.

WOW! Thanks to everyone who came to our Big Breakfast on 26 January. We had lots of fun and thank you for the food and entertainment. For those who didn't make it, the Big Breakfast consisted of – sausages, bacon, eggs, tomatoes, mushrooms, beans, toast, bread & butter, marmalade, peanut butter, chocolate spread, tea, coffee and fruit juice and marmalade loaf cakes – has it made your mouth water yet? The entertainment was Derek, Pete and John who are three talented, easy going folk musicians – I think a bit of dancing went on as well!!! It would not have worked so smoothly without the volunteers giving up a Sunday morning with their family, so a big thank you to them as well.

The eggs were donated by Noble Foods, the Co-op at Collingham supported us with a donation of food and the One Stop shop, also in Collingham, were so very kind with their sponsorship. Without their help we could not have been able to charge so little for each Big Breakfast. We ended up putting £216.38 in the Harby LIVES bank account.

The Harby LIVES group want to thank all the volunteers and those of you who attended the Big Breakfast. The money raised goes a long way to supporting us, although we, the responders, are all volunteers, we still have to raise funds to support our group. The kit we have costs a lot, especially the rental on the O2 bottles which we carry in our kit. All the volunteers have their uniforms provided by LIVES HQ but these have to be paid for. The courses we attend also incur a cost which at present is funded by LIVES HQ so any funding we get goes a long way to ensuring our training is kept up to date. At present we have one Level 2 responder, Harold, with Paul and Mervyn qualified as Level 1s. By the time this Newsletter reaches you, both Paul and Mervyn will have attended the Level 2 course and hopefully attained passes, giving Harby LIVES group, three qualified Level 2 responders. Once again, thank you to all – our community can only go from strength to strength with your support.

At our recent Village Hall meeting we clarified the use of crockery and cutlery in the hall as there has been some confusion. Any crockery and cutlery found in the kitchen (most of it in large plastic boxes) can be used by hirers as part of their normal bookings. However, the hall also owns enough white crockery and cutlery for a 120 place setting, which is available for an additional cost. The use of this has to be booked at the same time as the hall; although the hire charge for Village organisations is waived. (This crockery is stored in cupboards in the bar area and cutlery is locked away.)





Harby Parish Council

Below is a summary of the latest minutes. For full minutes please see the notice board or go to www.newark-sherwooddc.gov.uk/harby.

January Meeting

- A £250 contribution was made to Harby First Responders (LIVES) at the end of 2013.
- Wigsley have secured funding for a new village notice board.
- Overgrown trees on Millfield Close, the Low Street/Wigsley Road junction, and Darbyshire Close have been added to the District Council's maintenance list.
- We will enter the Best Kept Village Competition again this year.
- Broadband upgrade - fibre cables are being installed in the village and the Saxilby telephone exchange is now enabled for fibre.

March Annual Parish Meeting

- The Chairman's Annual Report noted that despite an annual precept (income) of around £3000, over £42,000 has been secured for the village. This has been invested in new play equipment, a community defibrillator, funding for local organisations including the village hall, playing field, bowls club, history group and Harby tea time. A Welcome Pack has been developed and is handed out to residents new to the village and available online, and the Greening Campaign and Community Led Plan continue to be developed.
- The Village Hall Annual Report noted they had an income of around £7300 and an expenditure of around £6300 with the main income being from the dog training and Post Office. Major costs were the electricity and insurance.

March Meeting (draft)

- One interactive speed sign is now operational on Wigsley Road. Station Road still pending electrical connection.
- The new picnic area, benches and toddler play equipment, including a climbing frame with slide, springer, and play trail is due to be installed at the end of April.
- The draft survey is being created for the Community Led Plan for Harby, Thorney, and Wigsley.
- The old village website will be updated.
- £50 is to be used to support the Best Kept Village entry.
- A preliminary consultation by Lincolnshire County Council to restrict HGVs on Doddington Road and Broadholme was supported.

Planning Applications Update

Application for extension to provide private leisure facilities including a gym and swimming pool at 9 Wigsley Road. Parish Council Support. [Pending NSDC decision.](#)

Erection of a free range poultry unit, 4 No. Feed Silos and formation of access at field adjacent Gibbet Wood, Brown Wood Lane, Thorney. Parish Council Support. [Pending NSDC decision.](#)

Erection of a single 500kW wind turbine with a hub height of 50 metres, a rotor diameter of 54 metres and a height to tip of 77.3m at Plot Farm, Thorney. Parish Council Oppose. [Pending NSDC decision.](#)

Application to convert and extend garage to form an annexe to be used solely in connection with Millwell House, Church Road. [Approved by NSDC.](#)

Erection of live / work unit on land at Enfield Farm, Station Road. [Refused by NSDC.](#)

Next planned meeting is May 29 in the Village Hall


