Planning Applications

The following planning applications were considered and approved subject to any comments detailed below:

Members considered that the style of extension is not in keeping with neighbouring properties and the local street scene. District Council Planning Committee members are urged to visit to fully assess the visual impact that such an extension would have on the area.

0470 Correspondence/Information

The following items of correspondence/information have been received and were noted:

- a) Members had been invited to comment on further correspondence from the applicant, previously circulated, relating to the two applications for the Highfields School that are going through the appeal process. Essentially the applicant has increased the offer of financial contribution to the District Council for affordable housing, although any such housing would not be built on that site. Members considered that this revised offer does not change their long standing objections to either application. The Committee also considered that a development of this size should include affordable housing within the site itself rather than providing a commuted sum for development elsewhere.
- b) Notification that an appeal has been lodged against the District Council refusal to convert part of the north western wing to a dwelling at the former Working Men's Club on Main Street.
