Harby Parish Council Update

Clerk

As we now enter a new financial year for the Council, you will have been presented with your Council Tax bill from Newark and Sherwood District Council and may be wondering why the Parish Council precept has increased in the way that it has. In previous years the Council have tried to keep the precept as low as possible and have increased it little, however with the implementation of the national living wage and automatic enrolment for pensions (amongst other legislation changes) the precept has not been keeping up with the increased demands placed on it. The Parish Council therefore took the very difficult decision this year to increase the precept by 15%, which equates to £3.87 increase per Band D property (32p per month/7p per week). It is hoped that you will understand why this decision has had to be made so that the Parish Council can continue with the grass cutting and other projects that are carried out each year on your behalf.

The Parish Council has a small plot (circa 100m²) which is currently vacant and therefore available immediately to rent. Would you be interested in taking on this plot, to grow your own fruit, veg or flowers? The rent for this plot is £6 per annum. If you may be interested, please contact the Clerk



NEWS FROM QEP – Jeremy Bingham – HATHERSAGE 2018

Queen Eleanor Primary School holds educational standards at the heart of everything it does. We know that to attain high standards children need exciting and stimulating opportunities outside of the classroom. With this in mind therefore every two years we organise a 2 night residential to St Michael's Field Study Centre in Hathersage (a Council run facility). This year we took a mixture of Y3. 4 and 5 pupils along with pupils from North Clifton.

We had a great time. On arrival the students were kitted out with waterproofs, walking boots etc and half of the group went orienteering while the other half made boats/rafts from 5 natural materials (mainly twigs, grass and bark) they had collected and had a race to see which held a bath toy duck most successfully down a small stretch of stream.

The following day (after a group of children had helped clear away the cooked breakfast, and switched on the dishwasher) we had a train ride to Padley, a tour of the chapel and a walk through the old millstone mine to Bole wood where we made shelters, again from natural materials. It was great fun testing them, especially for water proofness!

That evening the staff were given a break from cooking as we had a meal at the 'Poolside Café'. Hathersage has a lovely open air swimming pool, mostly closed over winter, but the café remains open and they cater for us tremendously. The children enjoyed the bingo and the prizes they provided after they had eaten.

We returned on the Friday following a visit to Treak Cliff Cavern where we looked at the local history and geology. All in all a great visit and one that will, we hope, remain in memories for a long time!




In January, guest speaker Graeme Wade returned to talk to us about the Crinan Canal in Scotland. The waterway is about 9 miles long and runs between Crinan and Ardrishaig. We “cruised” the length of the canal, through his photos, passing puffer boats and stopping at places of interest such as the ancient standing stones along the way. Little snippets that we learnt included that there were no overhead bridges along the canal, meaning relief for sailing vessels who didn’t have to lower their masts. We heard how Paul McCartney had lived nearby and based the songs “Mull of Kintyre” and “the Long and Winding Road” on this area. We also learnt that the Mull of Kintyre once belonged to Denmark. THE ALLOTMENTEERS - Carol Dallamore

Snow. What a beautiful sight it is to wake to a blanket of fresh white snow. It tells us that the year is turning; it makes people who do not normally take to fresh air wrap up and go out to crunch through the crisp whiteness, and - it gives the gardener a few days off!

For the Allotmenteer there are quite a few benefits of a decent blanketing of snow. Firstly it acts as an insulator. The snow, containing pockets of air, acts like a duvet to prevent the highs and lows of temperature change damaging evergreen leaves and new shoots. Our Winter crops fair better and many of the insects that would be nibbling the edges of the greens are sent underground! Frost damage is easily seen in 'burnt' edges of leaves and some go translucent. Bulbs underground benefit from the warmth and thus seem to magically appear following the thaw.

As the snowflake forms it traps nitrogen and sulphur from the atmosphere, as it melts this is released into the soil. Thus snow is often referred to the poor man's fertilizer. Sulphur is nature's antiseptic and can control some of the soil bacteria. Gathering extra snow and adding it to your plot is helpful but not from the roadside that has been salted unless you are growing seaweed or Marron grass!!

Unlike heavy rain, that barely settles on the surface of soil before running off quickly taking nutrient with it, snow melts slowly and sinks into the ground gently increasing the water level. Plants, surprisingly, can suffer from drought in Winter and mulching with snow is thus very beneficial.

The gradual freezing and thawing processes of snow helps to break down heavier soils, producing the finer loamy texture that many plants roots prefer. Vegetables are mainly annuals so have one season to prove their worth. Many of the fields around us are heavy clay, in late Autumn it can be seen that the Farmer ploughs this over. Through the Winter Frosts, all being well, the great clumps are fractured and broken down ready for Spring tilling and seeding. Who would have thought, Winter Weather a labour saving device?

Heavy snow can damage fruit trees and hedges; flat top hedges are best avoided aiming for the rounded or sloped edge. Giving them a shake can help the small fruit trees; larger trees stand-alone but be careful of rotten branches that may suddenly snap.

Snow frees the child in us all for a short time every year!!




