CHAIR'S UPDATE

When can I?

Well as we know the end of lockdown restrictions has been postponed to 19 July because of the Delta ((Indian) variant. In the meantime, the vaccination programme has been ramped up across the UK and now all adults over 18 are eligible and are encouraged to book an appointment. As of 21 June, 82% of adults have had the first dose and 60% the second jab. When you are fully vaccinated Pfizer gives 96% protection and AstraZeneca 92% against hospitalization and death. If you are unlucky enough to be the small minority to get Covid after vaccination, it's just mild, and often without symptoms. So, if for whatever reason you haven't had both your jabs, do please get yourself protected if you can. It's really worth it.

Vandals strike again!

Really sad to report that the children's play area at Stonehill has suffered damage from vandals again. The wet pour surface under some of the equipment has been ripped up, meaning the play area has had to be closed until repairs are complete. This is likely to be a very expensive exercise as some of the equipment itself will need to be taken out and reinstalled. If anyone saw this happening or can give any information you can contact the Parish Clerk in confidence.

Bus Shelter Project

For the past couple of months councillors have been discussing the provision of a new bus shelter in the village. Consultation with the bus company has identified that the most used bus stop is the one in West Street outside the Memorial Hall Grounds and that the best place to put it is by the old red telephone box. We've sourced some quotes for a bottle green metal shelter with a seat and we're now contacting Highways at County Council who own the pavement, as we are legally obliged to ask their permission first. We are also checking whether we have to get approval for its design and colour from District officials as the shelter is in the Conservation Area. It's likely therefore to take a little while to get these permissions but it should be in place before the autumn and the bad weather. The cost of this is coming out of Community Infrastructure Levy money that the West Street new development has provided.

RECYCLE MORE

'Recycle More' from Somerset Waste Partnership is coming to South Somerset at the end of June 2021. You will have received a 'Get ready for Recycle More' leaflet which included a 'what goes where?' guide to recycling with the new service and an individual collection day calendar for recycling and rubbish collections for the coming year.

What is changing?

The key changes are:

- More materials will be collected weekly from the kerbside in addition to the current recyclable items:
 - plastic pots, tubs and trays food and drink cartons (Tetra Pak etc) small electrical items such as kettles or toasters small household batteries
- Non-recyclable waste will be collected every three weeks instead of two.
- Collection days will change for roughly a third of households.
- A new recycling container a Bright Blue Bag will be delivered to all homes.

When will things change?

These changes will be introduced across South Somerset over the course of around two weeks (depending on where you live) starting on Monday, 28th June. Stickers will also be stuck on boxes to show what items need to go where.

What won't change?

- Garden waste and clinical waste collections and their collection days will stay the same.
- Assisted collections (when crews help people with their recycling and rubbish) will continue on the new collection days.

Recycle More will work best if everyone makes full use of their weekly recycling collections. Please ensure you have all the containers you need. Everyone can have green and black recycling boxes and food waste bins. You can order new or replacement boxes or bins **FREE** using the My Waste Services menu at www.somersetwaste.gov.uk.
