FOODBANK DONATIONS

LOWER HALSTOW PRIMARY SCHOOL

We didn't let this dampen our spirits though, as we kept as



many events running as we could, adapting to virtual events where needed.

The school council decided that we would raise money for Children in Need by coming to school wearing our pyjamas again. This is clearly a popular choice! After school, Year 5 and 6 held a cake sale to raise further funds, everyone had a great day.

Our PTA ran a very successful Christmas shopping evening with stalls offering everything from cakes to candles and personalised plates. It was very well attended with a steady stream all evening and it was lovely to see people from the village pop in as well. They have already been asked to run one next year!

Year 5 performed their class assembly to parents and entertained us with facts and songs about the Ancient Greeks. This was a great way to celebrate their learning even with all the parents wearing masks and social distancing in line with the new national guidance.

To help cheer up patients in Medway hospital over Christmas, each class created artwork for displaying in the wards. We hope the patients love fake snow and glitter and that the snowflakes, Christmas characters and scenes spread a little festive cheer. The hospital has shared photos with us of the artwork in place and it does look very cheerful! At the start of December we all created Christingles ready for a special Christingle service. This ended up being a virtual service and Miss Crowe made a gigantic Christingle. We closed all the blinds in the classrooms and created a lovely atmosphere for lighting the Christingle candles. Families also donated loose change for the Children's Society who provided the candles for us.

We couldn't have a Grotto, but Father Christmas and his elf made a surprise visit to the school and visited every classroom with a present for each child. There was such excitement as the children heard the jingle of his bells during our Celebration Assembly.

The term finished with Reception and Year 2 Nativity performances to parents, it was so lovely to come together again to enjoy this. Everyone wrapped up warm as we had the doors open! We also enjoyed Christmas dinner and parties in each class which really got us in the mood for Christmas.
